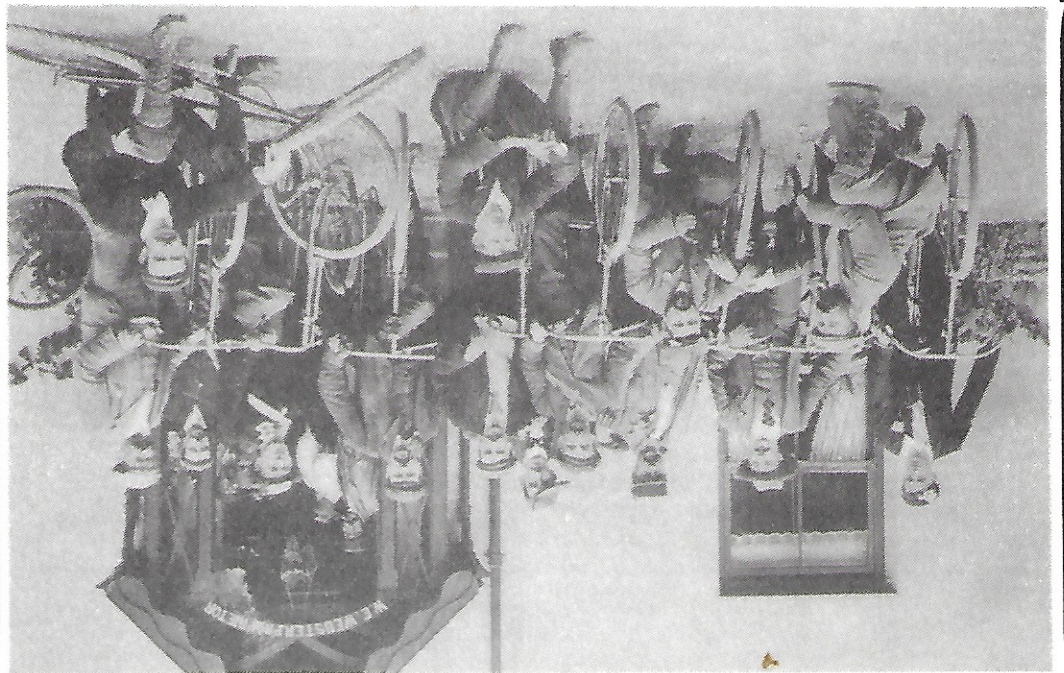

Bill first started with Claude Butler after serving with the Forces in World War Two. His number one job was filing lugs, but with his natural engineering skill he soon became supreme in the fine art of frame building. A one club man all his cycling days, Bill was president of the Sydenham Wheelers and for some years the club 25 T.T. record holder.
