Creese beats Allen and Cammish for 17th win.

VC Slough's Dave Creese has proved a hard man to beat this season especially if conditions are hard, as Ian Cammish (Team Raleigh) and Adrian Allen (Team Haverhill) found in Sunday's Lea Valley RC 'Comet 25' on the E1 course.

Creese led a trio of 55-minute riders for his 17th win of the year-his first as a veteran-in 55.19. "I like the E1 and it seems to suit my way of riding. I used the 16 a lot into the wind on the way out, and probably went better than I did on the way back," he said.

Ian Cammish, tanned after his recent holiday, could have justifiably pointed to having done his ride of the weekend the previous day in heavy rain when he had a three-minute win with a 1.5. in the promoting club's open '30' He made no such excuse, however, and gave best to both Creese and Allen, the Suffolk track man, whose end-of-season time trialling has been impressive, especially on hard days and hilly courses. He can now add the Raleigh professional to an impressive list of 'scalps' in recent weeks, including that of Martin Pyne.

Kevin Neary (Southend & County) was the only other rider to get near the 55-minute standard, with 56.37. Only nine beat the hour on a morning which Cammish had predicted at the start would prove slower than the rainswept Saturday, because of a strong, cold north wind.

It was not a good morning for the professionals, Pauline Strong (Team Raleigh) being beaten by Unity CC's Margrite Cornillie, 1.06.21. by 26 seconds, but at least she had the laugh on husband and mechanic(?) Alan who, goaded by Cammish to brave the elements in the '30' on Saturday on a new titanium-framed mountain bike, hit a pothole and suffered the indignity of shunting the seat pillar down the seat tube!

In the circumstances his 1.25, after having to borrow an allen key from a marshal was a good effort. Southgate CC had an unexpected win in the team race, but put an equally historic name on the Comet CC silverware. Can it really be 23 years since the Lea Valley Road Club took their classic 32nd course season-ender?

Joe Jones and his pacer Bruce Drew were runners up in the "fastest" category, beaten by the smooth working combination of Rogers and Dawson, whose 21.59 for the first ten miles was mainly straight into the wind.

MERSEYSIDE WHEELERS INVITATION.

If you had taken a vote from the usual large crowd at the Merseyside Wheelers Invitation 32 miles hilly at Delamere as to who they would like to win when Chris Boardman went out with a puncture it would be safe to say the name Pete Longbottom would have been at the top.

Pete has ridden the event without a break for ten years and always been amongst the top half dozen.

This time he achieved his ambition by producing an exceptional ride of 1.13.53. which held off young challenger Stuart Dangerfield (Leo RC) by a clear 54 seconds. Dangerfield pipped Simon Lillistone (Haverhill) by a single second.

Richard Prebble of Wembley RC, who happens to come from Liverpool really, was fourth in 1.15.13, as a warm up to flying out to Australia for three weeks racing trip, along with Matt Illingworth (GS Strada) who was in sixth spot on 1.16.15., just behind the Welsh flyer Matthew Postle (Delta RC)

But how about that lovely Manx girl Marie Purvis of Manx Viking Wheelers? What a superb effort she produced in setting a new of womens' records for the event and course. Marie left a few male red faces when she came in 24th, fastest with 1.22.01. which included each time up Overton Hill and the two fastest laps. She picked up six envelopes from Bob Memery (£145) but declined Bob's offer of 6 kisses!!

Sadly, ten non-starters for this end of season classic with the best field of 50 riders ever assembled. What happened to Chris Boardman?

Not having raced since he broke the world 5,000 metres record at Leicester on August 22, Chris was surprised at how well he was going. He caught minute man Richard Wooles but after 17 minutes riding he went out with an impact puncture to his front 24" wheel.

Pretty sure he would have been fastest but good luck to Pete Longbottom.

Brooks' Birthday Win

Rain stopped shortly before the start of the race, but left wet roads which required cautious bike handling in the first eight miles of twisting, undulating roads along the northern edges of the Mendip Hills.

This event was a re-run of the race which had to be cancelled on March 22nd due to dangerously high winds. Those who rode praised the event for its varied course, with undulating valley roads and the fast tailwind-assisted hilltop run, interspersed with the 2.5. mile climb of Burrington Coombe and the muscle wrenching ascent of Harptree Hill just before the finish.

Unfortunately, only 18 of the original 68 entered riders took part, probably due to most of the season having now ended. This may have diluted the level of competition slightly, given that such seeded riders as Ben Luckwell and Adrian Rowley did not participate, but nevertheless it was to be expected that the consistently fast Somerset man Clive Brooks, celebrating his 35th birthday on the day, would take a high placing, having been second in the event last year.

