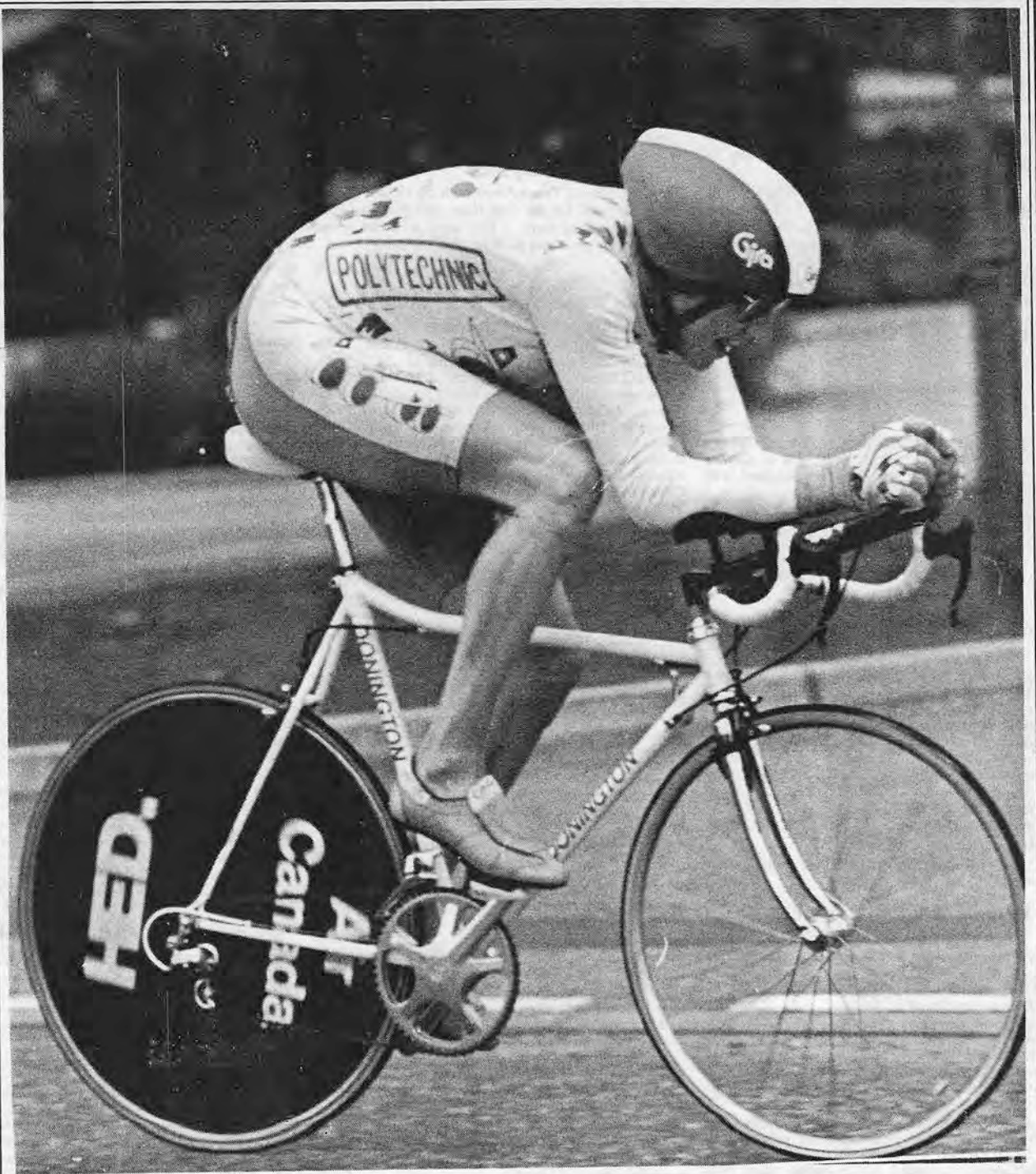

Dudley Hayton wins the Ferryhill Wheelers "sub-aqua" 50

Dudley Hayton (East Bradford CC) returned a fast 1.49.01 to score a narrow 9 second win over Mick Bradshaw (GS Metro) on the rain-soaked A19 in Teesside and North Yorkshire. Interestingly, Dudley equalled his Club's 16 year old record set by Stuart Ackroyd in 1976.

