

# Fast times in 100-mile cycle event

The close and humid conditions on Sunday helped towards some fast times in the East Sussex Cycling Association's 100-mile event.

From over 30 competitors, Ray Lunn, of East Grinstead C.C., emerged victorious, followed by Pete Crowsley (Southboro Wheelers) who led his team to victory.

Unluckiest rider was John Davis, of Hastings C.C., who crashed and lost at least one placing and possibly the championship. He finished third.

The event also decided the Lewes Wanderers C.C. championship for the Crisp Cup. The winner was Derek Agg (4hr. 55min. 32sec.), who now holds the trophy for the fifth time. Peter Burbery (5hr. 3min. 53sec.) was runner-up while Tony Palmer was forced to retire through cramp at 92 miles.
