

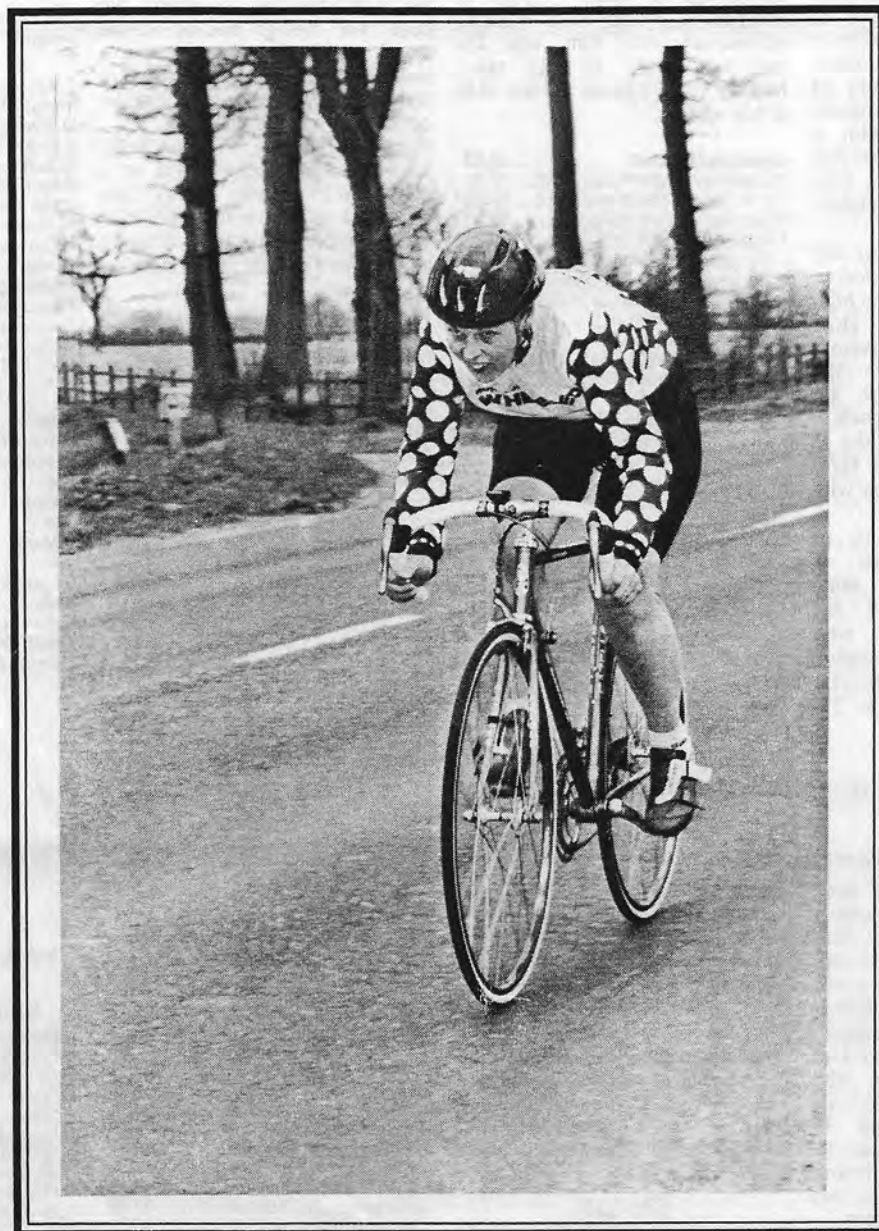

Eddie's Demo win in Oxonian CC '25' as John Pritchard is 'DNS' Sunday 4th April F13.

Enthusiasts were denied the prospect of another John Pritchard v Eddie Adkins return match as the first named of the two former national champions and competition record holders at the distance failed to start in Sunday's Oxonian CC '25'.

With young Ceri like his father 'DNS', it was nearly all bad news-as new VC Bad team member Eddie gave a demonstration of his style and strength as only he knows how on his local course, powering around the A41 Aylesbury-Bicester stretch of the A41 in 54.03. on a morning when only half a dozen could beat the hour. Eddie had the added luxury of taking the Vets prize on standard, his Plus 13-57 giving him a slender 3-sec advantage over Nth Bucks RC's Len White, a man more accustomed to standard victories.

In the absence of the Bio RT father and son duo, it was left to some new names to figure high on the result board. High Wycombe's Neil Coventry followed a 21.01 '10' the previous weekend when he got within a minute of John French in the Luton Arrow '10', and a Sunday 55-minute '25' on H25/13b, by taking second place with a fluent 57.50.

Seventeen-year-old Tim Cox of Hemel Hempstead with a previous best 59 on the same course, gave experienced Ian Brazier, Verulam CC, who started a minute ahead at number 20 a shock, finishing just over half a minute to the good in 59-06.

This scooped third prize, fastest junior ward and Tim also led former Tour de France rider Bob Addy (1.00.18) and Ian Garbutt to a Hemel team win.