Frequent heavy (and I mean heavy) thundery showers were superimposed on background drizzle, making for conditions which over a quarter of the field decided not to face.

But for those who could stomach the weather, the day produced some fast times with several riders achieving personal bests and 9 competitors beating 2 hours. This, despite a head wind return leg which made the going tough in parts.

The first two places were hotly contested by Hayton and Bradshaw. At 13 miles Dudley was the only rider inside 30 minutes in 29.26. Mick was 40 seconds down at this point.

At 36 miles the gap had narrowed slightly with Hayton on 1.19.21 and Bradshaw on 1.19.48. Other times at this distance were Ian Murray 1.22.55, Steve Vaughan 1.23.50, Andy Cosgrove 1.23.51, Graham Metcalfe 1.24.16, and Robby Krygman 1.24.45.

Robby Krygman finished with 1.55.29 to lead the Goole Vermuyden to the team victory, supported by Pete Read (2.3.6) and James Charles (2.4.5) who rode the last mile on a flat tyre.

An amazing 1.57.47 by Roy Charlton (Houghton CC) earned him the 1st Vet on Standard Award (+32.04) and, at age 52, was his first sub 2 hour ride.

Second placed Vet was 62 year old Dave Gleeson (Condor RC) whose 2.10.31 gave him a +30.54. Mick Bradshaw took 3rd place on Standard with +28.53.

With typical irony, as soon as the event had finished the rain stopped and the sun came out - at least it helped to dry us out!

"And Neville Stroud was the ticket collector" added Glenn.

Longland was incredulous when he heard that the Royal Sutton Team of M.Purshouse, I Robson, and A.Robson had equalled his team's time of 51m.55s. "Did they do the full course, we will have to have a judges enquiry" he joked.

As it was the Suttons had lost their third man with a puncture, and as they had not waited for him they failed to qualify.

Second placed Bournemouth Arrow CC did not have any doubts that it was Mark Fodden, fresh from his fastest place with a "55" in the veterans 25 championship who had set the pace for them. Glen Pickford and Roland Tilley were shaking their heads as they said it, to emphasise how hard it had been to hang on.

Terry Icke, leader of the third placed Poole Wheelers team, was content with his placing, as he was fighting off a heavy cold.

The sixth placed Team Avon with 56.19 had all got under the hour for the first time, and manager Gill Scott, was telling them. "You know what the speed is now, next time you do it on your own."

One second winning margin for Creese.

With the only ride inside 21 minutes, Dave Creese had the narrowest possible winning margin in Monday's Barnet CC '10' over Eddie Adkins, who was experiencing a Bank Holiday of mixed fortunes.

On a fine morning with little wind, the ability of the two main protagonists to reel in the miles at a steady 2mins.6secs. or faster, left the rest of the field well adrift, with the victor modestly putting his slim-line win down to it being his only race of the weekend, whereas Eddie had won an FI '25' the previous day with a course record ride.

This was not the Manchester Wheelers rider's only disappointment. In Saturday's West London '10' he was among the last nineteen riders on the card to lose their chances, when police advised a halt to proceedings because of a heavy rainstorm.

"It had gone very still after the downpour, looked very fast...and some of the later riders said it became a real float," he said. The former national champion and competition record holder is, unusually, not riding this year's title race.

Dave Creese's light weekend programme resulted from a bout of flu, but he showed few after effects in the season that marks his graduation to veteran status! Another returning after illness was Unity flyer Tim Stevens-third in his first race for nearly two years following an attack of shingles, and using tri-bars for the first time.

