O'Bree and Roche masters

The flying Scot, Graham O'Bree, Greenock RC, duly did what most people expected of him when he returned to the Isle of Man on Sunday, by producing an unbelievable ride in the mountain time trial, to produce the second-fastest time ever in the history of the event, and just stave off a great challenge by the local hope Andrew Roche, the Manx man now riding in the colours of the Liverpool Mercury.

O'Bree had badly wanted to improve on Darryl Webster's outright record of 1.27.37. set up in 1983, but the morning broke to produce a fresh north-westerly wind which was playing havoc with trees all over the island. So strong was the wind in some parts, that debris consisting of twigs and small branches were littered along the roads. Records seemed out of the question, and some even doubted the wisdom of those, including Roche, who chose a rear disc wheel.

Along the opening leg to Ballacraine, riders faced the teeth of the gale, and few were able to beat twenty minutes for the 7.25. miles to that point. Yet O'Bree, riding the same machine which took him to the silver medal in the recent 25-mile championship, clocked a staggering 17.33., and had promptly opened up a gap of 1.03. on Roche.

Next nearest was the unfancied Dean Cross, Ashfield RC in exactly nineteen minutes, and Wembley's Gary Foord, 8th twelve months ago, in 19.11. Former junior record holder Simon Howes, Aylesbury CC, was dead level with the Belgium Hans van Nieuvenhuysse in 19.21.

By Ramsay, at 23.5. miles with the wind still partly in front of the riders for most of this next leg., O'Bree had opened up an incredible gap. He clocked 52.16. to this point, exactly one minute slower than Webster in 1983, and had experienced race-watchers dumb-founded, given the unbelievably hard conditions to this point. Roche, with a second and a third placing in this event in 90 and 91, was now a massive 2.09. behind in 54.25, and it had become a two-man race, with the next man, Cross, clocking 57.23. Foord and Howes were on 57.27., with Nieuvenhuysse next with 58.03.

But now came the mountain. Would O'Bree be able to sustain his undoubted speed up this severe test, with his highly unorthodox machine and it's ultra-narrow'bars? Would his single 56 chainring, allied to a bottom sprocket of some 23 teeth, be low enough?

The answer came at the Mountain Box, the next time check at 29.5. miles. Suddenly the man was human after all. His time of 1.12.36. looked good enough, but Roche, five minutes ahead of him on the road, had clocked 1.13.20. and so had closed the gap to just forty four seconds. In the process, Roche was now catching Howes off five minutes, and with his superior knowledge of this mountain descent, everyone was asking, could the Manxman pull it off?

The mist was swirling around in the brisk wind, and riders were being blown all over the road. Indeed one with a disc wheel, Paul Nabi, Elizabethan CC, was literally blown off the road by the gale, and ended up in Nobles Hospital in Douglas, where he was later released after treatment for cuts and bruises, but thankfully, nothing more serious.

Meanwhile, the descent of the mountain, now in a roaring tail wind, had begun. Astonishingly, Roche got from the Mountain Box to the finish line in an incredible 15.27, exceeding 60 mph down to Creg-ny-Baa according to an official vehicle trying vainly to keep up with him. It gave him a time of 1.28.47.....a new Manx native record. All eyes at the Grandstand strained up the road for a sight of O'Bree. Howes came in first, caught and dropped by Roche, yet destined for fourth place.... his best yet. But then into sight came the Scot, crouched over his bars in that most odd-looking position. Across the line he flew, and then came his time....1.28.15....the second fastest time ever for the event on a day when you'd have thought twice about putting the cat out. His time from the Mountain Box to the finish was a splendid 15.39.....almost as fast as Roche.

Foord salvaged third place....five places better than last year, but it has to be emphasised that O'Bree and Roche were really in a private race of their own.

Roche was disappointed not to have won, but pleased that he'd snatched the Manx record from his hero Steve Joughin.

O'Bree, for his part, was disappointed at missing the outright record, but relieved that he'd actually won the race. "That was diabolical", he said, referring to the weather conditions. Then, on his decision to go with a bottom gear of 56 x 23, he said, 'I was lucky to get away with it, wasn't I?' 'On reflection', he continued, 'I could have done with a lower bottom gear. I wasn't on top of it up the climb, and the intermediate time checks show that that's where I lost time on both Webster's record and Roche. But next time, given a better day, I honestly believe that the record could come down to around 1.25.

Behind O'Bree and Roche, the 'other race' may have been won by Foord, from Howes and van Nieuvenhuysse, but it might well have gone to Dean Cross, who was still well in contention at the Mountain Box, until sadly puncturing soon afterwards. Without a spare, he rode on a 'flat' for about four miles until the French manager caught him up in the team car and kindly gave him a wheel.