Brooks' win was particularly noteworthy in that, with only one rider starting in the 20 minutes before him, he covered most of the route without ever seeing another competitor ahead. Another noted participant was former French-based professional Peter Head, a famous name in the 1960's, describing himself as "just another tired old pro attempting a comeback", he nevertheless rode strongly to take third overall, and the vets award.

Unfortunately, due to the difficulties of marshalling such a complicated route, this event will not be taking place next season. However, fortunately for the 'hilly' aficionados in the Bristol region, a new race of some 30 miles, promoted by Bath CC, will take its place in March using a circuit based on Frome, Mere and Warminster.

Pritchard Rules OK?

A visit from John Pritchard BEM is the nearest thing to cycling royalty, and he duly obliged with a regal twenty third win of the season in the Sotonia CC 25 at Andover. The Dauphin young Ceri, following in at tenth place.

"Not a good year" he said afterwards. He usually has 40 or 50 wins. Moving house because he has been posted has upset his training programme this season. Should any of his rivals be looking for a respite, don't relax. He has extended his contract with the RAF, and will be back next year.

Starting two minutes behind Andy Sharpe (Bio RT) he said "I knew if I could catch Andy I would have done a good ride." Not that anyone had any doubts about who was going to win before the race.

When asked how he felt about being caught, Andy Sharpe replied "relieved I was in sight of the finish."

After the event, in the HQ at the Moore Reed factory canteen provided by Managing Director Bob Smith, a member of Andover Wheelers, both riders were full of enthusiasm.

They feel that a closer look should be taken at training methods and positioning for time trials. John has been doing the research into training methods, and Andy an arts design graduate has been working on positions, with his club sponsor Argus Cycles.

The proof was that they were in front of the others on a day when few got under the hour, but the good news is that they do not mind sharing their information with anyone prepared to listen.

Andy Sharpe was just back from riding the Duo Normand two up time trial in France with Justin Morley, where they finished second in their class.

Impressed with the way that the French put on a time trial as a spectacle. He feels that the RTTC officials should go over there to get new ideas on promoting time trials. He thinks that the problem with our officials is that they just accept Police advice that a course is dangerous, and are not prepared to enter into discussions on a way of getting round it. Time trialing could be made interesting for sports fans.

Behind the two leaders at Andover, there was a close battle between five riders for third place, with only 15 seconds separating them.

Veteran Harry Featherstone fourth of the five lost a few seconds at the start, when his foot came off his pedal, showing up as a 20 second loss at five miles. When he heard that he had pulled some of it back by the finish, irrepressible Harry chided the youngsters for not having the stamina of some of the more experienced hands.

One of the best rides on the day came from Charlie Press (Bournemouth Arrow CC) eighty three on Saturday, he had driven 50 miles from Bournemouth before the start, as well as having driven over the day before to check the course for his first 25 of the year.

At that age his time of 1.55.15. seemed irrelevant, but he was not satisfied "I will have to give it up if I can't do better than that" he said. Don't do that Charlie, you give us all hope.

"Duo Normand" Team Time Trial, Marigny, France.

It's not very often British time trialists have the chance of launching themselves down a starting ramp and racing against the clock with a support car following them round the whole course, complete with a banner bearing the names of the riders draped across the front bumper.

No event under the R.T.T.C. rules of racing enjoys these conditions, but they are common enough in continental Europe and that is exactly where a growing number of home grown riders are going at this tail end of the season. Most of these races are "gentlemen's" events, but for the past ten years cyclists of all ages have been converging on the small town of Marigny, about six miles west of Saint Lo in Normandy, to complete in the "Duo Normand."

As its name implies, this is a two-up time trial, held on a 52.3 mile course (42 kilometres for the women's category) which has grown from an entry of 114 teams in 1982 to over 400 this year. They are now divided into no fewer than ten different categories, ranging from unlicensed entrants to professionals, and they include a group for tandems. The emphasis is on teams of two; the number of cycles they ride is of secondary importance!

The first British success was recorded in 1989 when Sandy Carne (Thames Velo) and Jeff Hathaway (North Bucks RC) won the veterans class in 1.20.35, and the following year Graham Weeks and Warwick Rowe (Polytechnic CC) triumphed in the tandem race, clocking 1.18.05. Andy Smith and Richard Holkam (Brighton Excelsior) improved that effort by over six minutes when they kept the tandem title on the English side of the Channel in 1.11.54. last year, and though they took over a minute longer to complete the course again this time they completed a hat-trick of British victories in this discipline with a winning ride of 1.13.02.