Neither VC Slough nor the Unity had a third counter, so it was left to consistent Ian Brazier to lead Verulam to their second team win in as many days with a fifth-placed 22.44.

And his father, Tony, now 58 and riding his traditional solo open of the year in an event promoted by the club whose riders used to dominate short distance time trialing in the area, recorded 27.44.

Next year sees the 40th anniversary of his win in the Coronation road race that finished in Welwyn Garden City-just six miles north along the A11

Ex-Tottenham Phoenix track star Norman Colman continued his comeback at 55 in Highgate colours, with a sterling seventh-best 23.09.

Event organiser Derek Cheverton was promoting his 20th edition of the race!

A warm, fine evening masked how hard it was, with a brisk wind blowing from the North making for a difficult return leg, the fastest rider claiming it took over two minutes longer.

Once again Antony Jowett proved too strong, beating Dave Poulter by fifteen seconds, these two being the only riders to beat twenty five minutes, third and fourth placed riders Simon Corbett and Nigel Brunton were separated by only one second. Sarah Corbett continues to show improvement, this week with a 27.44. for a new P.B.

Dangerfield close to record

It was the sort of still warm morning when you expect to do well, but the heat for the later starters cancelled out any advantage they had from traffic. Sixteen riders did PB's, ten from the first half of the field. Of the first sixty starters Dave Redding was out with hay fever, but the half way times showed four riders within five seconds, all reached 10.5 miles in long 23's with Stuart Campbell on 23.43. Rob Swannack and Mike Williams on 23.45 and Gerry Fisher on 23.48. Gerry and Rob swapped places for eventual seventh and eighth.

With the big guns all in the last half of the field, tension mounted amongst the unofficial timekeepers, Dominic Sweeney who holds the course record with 52.26. came steaming to the turn in 22.00 setting the target for the next of the field. Les Pick was a non starter due to something obnoxious in his tummy, which later meant a trip to the hospital.

Mathew Williams was the next rider to challenge with 22.58. he sustained the effort to the finish for 56.05. Eyes were again glued to watches with Dangerfield, Cammish and Dighton to look forward to. Stuart off no 90 looked like a man in search of a course record he turned fourteen seconds up on Dominic in 21.46. The seconds ticked away and it was obvious Ian Cammish was down, but he turned in 22.15. could his distance training pull thirty seconds back?, doubtful but as with all the fast men smoke appeared to be coming from the rear tyre as he sped from the turn.

Competition record holder Gary Dighton arrived at the turn working hard and dead level with Dominic Sweeney a lot was going to depend on how the riders could stand the heat which by now had reached uncomfortable heights. Dominic's chance of a course record faded but he took the lead from Stuart Campbell with 53.08 over three minutes better and he seemed well pleased with his efforts.

The news came in that Ian Cammish had packed and so it was left to Gary and Stuart to beat 53.08. Stuart was up to the challenge and took the lead in 52.38 only twelve seconds off the record, still if he held on to first place it would not be much of a disappointment.

Gary crossed past the start and finish area with four miles to go obviously suffering in the heat with little hope of catching the first two, and so it was third place in 54.09.

The team award went to Team Chiltern with Gerry Fisher ably assisted by Dave Hitchens and Andy Roffe. Three of the days P.B.'s went to the fastest lady, Junior nd Juvenile, Zena Harris, Adrian Tilley and Alan West and our congratulations to them, also to group winners:- Steve Racher, Dominic Wade, Dave Binks and Jim Johnson.

One of the expected highlights of the day was finding out what "Bejaoss" means, unfortunately the organisers voice disappeared so we're still none the wiser, maybe next year!

The day was right, two riders before Short beat Longland's old time, but Jeremy was fastest beating the record by 1m 52secs.

