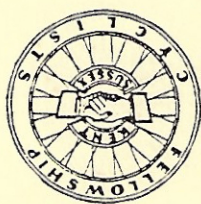
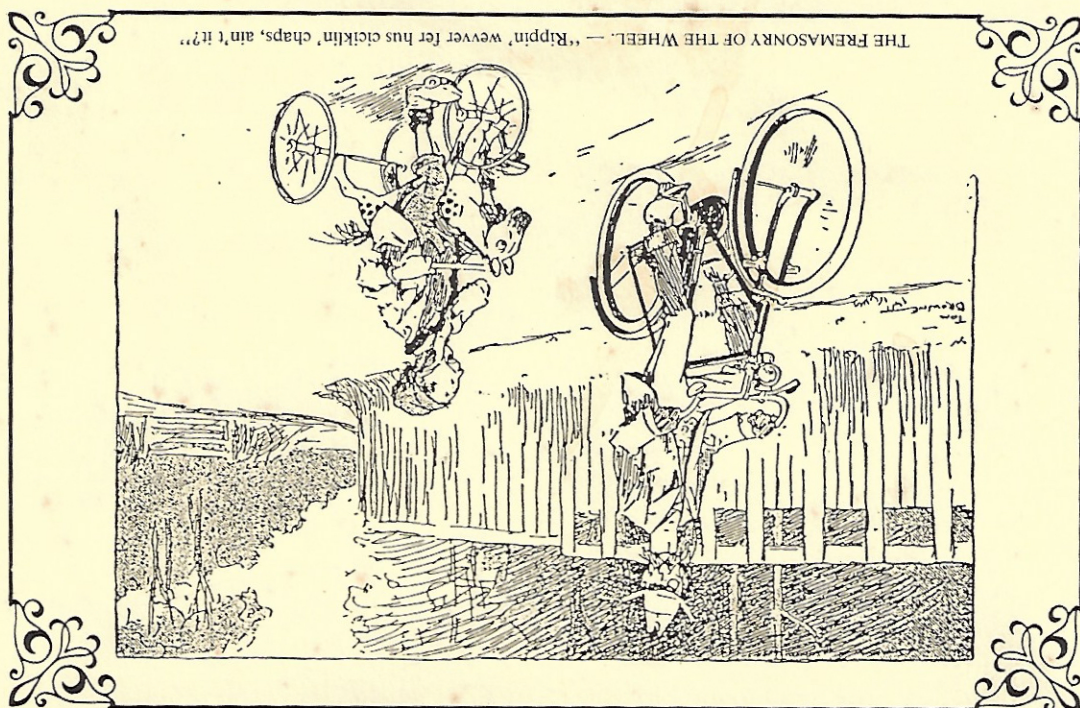

J. CYRIL KERMODE

A legendary name in the cycle-touring world, he joined the CTC in 1947 and within a year of riding with West Kent DA was its Assistant Secretary, becoming DA Secretary a year later, a post which he held for 30 years. During this time he served on every DA sub-Committee as well as many National Committees, (CTC Council, YHA, CPRE, Awards Panel etc). His efforts and achievements were tremendous; he received the Sir Alfred Bird Memorial Prize and on his retirement as DA Secretary, was accorded the rare distinction of CTC honorary life membership. That was about 12 years ago. He immediately became DA President and continued to work hard for the cause. On retirement from full time employment he took on even more duties at national level including cycling road schemes in towns, National Parks, RoSPA and indeed much of his time is spent at meetings in London.

He has recently retired from the DA's Outdoor Events Committee on which he sat for 40 years, during which time he has organised, marshalled and rode in the fastest times. His 30+ years with the DA's Hardriders Section covered long rides to all parts of the country and his solo tours at home and abroad provided material for many popular slide shows up and down the country. Long may he continue to serve the cause of all cyclists.
