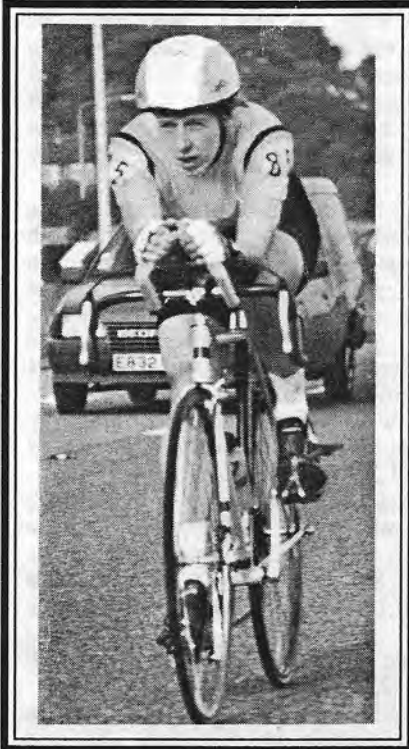

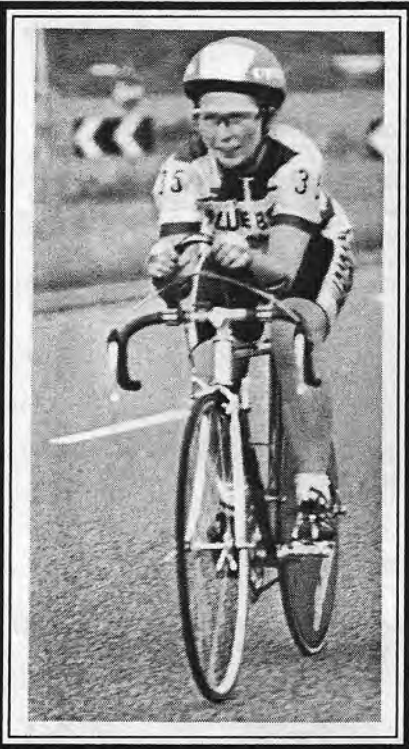

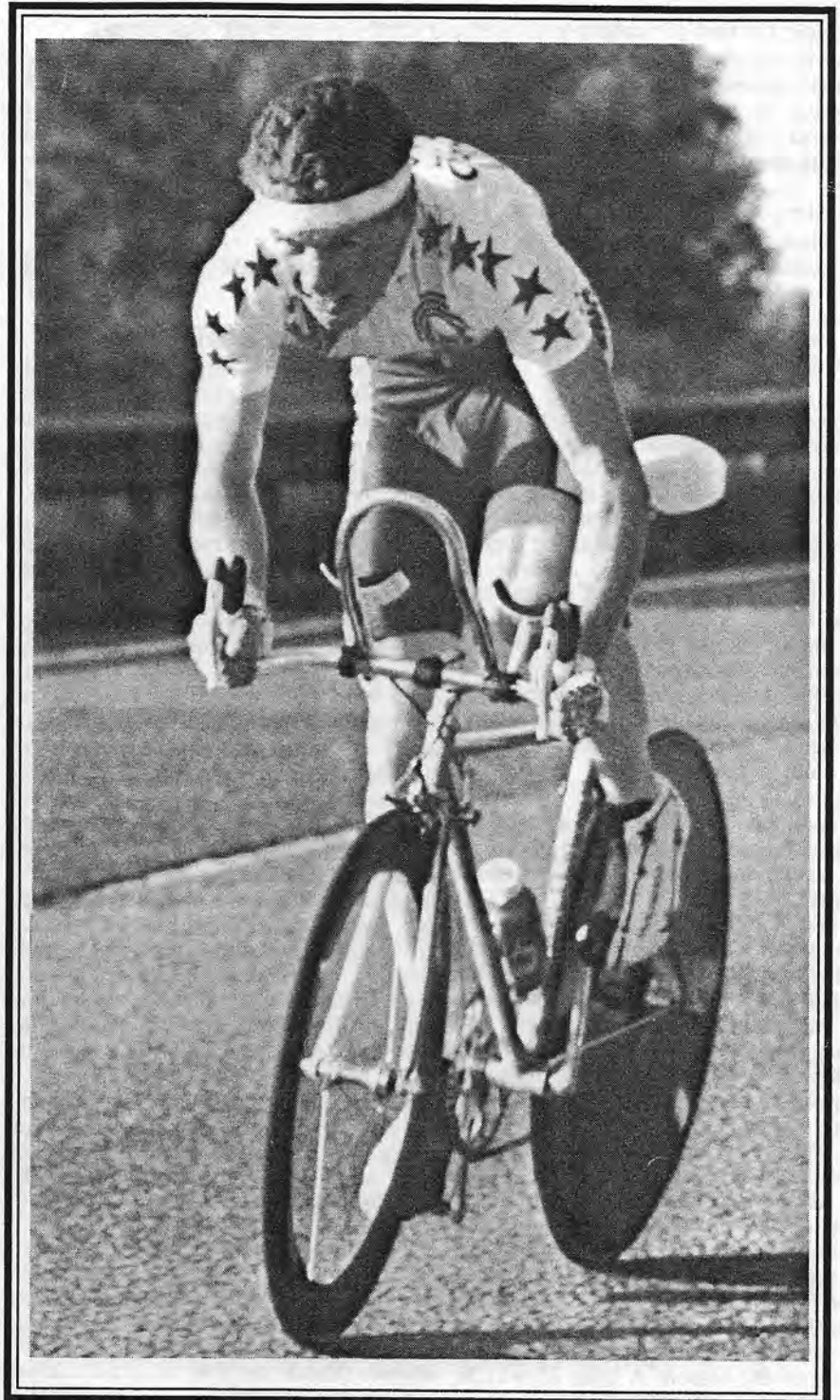

Dadswell's Triumph

"I lost my sense of direction and didn't know where I was going. I thought I'd finished but it was my brain which had packed up."

Ralph Dadswell (Antelope RT Radford Accountants) was speaking quite coherently about the last 88 miles he completed from Tain, a town in the Scottish Highlands above Cromarty Firth, and John O'Groats, the finish of his seventh successive attack on a R.R.a. record.

He was already hallucinating after snatching only an hour's sleep since leaving Land's End nearly forty-eight hours earlier when he passed through Tain with over eight hours remaining to beat Eric Tremaine's ten year old record of 2 days, six hours, 18 minutes, 35 seconds, and he felt sure he could still beat those figures by at least two hours, without realising what an effect his mental state was having. His condition was not helped when he strained an achilles tendon shortly before Helmsdale, the first of two extremely difficult climbs on the bleak coastal road.

"I had intended attacking those hills but decided to take it easy because of my ankle and don't remember much about the rest of the ride," 28 year-old Dadswell recalled afterwards, unaware that Martin Purser, a member of his back-up team accompanying the record bid, ran alongside him for two miles during the last hour. Over half that time was spent covering the final five miles, and it was a very relieved timekeeper, Audrey Hughes, who eventually recorded his arrival, 2 days, five hours, 29 minutes, after setting out on the 840 mile ride.

Ambitiously scheduling to beat the Leicestershire RC man's record by four hours, he had improved it by 49 minutes, 25 seconds- more than enough to add this most prestigious record to the four shorter R.R.A. records which still stand in his name.

His physical condition was not the only difficulty he conquered. Approaching the summit of Shap Fell shortly after switching to brother, Tim's tricycle fitted with a triple chainset, the smallest ring broke, necessitating a return to the higher geared machine with double chainset on which he started his ride. This mishap was swiftly rectified by his support team who drove ahead to Carlisle for a replacement chainset which was fitted and available for him when lower gears were needed in time for the long haul over the Grampians between Perth and Iverness on the second night.