Third placed Lee Paxton (Salisbury RC) admitted feeling the effects of his 50 the day before. Pete Pickers (Antelope RT) who had ridden a 100 in 3hrs.59m, had the look of a man who had just ridden a second 100 instead of a 30 for a tenth place.

"All good training in the Bank" said Pete as he began to recover.

Best veteran on time and standard, and fifth placed overall John Woodburn goes on forever. The only signs of age were that he preferred to talk about a recent randonnee in France, than time trialling. "Just like the peace race, I was not able to talk to anyone there for two weeks" he said.

**1992 National 25 miles
Championship.**

When Britain's top racing cyclists ride in to Cokermonth in the Lake District for the RTTC National 25 Miles Time Trial Championship on Sunday 7th June not only will it be the largest single galaxy of racing talent to appear in Cumbria but also a feast of technological innovation.

Gone are the days of the 'iron-bedstead' frame and fixed wheel, now the modern racing machine owes much of its development to the space age.

Indeed, the common bike has undergone such a technological change that carbon fibre frames are built to a higher specification than American jet fighter planes-such is the colossal levering forces imposed by the modern athlete.

Wheels have not escaped the technology advances either. Out of fashion is the traditional wheel of small diameter spokes to be replaced by discs of carbon fibre or aero-foil spokes of plastic.

The disc wheel reduces turbulence created by the small diameter spokes and acts as a flywheel but creates the noise of a hollow roller travelling over rough ground.

And it was the resurgence of windmill power generation which brought with it the development in aero blades which turn in the wind with minimal frictional losses, the innovation turned round to advance cycle wheel design and create an aero-foil spoked wheel and increase the speed of man-powered machines.

Indeed, it is air friction which is the biggest enemy of the racing cyclist. To carve more easily through this restrictive medium at 30 mph and more the innovative designer has introduced Tri-bars to assist the rider achieve yet higher speeds.

Clipped to the normal steering bars Tri-bars extend the forward reach and put the rider into the familiar crouching stance of the downhill skier. Adopted first by the American tri-athlete and later by the British racing cyclist this innovation can reduce personal 25 mile times by more than sixty seconds-only trouble is everyone else is using them !!

But the technology does not end there; bearings, pedals, saddles and transmission systems have all been subjected to change to make man go faster under his own strength to the point where 25 miles out-and-home can be covered in 48 minutes-who needs a car !!!

That time trialling is not a major spectator sport is not surprising. Who, but only the most ardent fan would want to watch Britain's Premier Blue Riband cycling event at 7 o'clock in the morning!

That is the prospect in store for the hundreds of race fans who will be in Cumbria for the championship.

The championship course on the A66 begins in the lay-by east of the A5086 Egremont junction with the trans-Pennine auto route. With the right conditions, and with the backdrop of high mountains and crystal clear lakes, no other time trial course in Britain offers the prospect of sub-53 minutes times with such magnificent scenery.

However, the splendour of the Derwent Valley will be lost on the riders as they go in search for glory spaced at one minute intervals along the recently repaired surface.

The first five miles are downhill and riders will be reaching speeds of around forty mph. settling to a cruising speed along the flat section beside Bassenthwaite Lake, the only natural stretch of Cumberland water to be called a 'lake'- the rest are 'meres or waters'. Passing the Thornthwaite and Braithwaite junctions the riders will sweep left and right to the roundabout turn at Keswick.

Here, after twelve miles of racing the riders retrace the route back along the A66 and may catch a glimpse of Bishops Rock, a whitewashed prominence on the slopes of Barfs where a man of the frock and his horse were killed in a madcap wager to ride up the steep slopes. In perpetuity the landlord of the Swan Inn from where the wager was set, no doubt after a heavy drinking session, offers all who whitewash the rock a free pint!

At Beck Wythop smooth pedalling rhythms will be

broken by the undulations of the old Keswick coach road before riders emerge from the trees in to the wide open spaces of Embleton Bank.

