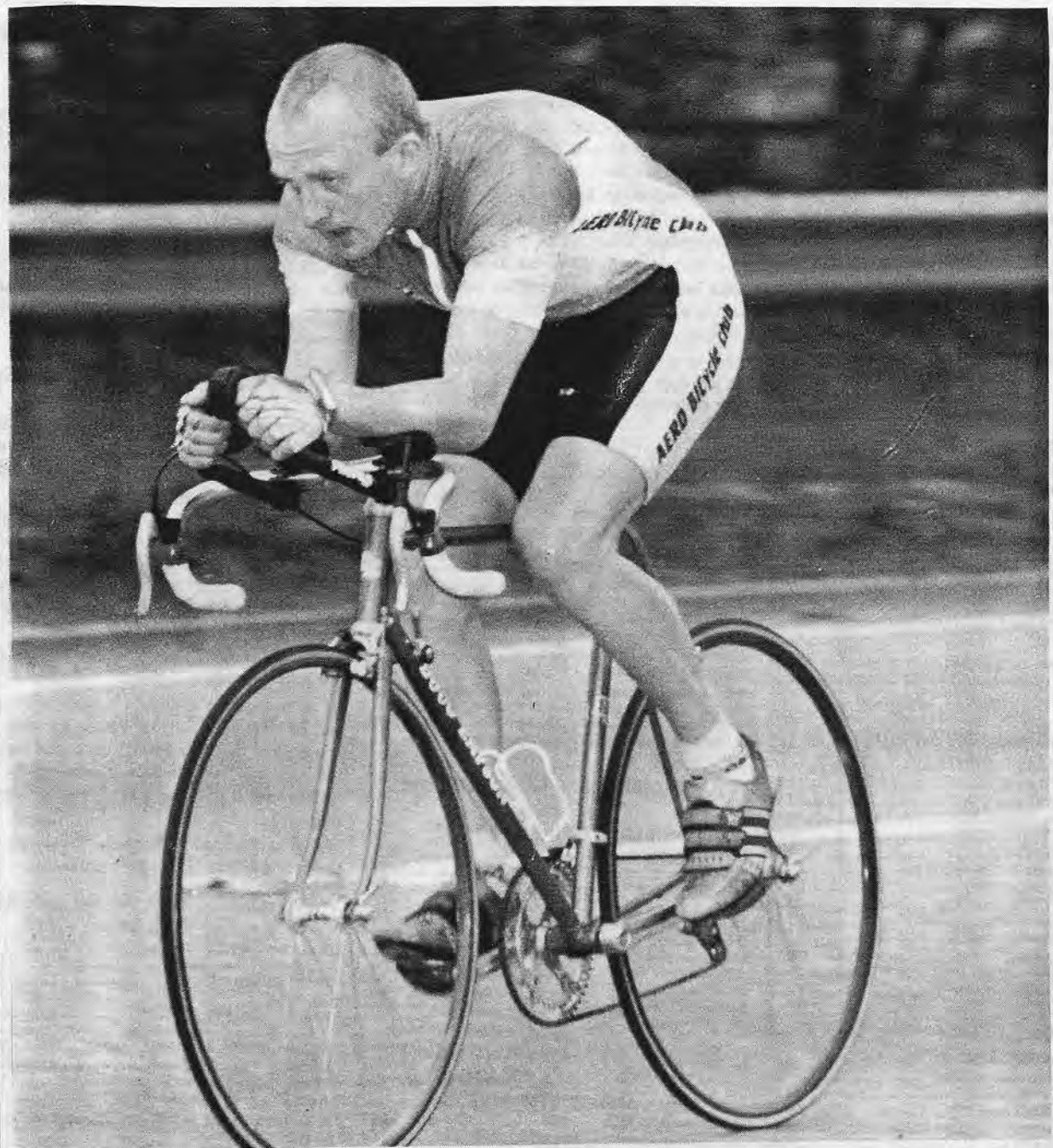

Wind Fails Cammish.

Ian Cammish's attempt on the 201-mile London-York R.R.A. record ended twenty five miles from York last week, when Ian climbed off knowing that he was not capable of doing a 30 mph last '25'.

The current records, held by Bob Addy, was set twenty years ago at 26mph, a superb ride during which Bob was helped by a strong southerly wind. After waiting for months, a southerly was finally promised for las Thursday by Nottingham Weather Office. But it didn't materialise until it was too late!

Starting from central London at 5a.m. Ian had no assistance from the weather whatsoever. Indeed, it was an ideal time trial morning, warm and still. Despite the lack of help, Ian was nevertheless a minute up on the record consistently until he left the A1 at Blyth at 153 miles.

But the effort required to keep him up on the schedule had taken its toll and despite the fact that the wind finally began to get up, albeit from the wrong direction, there was just not enough time left to pull off the record.

"We learn something every time we make an attempt" said Cammish. "That's some record of Addy's, but I'm really keen to give it another try".