The French team was best on aggregate at the end of it all, but team prizes are for club teams only, so it was the in-form Leigh Premier who took that award by just one second from the RAF. Locals were able to cheer the Eilan Vannin rider Graham Stigant, a former Commonwealth Games swimmer for the Isle of May, who took up cycling only after the 1990 games, yet snatched the handicap award with a good time of 1.47.56.

DEATH OF REG HARRIS.

The man who won five World Championships for Britain is dead at 72.

Reginald Hargreaves Harris, born in Birtle, Lancashire in March 1920, put cycling in Britain where it had never been before-and probably never has been since, at the highest levels of public awareness. Like most other British cyclists, Reg started out as a time trialist. He rode his first event at the age of fifteen, after winning a half-mile grass track handicap event at Bury. It was a "25", on a cold icy morning in March so familiar to all time trialists.

His "mentor" Jimmy Battersby, advised him before the start not to beat "evens" so that he would get a good handicap in his next event. Caught by Battersby after 22 miles, Reg was told he was going too fast and got off his bike for a couple of minutes. He still managed 1.12.12!

His career from then on has become legend. Amateur World Sprint Champion in 1947, Reg was a hot favourite for the Olympic title in London the following year. Despite a car crash, incredible pressure from the media and what seems to be the inevitable screw-ups by the selectors and British team management, he won a silver medal in the Sprint. He turned professional soon after.

Four professional World Championship and seventeen top Grand Prix wins later, Reg retired, only to come back and win one more British sprint Championship at the tender age of fifty four!

In recent years Reg has remained interested in the sport and stayed in regular touch with us at Raleigh. I recall some excellent lunches, always accompanied by good wines of course, as well as a string of fascinating anecdotes from his racing career and business life.

"Reg Rides a Raleigh" was the slogan which brought me-and doubtless thousands of youngsters into cyclesport in the early fifties. The face that sold a million Raleighs is no longer with us, but he will never be forgotten.

Lesser riders than Gethin found the strong North to North East wind a bit too much, and were not able to take advantage of the wind over the last few miles.

Talk at the finish was, when, not if, Butler will take Ian Cammish's long standing 100 mile record!

CLOSE BUT NO CIGAR.

The air of expectancy was blown away by a strong North Easterly wind on this years Polytechnic CC. evening 25 on the fastest course in the country.

The early returning riders told of fast rides to the turn but saw their rides disappear as they struggled back to the finish.

The first disappointment was junior Chris Ball (Antelope RT) who's 51.57. missed the junior competition record by 46 seconds. Such is Chris's obvious talent that a 'float' day will not be required to break the record, just a half decent one.

So it wasn't to be a record breaking evening? Not until the irrepressible Glen Longland came in on his trike with a 55.40. smashing D.Pitts record, while Dave blew at the turn only managing 1.09.43. Glen also took the trike team record with Ralph Dadswell 1.0.40. and Neville Stroud 1.03.06., this less than a week after taking twenty minutes of the 59 team record.

Man of the match belonged to Gethin Butler who's 47.57. was received with amazement from his peers. Without the strong wind competition record would have fallen to Gethin, his ride unlike early starters, was without traffic, was the equal of any other effort this year. Its quite astonishing to think Boardman's 47.19. is a long way from being safe.

Derek Hambleton organiser of the East Dorset CA 25 at Ringwood set off number 5, after he had drawn the starting positions out of a hat. He kept requests for a late start to use himself one day. There were plenty to chose from.

He made fourth position and was a member of the winning team.

Winner Lee Paxton (Salisbury RC) got within seven seconds of his personal best on a windy day that left all except new star Ivor Prince (Bournemouth Jubilee Whs) struggling way behind.

Paxton has the metronome like qualities of many top riders, able to keep his speed and pedal revs up into the wind. His main concern on the day was that his club 25 record still eludes him when he holds all the others. The form at 25 miles is a strong pointer to his BAR aspirations this year. He is better on the longer distances.

"I am still learning" said second placed Ivor Prince afterwards in post exam exhilaration, just having finished at Bristol University. He was referring to his riding not his studies.

At 21 he has not yet completed a full year of racing. His first event last July was a 100 miles in 4.17. Intending to ride the full BAR distance this season, he now has time to put in some training, after being restricted to three rides a week while studying.

Remember it was TT Weekly that first told you to watch this man.

Thermo King Cycling Week-end.