This section, back to the start point, will be the making or breaking of the would-be champion. Anything more than a westerly breeze will have riders searching for a bigger rear sprocket, an easterly breeze and riders will be scorching along at nearly 30 mph, its that sort of a climb.

Crossing the start point at 24 miles and the homecoming riders will have a glimpse of the next rider on the start block and a check on progress, though many, if not all, will be monitoring speed and heart rate with on-board computers for maximum efficiency.

For the final mile the A66 route drops sharply to the Egremont turn-off but riders go straight on for the final 400 metres uphill, the final sting in the tail, to finish by the steps which lead off left up the embankment.

To avoid U-turns, an offence under RTTC regulations, riders will be advised to continue down to the next roundabout and return to the Cokermonth Sport Centre Headquarters through the town centre.

The drama of the race will unfold at the Race Headquarters where Sports Centre Manager, Barry Johnston has put the badminton hall and changing rooms at the disposal of VC Cumbria. There is also ample car park space.

A large display board will fill gradually with finishing times of the riders, times being relayed by radio from the finish as the riders cross the line.

For the uninitiated, seeded riders will wear a 'zero'; for example rider 120 is the top seed starting in last position at 9.00am. rider No 10 is the twelve seed, he will have started at 07.10am. and will be back in the change rooms before the top seed starts. So the direction of the championship can be followed with the tension mounting as the times of the top seeds are recorded.

THE 'ONCE IN FOUR YEARS TWELVE HOUR EVENT'

Once in every four years the Mid-Devon Road Club promote a 12 hour. This promotion took over from the now defunct South West Time Trial Association event which was run in the 1950's and early 60's. The 1992 event takes place on Sunday 27th July starting at Broad Clyst five miles North East of Exeter, it is promoted with active assistance from all the other clubs of the area.

With this in mind a new course was designed and Derrick Kellaway took on the task of measuring the route because of major road changes in the intervening sixteen years.

The first two events were based upon Cullompton and took in points to the East and North of Exeter and took competitors out to Winkleigh and Barnstaple in the West. This gave some very long legs with or into the wind which, in the case of the latter proved unpopular with all concerned.

The 1992 event takes advantage of change to the regulations and has N.C. dispensation to make it very compact. It uses the roads of the Culm, Clyst, and Exe valleys with many places of interest to see for the more relaxed competitor.

From the Broad Clyst start the route goes to Cullompton and back before tackling a sixteen mile morning circuit four times which include the roads beside the renowned cider orchards of Whimble.

Once off the circuit competitors move to the Exe Valley passing in front of Killerton House, the family home of the Ackland Family and now a National Trust property with its resplendent gardens of Camellias, Magnolias, Azaleas and Rhododendrons.

The Exe Valley has plenty of shelter with its woods and high Devon banks. From its southerly turn on the northern edge of Exeter, riders proceed northwards over Bickleigh Bridge with its 'Chocolate Box' thatched cottages and tumbling waters allegedly the inspiration to Simon and Garfunkel for 'Bridge Over Troubled Waters'. Tiverton is soon reached and it is on to the Northern turn at the Exeter Inn, Bampton.

On returning to Tiverton the only piece of dual carriageway on the route is covered from the old Devon wool town to the M5 and back a total of thirteen miles.

It is then back down the Exe Valley to Exeter. The valley route is covered twice before returning to the seventeen mile finishing circuit.

The finishing circuit is shaped like a frying pan. The handle is from Budlake to Cullompton and back with the pan being around Killerton, Poltimore and past the H.Q. of Budlake.

It has proved impossible to run the event every year as the depth of riders in the South West is insufficient to support this. By running it 'once in four' previous riders have long enough to romanticise about it and ride again and in the four years sufficient new cyclists have started up and are willing to give it a go and for the experience.

Despite fears that the roads in Devon would prove 'too hard' for the riders the distances covered bear up well to examination against other courses. It is hoped that the 1992 compact version will be that little bit better.