Their victory was the first of four British wins which made the eleventh edition of the race the most successful. The strength of time trialling amongst veterans was clearly evident in this group which was won by Gino Goddard and John McMillan (Kento RC) at the expense of no fewer than another seven British pairings placed in the top ten, and the other wins came from Alan and Pauline Strong (Team Raleigh) in the mixed section, and Paul Gadd and Peter Rice (Twickenham CC) in the third category of license holders.

The race has become an all day affair and really stretches the resources of the promoting ACC Marigny whose services include a mountain bike meeting on the Saturday and booking accommodation facilities for all visiting entrants. The club also provide two evening and one mid-day meals and displays "count down" boards at every kilometre round the circular course. About two-thirds of the route follows two main roller-coaster

roads each side of the town, and the rest of the course follows narrow, twisting lanes which are equally undulating.

Marshals, each issued with a red flag, are positioned at all road junctions round the course, and they are supported by the local police at major junctions. Not surprisingly for a country like France, motorists who venture onto the course understand what it's all about and have no hesitation in giving the riders a clear passage, happy to pull off the road if necessary.

Performances vary between the open first category class, won this year by Italian amateurs, Luca Colombo and Gian Franco Contri, in 1.06.20. to a group for cyclists representing local companies. The French Post Office was well represented in this group, providing both the winners, in 1.15.38., and the slowest, who clocked 1.45.39.

They raced immediately after the 76 unlicensed teams started, at 1.5. minute intervals from 8.30.am. Father and son, Fred and Chris Shepherd (Bognor Regis CC) were given the doubtful privilege of starting first this year, and, like all good shepherds, they led all the way to finish in 1.22.30.-a four minute improvement on last year.

Shortly after they were despatched down the starting ramp another British couple, Graham Frogley and Derek Harris (Hampshire RC) touched wheels within seconds of starting which left the latter lying in the road, but he quickly remounted to join his clubmate and finish in 1.33.11.

As expected, these times were well beaten by the six tandemists, and then it was the turn of the mixed groups to come under starter's orders. The Strongs were the fastest of two British entries in this category; a time of 1.26.08 carried them comfortably clear of Tim Jones and Carolyn Ward (Wyre Forest CRC) who were second in 1.29.59.

The Veterans category was almost entirely British in composition and they did not disappoint, with all finishing in time for celebration lunches, thanks mainly to Goddard and McMillan, first in 1.22.05. Don Lock and Ken Retallick (Worthing Excelsior) second in 1.23.02, and Nick Armstrong and Dave Driver (Yeovil CC) third in 1.23.43.

Early afternoon saw the third category men in action, and the British successes were maintained by Paul Gadd and Peter Rice (Twickenham CC) first in 1.17.19, and Jason Morley and Andy Sharpe (Bio RT) third in 1.18.12. They were followed on the result board by another four British teams in the top ten.

Faster times were recorded as the weather remained sunny and warm throughout the afternoon. VC Etoile's McNamara twins, Chris and Simon, were placed fourteenth in the junior section, taking eight minutes longer than the winning Frenchmen, William Belloir and Nicolas Guillard (US Mortain) who clocked 1.10.46.-a time which proved to be over 2.30. minutes too quick for another French couple, Gregory Galbadon and Laurent Paumier (Periers Sport) who

were best of the second categories, in 1.13.24. This was the category which produced another British success; a time of 1.17.17 for the Kingston Wheelers brothers, Tim and Simon, earned them a special trophy as fastest family.

Forty-two teams in the open category brought this remarkable event to a close shortly after 6 pm. when the Italian duo produced the fastest time of the day, beating two professional teams in the process after a third, containing last year's World Pursuit Champion, Francis Moreau, dropped out with mechanical problems.

Britain had three riders in this group, with one of them, Simon Bray (Invicta RC) wearing his recently won national road jersey. He partnered his French clubmate, Bruno Meunier of Limoges, to finish twenty-fifth in 1.12.54. one place and two seconds ahead of Ian Brown (Guernsey Velo) and Ray Hughes (Clarence Wheelers).

A memorable day ended with a formidable prize presentation in a newly built sports hall where a lightweight exhibition had been open for the weekend, and as light refreshments were served new Anglo-French friendships were cemented with the promise, "See you next year."

Winners Payne and Ollerenshaw with a 7 minute margin were never pressed, their time would not have been out of place even on the dragstrips, it is hoped that the field for 1993 will return to its previous levels of about 20 machines.

DOUGIE IN THE DAYTIME.

It was urgent. I had to think of something good and inspiring...and double quick. Talk about morale taking a nose dive., John Pritchard had absolutely hammered past, red shoes whirring and that disc wheel roaring along.

Then there was the roundabout incident, the six cars and two lorries in a long queue. It wouldn't have been too bad except for one plankton at the wheel of a brown Fiesta who stood with his nearest wheels right up close to the curb.

