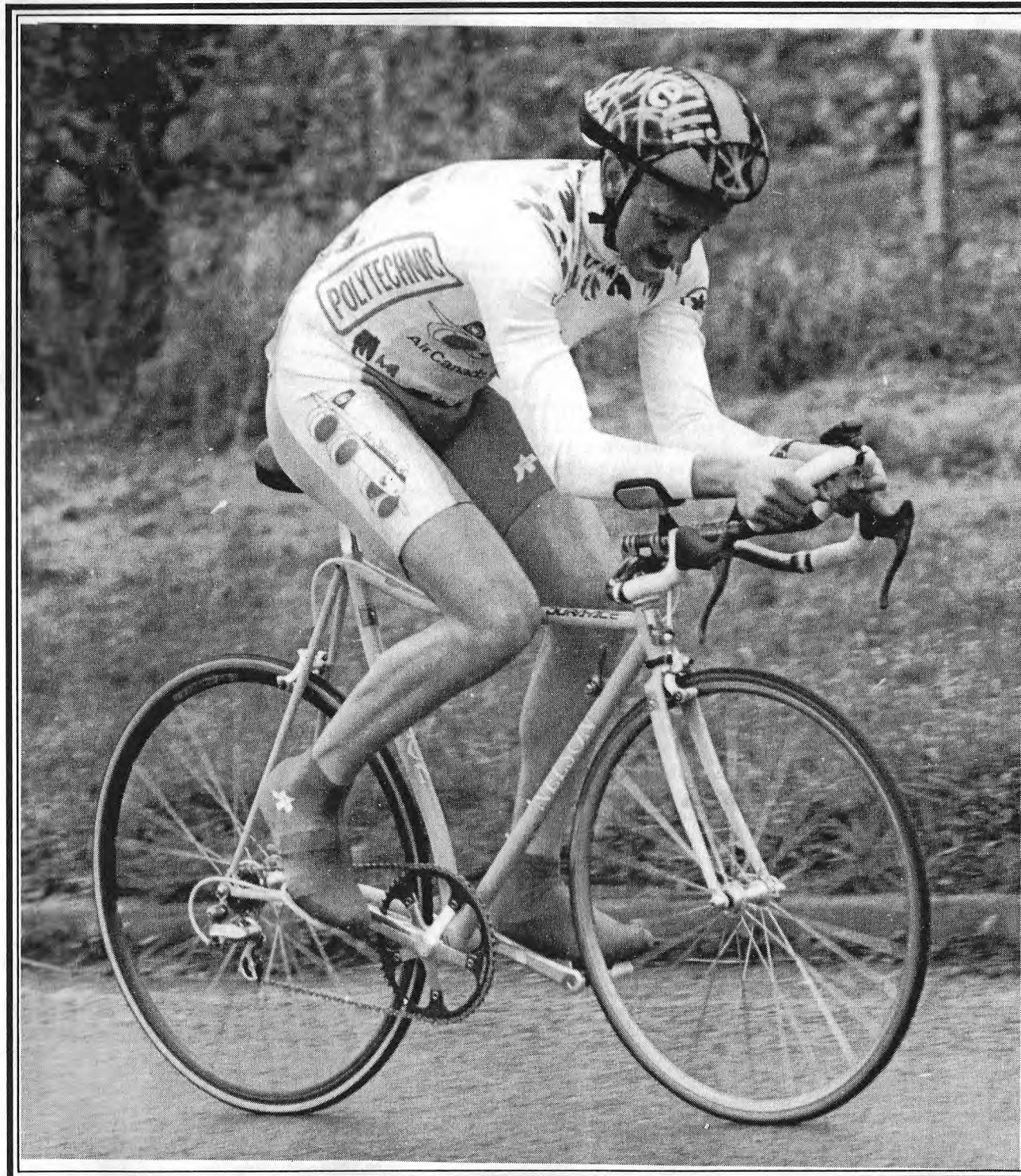

300,000 miles plus

It's been said that when two people get together they are enough to form a club, and the origins of many in the cycling world were formed in this way, but one which owed its origins to such simple beginnings requires, by its very name, a very daunting qualification for membership.

This is the 300,000 Milers Club, an association made up entirely by cyclists who have kept records to show that they have covered that distance a wheel. Not surprisingly, its membership, now fifty strong, is made up almost entirely of veterans: in fact there are few who qualified before reaching their fortieth birthdays, though there is one current British professional with a Continental team who started logging his cycle rides as a small schoolboy and is now over halfway towards qualifying.

Nearly all the members have been time triallists, and many still compete in this form of competition, but unlike a growing number of younger racing cyclists they also ride their cycle for other purposes, ranging from hard riding tours in far flung countries to more utilitarian journeys like commuting to and from work or equally mundane shopping trips.

R.R.A. tricycle and tandem trike record holder, Pat Kenny, (Birmingham St. Christopher's CCC) achieved the highest figures last year, covering 22,266 miles-all on three wheels-and another sixteen also exceeded ten thousand miles, including the present leader, Chris Davies (Southdown Velo. Butler Cycles) who has now completed over 655,000 miles since recording a 6.5 mile ride to the seaside for a swim in 1950.

