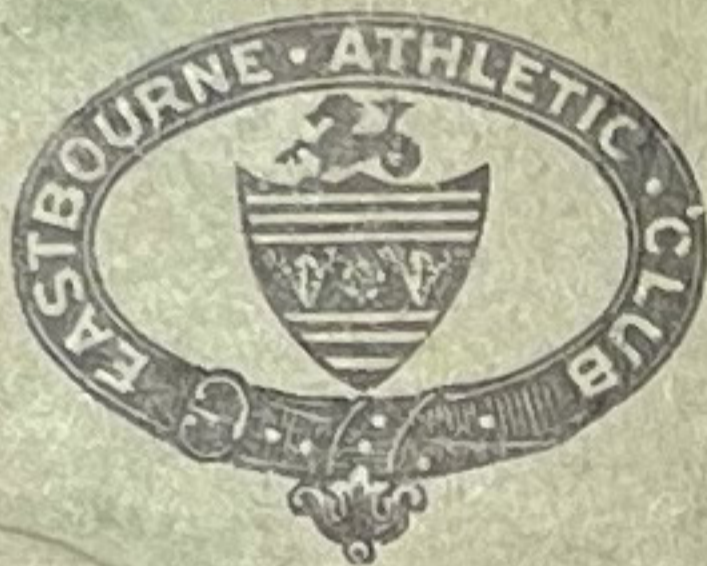

CONDITIONS.



RUNNING, WALKING AND CYCLING.

- All Races will be started as near as possible to the time stated in the Programme, but the Committee do not bind themselves to adhere strictly to such times, and reserve the right to make any alteration in the Programme that may be deemed necessary.
- Competitors must report themselves to the Competitor's Stewards five minutes before the time named on the Programme for the start.
- A Bell will ring for each event. All Competitors must be on their marks when the Bell rings, after their names have been called over in the Dressing Room.
- All Competitors must wear the number by which they are identified in the Programme, which number can be obtained in the Dressing Room. The number must be worn on the front for Running and back for Cycling.
- All questions as to starts shall be at the absolute discretion of the Starter.
- All Protests against a Competitor, or against a Competitor's qualification to compete, shall be made in writing to the Hon. Sec. or Judges before the Prizes are distributed, accompanied by a fee of 5/- which shall be forfeited in case the same shall appear on investigation to have been made on no reasonable ground.
- The Committee reserve the right to postpone the Meeting should it be necessary and no expense will be paid or entry fees refunded.

SCALE OF PENALTIES.

For wins (First Prize) in Open Handicaps during the four days preceding this Meeting.

A.A.A. Scale of Penalties for Flat Handicaps up to and including one mile.

1 yard for distances up to and including	120 yards
2 "	"	over 120 yards up to and including	220	"	220 yards
3 "	"	"	600	"	300 yards
8 "	"	"	1000	"	1000 yards

Winners at distances up to and including 300 yards not to carry penalties in Handicaps over 300 yards. Winners at distances over 600 yards and up to and including 1000 yards not to carry penalties in Handicaps over 1000 yards. The foregoing penalties to be increased by one-half after the second win. Penalties not to be enforced beyond the scratch mark and do not apply to wins on the same day at the same meeting.

Over one mile at the rate of 20 yards per mile. These penalties include wins on the same day.

Competitors must notify to the Judges before the Race is run that they have incurred a penalty, otherwise they will be disqualified and render themselves liable to suspension.

WRESTLING.

An Amateur is one who has never competed for a money prize or monetary consideration or for any declared wager or staked bet; who has never engaged in or taught any athletic exercises of a means of pecuniary gain; and who has never taken part in any competition or unauthorised exhibition with anyone who is not an amateur.

At every open wrestling competition, Competitors will be required to be fully clothed from neck to knees, and to wear trunks above their wrestling tights. Wrestling Competitors must be at the Dressing Room at 2 o'clock and report themselves to the Judge in charge for the match and draw.