And to crown it all, my minute man was nowhere in sight, even at the turn, and he was 13 years older than me!

Thoughts searched around and then settled on adverts (I don't know why). My favourite is that the one out in the desert-there's bare rocks and a blazing sun. Two policemen try to tempt the hungry fugitive from his hide-out somewhere up in the rocks by pouring out bowls of Kellogg's cereals. On goes the milk and then they munch noisily. The result is all too much: the man they're after's mouth starts to water. He can't resist. He steps into the open and gives himself up.

But that's not all...suddenly a second man breaks cover, then another, until the whole mountainside is full of heads and hats and upstretched arms. They all want to surrender, they want to come on down.

The only trouble is (as I go up a gear) that I can't remember what those spoonfuls were that were being advertised. Never mind, I wouldn't buy the stuff any way. But I do like the ad.

Which reminds me of the spells spent sat watching Channel 4's coverage of the Kelloggs Tour-I was even up there on the last day, if you must know, when Robert Millar was over a minute ahead and Holme Moss was just a tiny peak in the distant background. Liggett and the expreso blatherazzi were excellent except for just one thing: they keep prattling on about Pop Tarts.

Some days every second breath was a plug for Pop Tarts. They were sprinting for them, sweeping round bends for them, almost dying for them. It's a Pop Tarts sprint. It's another Pop Tarts sprint. At every mention I (ignorant sole) found myself asking the same question-what the hell are Pop Tarts?

Mind you, there's one particular advert that makes me want to ask the manufacturer's top brass what on earth they're going on about because it poses questions that it fails to answer. It leaves me feeling I'm being tricked, you know what I mean?

You've probably seen the ad, its for Isostar, the drink for athletes. I remember when Lucozade moved out of the hospital-patients-only market, painted a wider image and pitched itself head and shoulders above all those common-or-garden brands of fizzy lemonade. Now Isostar has given itself the mantle of the 'in' drink, lifting the liquid -nutrition-for-the-serious-sportsman pinnacle way aloft, way up into the statosphere.

You need to know right from the start that I'm not a convert: I drink straight water when

I'm out, plus jam sandwiches if its a long run.

But back to Isostar with its Iso optimal formula. The advert says "as you work, you sweat. This leads to dehydration. And research has shown that dehydration of just 2% of body weight reduces athletic performance by a simply staggering 20%".

Not just that, but a 4% loss of fluids cuts performance by 40%! OK, I'm not questioning the facts, but is any of this relevant? What I want to know is do I (well, not me in particular, but a typical time trialist then) run a risk of 2% fluid loss during a 10 mile time trial? How about during 25 miles or 50 miles? What if it was a very hot day?

What I'm getting at is this-when I do need to take fluid of any sort, be it Isostar or merely Dougie's favourite home-spun tap water?

So far then Isostar hasn't cut any ice with its high-tech speel, raising the question of fluid replacement (lost by sweating) without offering a frame scale gets us nowhere.

At this point the advert gets to its hard sell: Isostar is isotonic. This means "its concentration is in exact balance with your body fluids". Explanation, Mr. Boss of Isostar Research Centre, please.

University of Strasbourg studies are quoted boasting a quicker absorption rate with Isostar as compared with water or a non-isotonic drink. But how much quicker? If I was halfway through a 50-mile event, holding dead level with my minute man, how much faster time would I log at the finish if I drank Isostar while he only had Lilt, or 7-Up?

Does Isostar's top whack purchase price buy me a second or half a minute? Even when I'm riding on my mega-fast, wind-slicing Wolber wheels?

But look at that crafty old ad closely and you'll see the gladiator who drank Isostar took it after one hour of battle with the result that his blood fluid increased at a fair old rate of knots, but the poor old laggard who got a non-isotonic test drink was only offered his after two hours!

In my book that's not fair, it's not comparing like with like. So, Mr Isostar Public Relations Boss, could you send me details of the trial, c/c Time Trial Weekly of course.

The other line I'd like to see on Isostar's performance graph would be especially for all the old Stuck-in-the-Dougs like me who want to know what happens when you drink neat water? Don't forget that water-sans-sugary-gunge has the added bonus that you can pour it over your hot face and head.

The final question that bothers me is when, exactly, you drink this beverage? For someone like Dougie here, who hates to dip his hand in his pocket, there's no merit in quaffing the costly stuff after you're finished an event, unless you're so spent you even crawl across to the result board, that is.

Ah, here's the finish line at last. No, I don't believe it: 15 seconds outside my vet's standard. Dear, oh dear. Failed yet again. If I could only lay my hands on that xxxxxx Fiesta driver he'd see stars!