Ian had sufficiently recovered his morale and form by the weekend, with two wins and a second place. He is now seriously eyeing the 211-mile London to Bath and Back record and is likely to attack that some time in early June.

Ball beats Short

"Two one it stands at the moment" said Jeremy Short (Antelope RT) after been beaten by his 17 year old team mate Chris Ball. "Two to him" he added significantly.

"This morning when I came over on the boat from the Isle of Wight. I thought he won't leave it at that".

The previous week the older rider had won by ten seconds, this week he was fourteen seconds down, and Jeremy Short had the advantage of having Clive Brooks (Polytechnic CC) as his minute man. On personal bests there was a four minute gap between the two, but when they meet, the difference is less than a minute.

"If I could have caught Clive, I would have done it" reflected Jeremy afterwards. He had got within thirty five seconds of doing it.

A twenty four second improvement comes a lot easier at 17 than 29, and Chris Ball had the look of a man enjoying himself going round. Although he claimed to have found it hard.

The day before he had broken Dave Doust's 10 mile course record by twenty seconds on the U53, at Trowbridge.

Clive Brooks professed to not have been worried about having his rival starting just behind him. He has the attitude of a man getting on with a job that has to be done.

"It is no good looking over your shoulder" he said. He had been able to keep a check on the Antelope rider at the turns.

Krygsman. Flying Dutchman wins at last

After finishing second in a number of events this season Robby Krygsman, Goole Vermuyden at last found the top spot with a ride of 21.28. to win the Malton Wheelers '10' on Saturday.

On this warm afternoon with a stiff breeze blowing from the coast, and across the course, the riders had very little advantage either way. Off number 30 in a field of only 76 competitors, N.Jackson, Roxby Wheelers was the first rider to break twenty two minutes, with a time of 21.35. to give him second fastest. Derek Hatton, Scunthorpe RC was third overall and took the fastest veteran award with 22.43.

5.30 am. The alarm bell crunched to silence, I make my way across the bedroom and peep round the curtains, fingers crossed. Oh no, it's as dry as a whistle. No excuse there. This is no ordinary Wednesday, it's TT Day. The big one. This is it then, Dougie's return (or his retreat).

6.15 am. Shave, pick a tie and I'm off. I know what you're thinking: the coward, he made an appointment in Norfolk, 150 miles away, just so he can miss tonight's pedal pushing. Well you're wrong, so yaa. In fact I've fixed to be there sharp we can wrap up business good and early, in time for me to get home before tea.

4pm. The car's parked and I'm back home. Lawn needs cutting -bugger that. Heaps of pots need washing-bugger that. I need a coffee and a think I'm definitely nervous. Our slot is 7.20-7.40pm. so do I eat now or afterwards? Do I ride to the start or put the bike in the car? If it's the car, should I cycle round home and warm up now or set off early and do it there?

4.30pm. Having decided not to eat, I'm loitering with intent in the kitchen. This bread's fantastic: two slices, each as thick as a thumb, the top one forced aloft by a mix of cold chicken, lettuce, cucumber and a flood of salad cream. A series of hefty thumps reduces it to a manageable width.

Then a yogurt and a few biscuits. Hey Dougie man, was that wise?

6.50pm. I'm at the start, ready and waiting. I'm worried and nervous. There's no-one about. Down the road I go and then back.

7.00pm. Still no time-keeper. Down the road I go and then back. Where is everyone?

7.10pm. Rick and Mario roll up. They're pleased to see me: that's a comfort, me being a novice. Ah, here's Brian with the numbers. Stephen's signed up. Rick follows suit and passes the pen to me. There's no turning back now. Lord, I'm the only one with toe clips-well I am old. No I haven't got to 50p, well not on me. I'm skint. Didn't realise you had to pay.

8.00pm. We're running late, but our first man's away

8.07pm. No 8 gets a push-off. Oh no., he's stuck behind a bus at a junction just twenty yards from the start.

8.08pm. No 9 That's me. I'm off! I feel grand for 200 yards, then it's work and pain. it's push hard and occasionally ease.

The halfway turn. The roundabout's a monster and I'm going the wrong way, but Mario zaps past, garbling something from under his armpit, so I swing right and follow. He's only the second person to come through: at this rate I'll only be four minutes down.

The last climb. It's hard. Cramp looms at every big effort, so I'm struggling to best judge the right pace. Rick glided past some while ago now, so who's coming up next? I decide not to look back.

The finish. Ten miles, long and painful, but now over.

8.55pm. We gather back at the start, Brian arrives only to disappear under an unruly scum of riders anxious to see their time. Rick's both pleased and embarrassed: he took it from Paul by a margin of five seconds so there's the threat of Paul's faster bike appearing next week.

I look at the figures next to my name and my heart sinks: it says 37 minutes something. Mario laughs and points to a second column. Phew-I was looking at my finish time on the clock!
