**T**HE FOUNDER of the Fellowship of Kent and Sussex Cyclists Freddie March, died in St. Helen's Hospital, Hastings, on 3rd February, 1966 at the age of 77.

So passed from our midst our Founder, a man held in high esteem by cyclists of many clubs and counties.

Freddie was for over 60 years a keen member of the Hastings & St. Leonard's Cycling Club in who's name he won 11 Sussex Cycling Championships during a distinguished racing career divided only by the 1914-18 war in which he served.

In recognition of his service to the Club, Fred occupied the office of President for a time and was awarded Life Membership.

In 1944 he founded the Fellowship of Kent and Sussex Cyclists and donated a silver Rose Bowl which is awarded annually for outstanding services to the sport and pastime of Cycling, or enthusiasm or ability of the highest order displayed in its pursuit.

It may be that our Fellowship, embracing men of the wheel from Kent and Sussex will ever perpetuate the name of Freddie March, embodying as it does his greatest characteristic, the love and well-being of his fellow men.

To this end the President, Past Presidents and Committee of The Fellowship unanimously agreed that as a mark of esteem and to perpetuate the immortal memory of our Founder, a silver shield should be affixed to The Fellowship Trophy and inscribed.