Not surprisingly, 24 hour rides were commonplace during his thirty years racing with Hampshire RC. and 24's are equally familiar events for second placed Les Lowe (Speedwell BC). Like Davies, he has three "Paris/Brest/Paris" randonnees included in his total which now exceeds 640,000, reached after over 43 years of regular riding, and another who rarely misses a day in the saddle now that he is retired is the secretary, Bernard Blow (South Lancashire RC) who topped 600,000. miles last year.

The club's oldest member, Frank Clark (Wessex RC) should be the next to reach this formidable figure. This 86 year old stalwart started his cycling in 1922 and, like Davies and Lowe, he treated the many 24s he contested each side of the Second World War in much the same way as some of today's youngsters look upon 25s.

An invalid wife now restricts his riding to within a few miles' radius of his Southampton home, but he still relies on his cycle for frequent shopping trips to nearby Romsey and on one of these he pedalled past 598,000 miles just a few weeks ago. The efforts of these four still fall well short of the ultimate record set by Tommy Chambers, a Scot who amassed 799,406 miles by the time of his death, and another deceased member with a massive mileage to his name is Ron Cook of Salisbury who covered 676,575 miles between 1930 and 1978.

Two women have made the grade. They are the secretary's wife, Joyce, whose 8,098 miles last year lifted her score to 414,884, and Sue Swetman (East Surrey RC) another R.R.A. record breaker who passed 375,000 miles while accumulating 15,000 miles last year.

She is now waiting for her husband, Pete, to qualify-something he would have done years ago if he had not waited until his fortieth birthday before starting to record his rides.

He prepares a newsletter containing details of members' rides in February each year, and the club also holds an annual dinner each spring. Knighton, on the border of Wales, has been the venue for this informal function in recent years, and this year's gathering takes place on May 9th.

In the veteran's event the premier awards on standard went to the not-so-young brigade, the two Harrys, Aspden (age 80) and Hill (age 75) took first and second with Joe Stansfield (age 75) in fourth place. The latter setting a new tricycle record for his age group. First place on actual time went, inevitably, to George Nowland.

Put two evenly matched riders together in a team time trial and they will beat any team of one strong man partnered by a weaker one. This was the case in the Plymouth Corinthians 2 UP 25 on the rolling South Devon A38. This event was restricted to teams with both riders members of the same club-no composite teams were accepted.

Adrian Clode rode with Gareth Williams and reached the 13 mile turn in a little over twenty seven minutes aided and abetted by a force 5 South Westerly wind. By this time they were thirty five seconds up on Alan Ryder and Michael Elphick and a further five seconds ahead of Andrew Lyons and Lee Dinham. Two other teams were inside twenty eight minutes. They were Hugh Fairgrieve and John Hollier, inside by eleven seconds, and Nigel Barnes riding with Nick Cleave who were inside by 1 second.

The return twelve miles to the chequered flag was where the going got tough and the tough not going. Clode and Williams extended their lead to win by one minute and three seconds. Barnes and Cleave, knitted well together to leapfrog over two of the teams ahead of them to take the runnerup prize.

There was a good deal of relief in the Village Hall prior to the start when an early morning cloudburst stopped with about fifteen minutes to the off. This left the roads running with chilly water but this soon dried up under the impetus of the brisk breeze.

Brecklands man

Although Cycling Club Breckland's Don Saunders has no aspirations, at the moment, to figure in the top 12 in the British Best All Rounder Competition he is one of a rare breed of true cycling best all rounders.

Pedalling a junior back attachment on his parents Higgins tandem at the tender age of 3years 6 months, Don can really be said to have cycling in his blood.

Starting racing at 17, for many years the longer distances were favourite with Don yet strangely enough some of his fastest times over the shorter events have been achieved quite recently as witness his personal best ride on his trike last June of 57.21. Still holder of the 100 mile National Competition Record on a tricycle of 4.11.02 Don has won, and lost National Records at 10 miles (23.04),30 miles (1.09.34) and 50 miles 1.59.04) and figured in the 10 mile tricycle team Competition record of 1.11.57. in 1984 set up with Richard Bradley and John Stark.

With so many commitments it is hard to believe that we can find time to earn a living-but work he does, in a seven day a week job, as technician in charge of the experimental farm at the School of Development Studies at the University of East Anglia.

Most weekends during the season we will see Don and his long suffering wife Heather travelling back to the farm to feed and water the oxen or sheep after either racing or organising an event. Heather, incidentally, regularly helps with time keeping at both club and open events and organises the club's last open event of the year-a ZUP TTT and tandem 10 mile.

For many riders these activities would be more than enough but since CC Breckland was formed in 1975 Don has produced a club newsletter, been club treasurer for a period, organised the club dinner for many years, is presently joint club captain with Ken Price and membership secretary and also is a course measurer and timekeeper.

Always an innovator he has been responsible for devising and measuring most of the club's open and club event courses including the 12 hour, a revised version of which will be used for the National 12 Hour Championship this year, and setting the clues for the map reading competitions. In the 80's feeling perhaps that he had time on his hand, Don took on the job of East District RTTC Secretary and in 1990 was elected on to the National Committee of the RTTC.