The Thermo King 50 mile Classic for 1992 will take place on Sunday 28th June, and will revert to the original formula of having an all cats massed start out to Clifden the day before over a 120 km. course containing two stiff climbs. The route will be, start Eyre Square Galway at 2.00, Oughterard, Maam Cross, Maam Bridge, Leenane, Inagh Valley, to Clifden. There are the Vehicle Refrigeration Services trophy for the best team, the Hughes Cycles trophy for the best Western Regional team, primes at Moycullen, Oughterard, and Leenane, first second and third in the King of the Hills, first nine to finish as well as category prizes for the first four Senior C, Junior 1, Junior 2, and Veterans.

The 50 mile Classic next day, the only one way 50 mile time trial in Ireland, and quite possibly in the world, follows the usual format except that it will be starting at 11.01, not 12.01 as in other years.

Prizes will be £100 for fastest, with a £100 bonus for the best beating of the record of 1.41.12. down to ninth fastest, then the best 4 senior C, Junior 1,2, and veterans.

Past winner Joe Barr has already given notice that he is entering and bringing Flo Gas team mates with him. Past winner Colm Maye and record holder Anthony O' Gorman are expected to be trying to get their names on the Clarenbridge Crystal Trophy for a second time, and it is hoped to persuade 50 mile record holder Phil Cassidy to enter. The man they would all love to beat is Ian Cammish, the UK Raleigh professional who is coming over to beat the record and take the £100 bonus for doing so.

When Cammish came over in 1990, he had a side wind, but still clocked 1.44.19. This time he is coming over a few days early to check out the course thoroughly, and make sure that he is using the proper equipment for the job in hand. Last year Cammish smashed the one-way 25 mile and 50 mile records in a single wind assisted ride in times of 41 minutes 22 seconds (36.261.mph.) and 1.24.32. (35.489. mph) When complimented on his feat, the man known as "The gentle giant" said "It's easy with a tail wind". Maybe, but the average cyclist who at times struggles to maintain 20 mph. can only marvel at such an effort.

Cammish has however become a super star in the UK. This year as much because of the Nationwide media campaign by his sponsors Raleigh as his athletic prowess. Cycling, in spite of large amounts of money being spent remains a Cinderella sport outside of mainland Europe, but Cammish will be the best known face in the race.

The Thermo King 50 mile Classic with the link to the past through the old record by Frank Bailey of Galway in his cycle ride against the old steam train from Clifden to Galway in a time of 2.26.34. has become the time trial that the best riders in Ireland want to win, and this year is no exception. Certificates are awarded to all riders, with their times, and a special feature is the prize presentation afterwards.

The two events are sponsored by Thermo King Europe who are one of the largest employers in the West of Ireland, employing 740. They are the world leaders in transport refrigeration, and a division of the Westinghouse Electric Corporation.

Graham Childs (Portsmouth CC) a 'trackie' with a flair for time trialing, followed up his first sub-hour 25 mile ride of a week ago to win his first open event on the road, by just one second, with the race favourite, Ted Reddick (VC Raphael) twice a winner in 25s on the same course in recent weeks, over thirty seconds in arrears in third place.

The longest day of the year dawned decidedly chilly more than an hour before the first man was called to the line, and he was not alone in choosing arm warmers to combat the unseasonable temperature, but it was not just the weather which upset the hard pressed organiser, Joe Hancock.

With many of his clubmates absent in an abortive bid to help their BBAR Glee Longland, lift the 24 hour title, Hancock had to rely on volunteers from neighbouring clubs to promote the event on a course which frequently attracts more entries for mid-week club events, and he made no secret of his disappointment, with a statement included on the start sheet advising the thirty-one individual and one tandem pair of his decision not to promote the race next year.

All but four of the entrants came from clubs within a twenty mile radius of the start, and with some of these clubs offering the opportunity of a 10 mile dash for less than a fifth of an open entry fee there seems to be little demand for this race anyway.

Members of the Mildenhall CC/Dairytime figured prominently in the national cycling headlines at the weekend following some impressive rides.

Jim and Vera Staines broke a National Competition Record on their tandem trike while Garry Houghton, Andy Owens and Mark Bristow rode amongst the elite in the National 800m Grass-Track Championship. Also locally, several Mildenhall riders performed well in 10 and 25 mile time trials, writes Mark Burchett, the clubs Press Secretary.

It is the mixed pair tandem trike crew record that Jim and Vera Staines claimed for 30 miles after riding in the Hertfordshire Wheelers tandem '30' event on Sunday morning. It was only after they arrived home in Thetford that an excited Vera later revealed "we then started to think about the possibility of us breaking the record, but it was only after a phone call, did we accept that we had done so!"
