CONDITION

1. All Competitors must be on the ground at 2.15. The order of events may not be strictly adhered to.

2. A bell will ring for each event. All Competitors must be on their marks when the bell rings, after their names have been called over in the dressing room.

3. All Competitors must wear the number by which they are identified in the programme, which number can be obtained in the dressing room. The number must be worn on the back by Cyclists and on the Chest by Runners.

4. All questions as to starts shall be at the absolute discretion of the Starter.

5. All races to be started by the report of a pistol. A start shall only be made at actual report of the pistol; if any Competitor outsteps his mark before the pistol has been fired, the starter will put him back one yard for the 100 yards; two yards up to and including 440 yards; and 5 yards for the miles; the penalties will be doubled for a second offence, disqualification to follow a repetition.

6. Run or ride to the left inside.

7. All protests against a Competitor, or against a Competitors qualification to compete, shall be made in writing to the Hon. Sec. or Judges before the prizes are distributed, accompanied by a fee of 5/-, which shall be forfeited in case the same shall appear on investigation to have been made on no reasonable grounds.

8. The second prize will not be given in any event unless there are three or more Competitors, and no third prize unless five or more compete. The third prize in open events will be withheld if less than six starters.

9. The decision of the Judges to be final.

10. All Competitors must compete in racing costumes.

N.B.—Any Competitor who has won a first prize in open cycle handicap, during the four days preceding the holding of this handicap, must, prior to competing, notify to the Judges all such win or wins, otherwise he will be disqualified and rendered liable to suspension, and shall be subject to the following penalties in races entered:

(a) In races under $\frac{1}{2}$ mile—5 yards.

(b) In $\frac{1}{2}$ mile races—5 yds. for riders receiving up to and including 40 yds. start
10 yds. for riders receiving over 40 and up to and including 100 yards start.

(c) In 1 mile races—10 yds. for riders receiving up to and including 50 yds. start

(d) Over 1 mile at the rate of 20 yards per mile.