"They did a great job for me," Dadswell said, and they were just as quick replacing a wheel after he picked up a piece of glass on the obligatory cyclepath crossing the Forth Bridge.

The first half of Dadswell's double day and night ride went comparatively well, but the 45 minutes he gained on his schedule for the first 200 miles coincided with an arrival in Bristol during the evening rush-hour. The next 200 miles ended with a 37 minute deficit replacing that gain, and that increased by an hour beyond the long haul over the Scottish Beef Tubs between Moffat the Scottish Lowlands.

That still left the Isle of Wight man with plenty of time in hand to beat the old record, and gave no cause for concern until the hours in hand turned to minutes on the fateful third day.

Memories of that painful experience have done nothing to alter Dadswell's plans for the rest of the season. A trike 25 will be followed by a club 10 before he takes a complete week-end break from the saddle but he plans to be on three wheels again in September, for the North Midlands C.F.100 and the Icknield R.C. 12-short distance events by his standards now!

Hounslow team winners

The National 12 hour Championship started in torrential rain which continued throughout the morning and the early part of the afternoon, flooding parts of the course and reducing at least one rider to dismount and walk along the bank!

All the more credit then to those riders (and marshalls) who battled it against the elements until the rain finally abated and the sun finally shone.

There was little doubt from the start that Gethin Butler was going to win and, given the conditions, his was a superb ride. With three riders in the first ten, Hounslow and DCC had the team medals sewn up with the silver and bronze medallists Colin Roshier and Peter Holdsworth riding steadily throughout with able back up from 10th placed R.Richardson contributing his 243 miles to the team total.

Diminutive Jean Burrows, Shaftesbury CC., beat many of the men with her near 223 miles to finish first lady, while tricyclist B. Moore, VC Cumbria, travelled farther than most to compete but fully justified his journey by winning the East Region, TA event with a cracking 224.4 miles.

There were just three tandems, including one tandem-trike, all with mixed sex crews and it was the Bath CC pair of Janet and Peter Wilson who emerged the winners in this event.

Cammish completes week-end "Double"

On a fast morning, when 35 riders were inside 2 hours and many PB's were produced, a valiant ride by Steve Vaughan (Morley CC), who improved by 4 minutes, failed to prevent Ian Cammish (Raleigh) making it a week-end double on Yorkshire roads.

Fresh from his success in the Nunbrook Wheelers 10 on the previous day, Ian won the Otley 50 with a course record of 1.44.14 but not without a challenge from local rider Steve Vaughan (1.45.41) who again impressed by slashing 4 minutes off the time he achieved a fortnight ago when he set the initial record for this new course.

It was a fast day but nobody said it was easy. Early starters had to contend with wet roads and a bit of mist but the calm conditions just about lasted for the duration of the event - the slight breeze that did appear perhaps even helped the later riders along the last leg from the A1 to the finish.

There were some notable rides by Veterans. Paul Wildsmith (Barnesbury CC), 1.51.20, being the fastest.

Don Hacking (Birkenhead North End CC) again made his journey across the Pennines worthwhile by easily taking the First on Standard award with a fine ride of 1.56.10 giving him an unassailable "plus" of +45.53. Les Dawson (Teesside RC) was 2nd on std with +39.15 (2.06.41)

The fastest Lady was favourite Elaine Ward (Scarborough Paragon) who was disappointed with her 2.06 17. She was pressed by Sue Oxley (Kent Valley RC) who took second place with a time of 2.07.48.

Following an entry of 279 which closed on 59.00, there were 19, non starters. It was a bad day for mechanical trouble and six riders failed to finish, including the scratchman John Pritchard (Express RT) who punctured after only three miles.

A high south westerly wind made life very hard to the turn, but provided a superfast return to the finish. Steve Elms (East Grinstead CC) excelled both into, and with the wind improving by over two minutes to win by 46 seconds from a consistent Ron Keeble. In spite of the high wind, some 27 personal bests were recorded.

