

Won his first race in 1908

Mr. Frederick March, one of the most ardent and successful cyclists Sussex has known, has died in hospital at Hastings, aged 77.

"Freddie," as he was known to generations of racing cyclists and to the thousands who knew his familiar figure on the lanes of the South of England, won his first race at Cambridge Wells in 1908. His remarkable career, interrupted by World War I when he was in the army, included 27 open national championships and a number of international titles.