Don has collected his own club's B.A.R. awards in 1976,1977,1978,1989 and 1990 when he won both the senior and veteran B.A.R.'s. 1977 was a vintage year when he won the Norwich Cycling Association, Mid-Anglia Cycling League and the East District RTTC BAR competitions in addition.

There seems little else to which this diverse character can turn his attention but his stable of machines includes a mountain bike on which he has enjoyed off road riding taking part in his club's Thetford Forest extravaganza and the Audax events on North Norfolk roads and tracks organised by club mate Colin Williams.

Altogether a true all rounder.

Jeremy Short (Antelope RT) fresh from winning the Charlotteville 50 the week before, his seventh win this season, was racking his brains as to what went wrong. He had gone well for 10 miles but was 35 seconds down towards the finish.

Ladies winner Pauline Strong (Team Raleigh) not normally at home on the shorter distance these days, went round in a 1.03.46. as though the wind was not there, as if this was a training ride, which it probably was for her.

The last words came from Chris Ball, "I don't like the cold, and I don't want to hit form early season, I want to peak later".

I've survived two redundancy notices (just) and I've grown leeks. I still love Australian rules football, not to mention Irish music and home-made blackcurrant jam.

Bike-less for many years, I got my feet back into pedals after bidding for an early Jack Taylor with both push and pull wires to the rear derailleur, in Northumberland saleroom. Time trials. Ye gods! I've had to make speeches and presentations and I've nudged into rock-climbing on the end of a rope, but this is madness. It's insane. Why do it? Why indeed. Hold on, here's the post. Look at this-the weekly 10-mile sessions start next Wednesday and our slot is 7.20 to 7.40pm. Couldn't it rain? What about work-couldn't I be away? Watch this space.

VTTA Seaside Trips

As April turns into May, the older ones amongst us, more particularly in the North and Midlands, turn our thoughts to those three special events in the RTTC handbook which direct riders towards the east coast resorts of Cleethorpes, Skegness and Scarborough.

These three place-to-place events have been part of the calendar for some years now, and represent a refreshing change, even in the comparatively early part of the season, from the hum-drum diet of 10's, 25's and so on.

First comes the Doncaster-Cleethorpes run, which at 52 miles is the shortest of the three, and run by the North Midlands Group. By the time you read this entries will just have closed, and I trust that new promoter Val Gracie has received a bumper entry. General consensus has it that this is the easiest of the three events, with just two climbs in the Scunthorpe area to ease you out of the saddle. If there's a prevailing wind on May 9th., expect a winning time of around 1-45 to 1-50!

Next for the over-40's comes the longest of them all; Notts and East Midlands Group's Nottingham-Skegness, which at 75 miles is quite a 'toughie'. This year it's on May 16th., and entries close on May 5th. Once again, there's a new promoter here, with Roy Oakes the new man in charge. The route from Nottingham takes in the town centre of Newark.....there's simply no way to avoid it. Even with the earlier start brought in a year or two ago, it can still cause delays, and riders have to be patient.

I remember on the one occasion I rode this one that I got caught in the traffic, had to stop at a set of lights, but was able to support myself by holding on to a convenient car roof, the owner of which was most understanding (if only there were more of them like him!). Then there's the one stiff climb.....up to the little village of Leadenham which stands atop the Lincoln Wolds. Then there are the lumpy bits near the end as well. Am I putting you off? Look, the president of the VTTA Dick Clarke himself has been riding this event for years, and if it's good enough for him, then it's good enough for anyone! So get your entry off, and give it a try. Then, on May 30th., comes the last of the three.....Leeds-Scarborough. It's said to be 100 kilometres., or 62 miles, but in truth is probably nearer to 60. But that's the joy of place-to-place rides.....the precise distance isn't important. This Yorkshire Group event differs from the other two in that it is open to all ages, not just to veterans. Based on the A64 all the way, it can be incredibly fast when the prevailing wind blows.....Leeds super-vet Jack Mackdam holds course record with a 1-59-14, and this year the prize for a new record goes up to £30.....not counting any professionals who might enter, that is!

The sticky part of Leeds-Scarborough is an incline known as Whitwell Hill, on the approaches to the Malton by-pass. It's actually two climbs, with a brief but hair-raising descent in between, and I've seen grown men cry when recounting how they were going ever-so-well until Whitwell Hill loomed up in front of them!

Entries for this one close on May 19th., and there are separate prize lists for the veterans and the rest. I have to confess my interest in this one because I am the promoter, but what harm is there in a little pre-publicity?

Those who have ridden these three events, and I am one, will tell you that they have a special atmosphere all of their own, with both Doncaster-Cleethorpe and Leeds-Scarborough having prize presentations at the event headquarters after the finish. And if you're riding Nottingham-Skegness, and Dick Clarke is well enough to ride again this year, don't forget to say 'Permission to pass, Mr. President?' if you should happen to be going a little bit faster than he is! See you at the seaside!.....