The unluckiest rider was Keith Reed (Clarence Whs CC) who was forced to ride down a slip road by an Oxford United football supporters car when all set to achieve a personal best. He still managed to record 52.51. for sixth place.

All the first three in the Wessex RC 100 at Wimborne, Dorset were pleased with their rides. Winner Ben Edwards (Clarence Wheelers) to finish in front of his friend and team mate Ray Hughes, and to get in his fourth win of the year.

"It is about even, four each" chipped in Ray Hughes, while they ran through the events that counted.

Ray too was pleased with his second place. "I rode a good race today" he said. "The form is coming back." He had punctured at sixty miles, but was not sure how much time it had cost him. Nor would he say whether he would have won without the puncture. "Who knows" was his only comment.

"I thought I would get going over the last 30 miles, and make him suffer" said Ben who had started after Ray. "I rode a 12 three weeks ago, but packed after 100 miles, I started too fast." He has got the feel of it now" added Ray.

The Clarence boys have their eye on the team race for the BAR. "Our third man is the mouse (Steve House)" said Ray. They will be riding the Poole Wheelers 12 hour race in September, and the feeling is that this is going to be serious.

Third placed Andy Cook (Leo RC) admitted to "feeling a bit better today" after having back trouble for most of the season. It had been decision day for him. If he had not done well he would not have gone on. He had ridden an 80 mile road race during the week, saying "it helped."

It is never easy to tell if John Woodburn (Manchester Wheelers) is happy or not. Finishing fourth he claimed to have ridden because it was an opportunity to visit his mother in law who lives in Bournemouth, picking up both the veterans prizes on his weekend visit. He will not be riding a 12 hour this year.

Glenn Longland (Antelope RT) riding a 100 on a trike for the first time, won the novice prize, a minute outside competition record. Finishing in seventh, just behind team mate Pete Pickers. Who was complaining that the course was two miles long on his computer. "Don't worry, with your time it won't make any difference" joked John Woodburn.

First lady Carol Gandy (San Fairy Ann CC) leading the two distance BAR table wants to finish in the first six in the three distance event, said afterwards. "I don't want to ride another 100. I found it very, very, very, hard coming back."

The climb from the M27 had come as a shock, as well as the hills between the M27 and Ringwood. She is now going to concentrate on her 25 mile time.

Among the 17 none starters from the full field of 80 was Pauline Strong (Team Raleigh) off attacking her Lands End to John O'Groats record. With a strong wind coming from the North West early in the day, it was no surprise when we heard that she had abandoned.

"THINGS THAT GO BUMP IN THE NIGHT"

Again it was in the Mersey 24 hour, which in those days went from Salmey Marshes near Chester, round the coast road to Prestatyn, turning at Nant Hall, and back. Usually a long lonely leg except for the lights that passed in the night.

At the turn, the Welsh cyclists organised a bonfire and handed up hot cocoa or soup. Occasional coaches and the sky-glow of the furnaces at Connor's Quay were also visual contacts with life.

Thus it was a period when positions could change dramatically, for it was not easy to tell who you were catching or losing out to until daylight on the way back to Whitchurch and if there was any wind, some forty miles often in pitch darkness without any friendly calls, so spirits could evaporate and thoughts of packing on return to Chester, enter the mind. Little-wonder there were few packings after this leg and the pattern of the event had been set.

On this occasion I was going well having entered this forbidding area lying second or third and still not feeling any aches or pains. Reaching the turn sooner than expected I was able to stop to enjoy a mug of soup and gather some information about who was in front of me and by how many minutes before determinedly setting off convinced that this was to be my year for getting my name on the trophy. The gentle breeze was at my back so I soon settled into a steady rhythm in 91" top gear.

The illumination from an ordinary battery cycle-lamp, although focussed on the left hand curb, was at most a mere legal requirement, but with a peaked cap tilted over the right eye, I could by slightly tilting my head, cut out the dazzling headlights of any oncoming cars while seeing that I didn't run into the side. But if there was no traffic about it seemed safer to ride near the middle of the road, near the white line where there was one.

