

Minutes of Meeting held at 5, St. Mary's Terrace,  
Hastings, July 9th. 1935.

Present. Mr. G. Jenkins in the Chair, supported by Messrs. Griffin Helliwell Bosting Lelyveld Smith Sutton, the secretary and treasurer.

Minutes.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Correspondence.

A letter was read from the Chamber of Commerce, who asked the Club to alter the date of the dance from Oct. 9th. as they wished to use the lower Ballroom of the Pavilion as a refreshment room at the Tradesman's Ball on the same night. After some discussion it was decided to leave the matter in the secretary's hands.

R.R.C. Minutes. At a meeting of the R.R.C. on July 2nd. it was passed by a majority of 20 votes to 19 that a Permanent Racing Calendar should be instituted, and Scheme A was passed by an overwhelming majority.

August Meeting.

The Secretary of the Schools Athletic Assoc. wrote to say the it was decided that the Schools' event should be a Relay Race for boys under 14 years.

It was decided that as there appeared to be a demand for it, a 1 mile Club scratch race should be included in the programme.

The secretary was asked to get into touch with Chasewater Charlie through 'Cycling' for terms.

CLUB RECORD.

The racing secretary reported that in the K.C.A. Tandem '50' the previous week-end, J. Mackie and W. Griffin broke the existing Club record for the distance with the splendid time of 2 hrs. 6 mins. 0 secs. being second fastest in the event. W. Griffin received on behalf of both riders the hearty congratulations of the committee.

Course Measurement.

In the first report on this subject, issued to the committee it was shown that the '25' mile course on which the very fast times in the Club '25' were ridden, was actually 508 yards short, and the present '30' course 1435 yards long. A lengthy discussion took place as to the necessary action to be taken. It was finally decided that:-

Standard medals claimed on that race should be awarded but that no time should be inscribed on them.

The results should not be recognised in connection with the Club Best-all-Rounder Championship.

A rider's time in this '25' should not be taken into account when claiming a standard in the following year