Careering along at well over 'evens', well up on my schedule, confident that I'd always done a faster second twelve hour when--BUMP-a mighty BUMP but I was still upright and riding, if more slowly, I'd no idea what had happened-it couldn't have been a brick or tree branch I'd ridden across as there had been no shaking or rocking of the bike and I'd obviously not hit anything as solid as a brick wall or back of a car. What could have happened-thankfully I seemed alright.

At that moment the lights of a distant coach lit up the road and I looked back.

Two young men were picking themselves up off the road holding their backs! I dare not stop, realising that I had passed exactly between them, otherwise I'd have had a terrific accident.

What they were doing walking in the middle of the road out-in-the-sticks I never found out or if they suffered any kidney trouble, for so relieved not to have been fetched off, I soon got going and managed to finish second in the event for the first time.

MILES AND MEASUREMENTS.

On a recent Sunday evening I had a telephone call to advise me that Phillip Barlow of the Kiveton Park CC. had added something like 40 miles to the NRRA 24 hour single bicycle record of 441.75 miles, a record previously held by Jim Hall of the Rutland CC.

You may wonder why I use the words "something like". The fact is that his course has yet to be measured. A surprise no doubt to many who have been brought up in the world of time trialling.

Time trial courses have to be submitted in advance for approval to the local D.C. They have to be accurately measured and the route has to be clearly defined. Furthermore, roads may be used in some circumstances up to six times.

In record breaking it is entirely different. First of all, in the case of a regional RRA., the route has to be within the defined area of that Association. Once that has been established it is entirely up to the record aspirant where he or she chooses their course. Records that are attempted up to 100 miles are invariably on straightaway courses. This means that an attempt may be undertaken in one direction only, unlike a time trial course where the start and finish have to be within a specified distance with one another. As an aside to this it must be noted that when it comes to place to place records no measurements are required. The essential factor is that the record breaker must have proof that both terminal points have been visited. Furthermore, he or she can choose any route they like between the terminal points, but common sense decrees that the shortest route is taken. Additionally there are usually mileages noted on the schedule together with approximate times for the benefit of checkers.

Clearly, with the knowledge of weather conditions and local geography, the straightaway courses become standardised, and are used again and again. In the Northern RRA. area the Bowes Moor courses at 25,50 and 100 miles are well established, and it is unlikely that many other courses will be used in the near future.

When it comes to 12 and 24 hour records it is different. In the past, existing time trial courses have been used in part, with suitable extensions according to the whim of the rider. The spine of the Pennines precludes large areas for flat courses, but in Barlow's case he was able to find suitable roads to the east of the Pennines to good advantage. He also used the new ring roads round York and Lincoln, a new innovation.

He has already lodged a claim for the record, but has indicated no mileage.

This is quite permissible.

In due time appointed NRRA course measurers will get to work on his behalf, and from their efforts the committee will be provided with a certificate of measurements. These will be studied and checked, and finally a mileage will be agreed. It is interesting to note that, whilst the measurements will be presented to three places of decimals, the final distance will be to that next quarter of a mile, a precautionary measure that allows the final decision to be on the safe side.

This attempt has reminded me of a situation that has a habit of presenting itself when giving notice for an attempt. It is the decision of the aspirant as to whether to put in for the national record as well. Barlow decided not to, and indeed it is likely that his eventual mileage will not be enough to have been good enough. It will however, be within only a short distance of the existing record.

I gather that it was felt that, as the current record was done on a straight out route from Lands End (during an End to End record be it said), the 24 hour record was not attainable.

Well, be that as it may, Barlow showed that it is possible for it to be attained even on a local course. It is worth recording that Bailey and Forrest did 492 miles on a tandem in 1959 on much the same roads as Barlow and that at 24 hours the bicycle and tandem mileage tend to come closer together.

I have no doubt that some who read this will have been surprised to note the different approaches to time trialling and record breaking. Many will be of a younger generation than myself, and as a final thought let me remind them that record breaking is the ultimate accolade. You have to ride alone and unaccompanied. You have only the watch to beat but you can take advantage of the weather and the terrain but basically you are on your own.

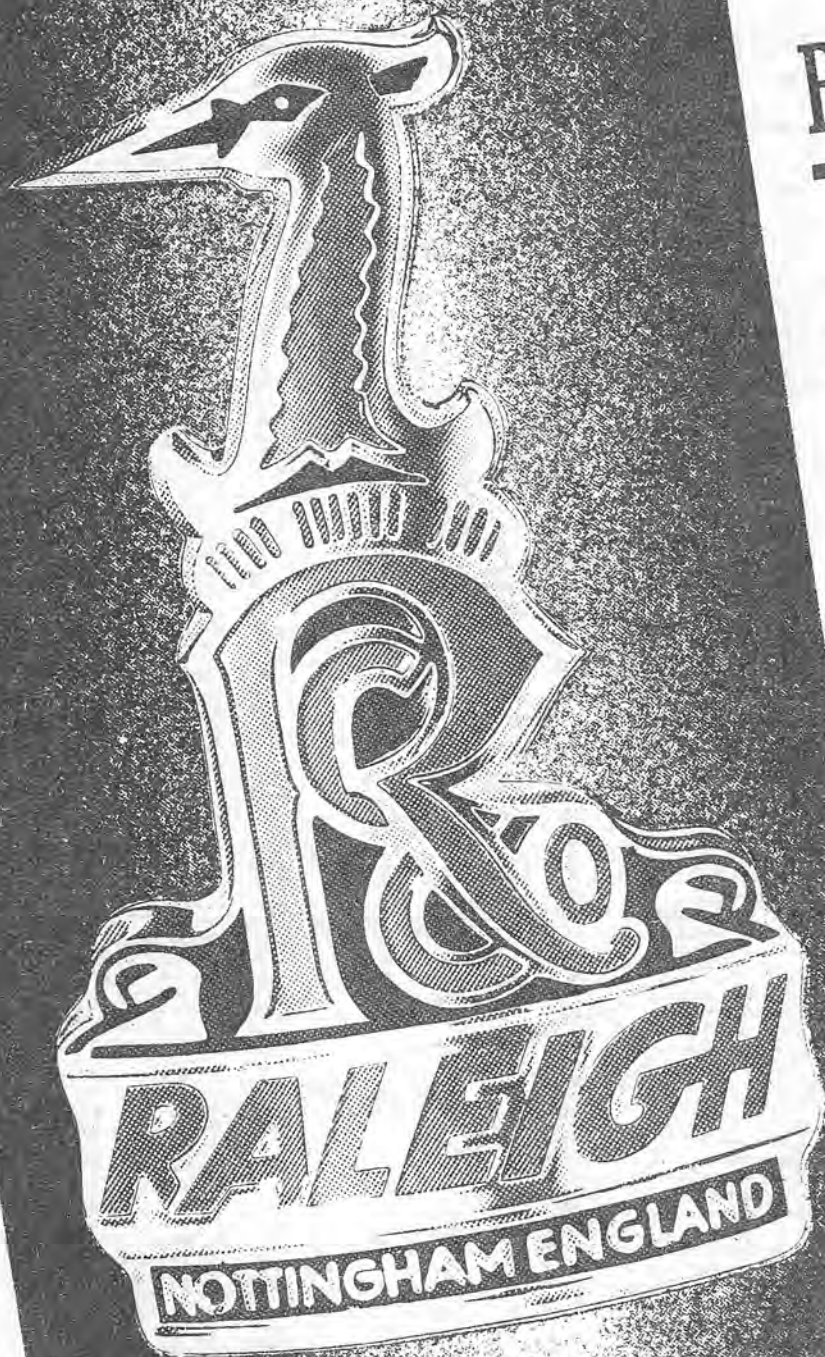