In fourth place was Mike Harrison, Royal Sutton CC, whose 59.33. from a start at number 72 (with nine minutes allowance) saw him add the handicap prize to his tally, leaving some 52-and 53-min men in his wake.

The light breeze aided the riders over the first rolling 10 miles towards South Molton. There was then a crosswind as the road climbed mostly upwards to Blackmoor Gate before the downhill rush back to Barnstaple was tempered by a, by now, frisky headwind.

The minor placings went to visitors, Richard Clements lost out by 6 seconds to Guy Lawton whose visitors status should soon disappear as his current posting is the cornish RAF station of St Mawgan

Once again the North Devon club put on a faultless promotion around the southern edge of Exmoor which deserved better support from other South West clubs.

He has gone faster on this course which is more sporting than fast, but a cold bright morning slowed down most competitors.

Just recovering from a heavy cold that had stopped him from sleeping properly for nearly a week had not helped Lee.

He was unwilling to blame the cold for being behind Clive Brooks (VC Camelot) in recent events. "Clive is absolutely flying, the way he is going he could beat anyone just now."

Former BAR star, veteran Terry Icke (Poole Wheelers) was at a respectful distance. Terry has promised to "give it a go" this year. Simple words but meaning a lot when spoken by a rider of his stature.

Not used to doing things by halves, he will be going for the full BAR distances, making sure that the youngsters don't relax, and frightening any veterans that might be around.

Third placed Neil Woodgate (Bournemouth Jubilee Wheelers) was back and on form, leading his team to victory. He stopped riding early last season after a flying start, finding the pace of training too much to cope with.

"I was at full fitness early season, but I am treating it in a more relaxed fashion this year" he says.

Sounding more mature, he intends to build up for later when it counts.

Fourth placed Steve Brown (Bournemouth Jubilee Wheelers) was not at all happy with the cold weather. "The strength was not there." At 33 a late convert to cycling, he is still experimenting with his training programme, and finds that "there is a fine line between training and over training."

Melissa Kitcher (Poole Wheelers) picked up the ladies prize after Monique Gibson (Bournemouth Arrow) punctured. "I am getting all my punctures in early season." Said Monique.

**Dighton's first Victory for 1993,
Southampton '25'**

The North Hampshire course at Andover which took Clive Brooks (VC Camelot) only 53.52 to cover a week earlier was not so benign when Southampton Wheelers switched their annual 25 there after road works near Ringwood ruled out use of the preferred course in the New Forest, but one who made no complaint about the move was the winner, Gary Dighton (Leo R.C.)

Although he took nearly 31/2 minutes more than Brooks to complete the distance, his effort of 57.20 was fast enough to win the George Olley Trophy, and his first victory of the season was coupled with an invitation to be the promoting club's principal guest at their annual luncheon on November 21.

A morning which broke to show a white frost did not help the early starters despite the 7.30 am. start, but the low temperature had little effect on Andover Wheelers South DC junior B.A.R. William Grainger. Fourth in 57.35 a week earlier, he needed only another forty seconds to cut through the cold morning air, and for half-an-hour his time of 58.15 held pride of place on the result board. Then Peter Pickers (Antelope RT) beat it, by just a second, to lay the foundation for a team win which his club would have achieved without him-the club's fourth man, Matthew Parton, was

only five seconds slower than their third counter-and another forty minutes passed before Dighton, enjoying slightly warmer air but a rising headwind from the turn, settled the issue, a few minutes after his fiancée, Zena Harris (Crabwood CC) won the Anne Childs Trophy as leading lady.

B.A.R. TALK

Chris Ball, current holder of the RTTC Junior BAR.

I'm not sure if you'll want to know about my weekend, since I was in a road race. As I said in an earlier report, after winning the Junior BAR last year, I now feel very much in need of wider race and track experience. I only did one road race last year.

Sunday's race in the Mendips was my first this year and I'm not too pleased to reveal that I packed. It was five laps, each one about 15 miles, and a 10-strong break went away right from the start. In the main group left behind, six people were strong, including me, and the six of us worked well.

The rest wouldn't contribute except when the six of us tried to break clear. They pulled us back time after time, but they wouldn't work to pull the entire field back to the 10-strong lead group. I did so much work that I got cramp at the end of the fourth lap.

I'm learning from the experience though. I felt strong; the speed was there; and on hills I felt good-I pulled away from the bunch on every climb. I guess it's just a matter of time, learning the ropes.

So that was Sunday. I'd had the Saturday off the bike and the previous week was fairly typical for me.

I did 90 miles training on Monday, then Tuesday I put in 20 very fast miles. Wednesday and Thursday I was at work (no miles) and on Friday I did 40 miles, including some hard hills, with Richard Simmons, my 2-up partner, and David Price, a good friend.

We tried to burn David up and on the last two hills we ripped his legs off, which was very unfair as he'd been away in Scotland for a week and had been off the bike completely. Generally though, he needs to put in more miles in and keep away from women.

On Saturday I found I'd been laid off work. I was one of two porters in a hotel and they found there was only work for one so it was either both of us part-time or saying good-bye to me, since I'd only been there a short while.

My hope is to get work coaching gym part-time at the local sports centre here in Warminster.

I did gymnastics for eight years. Starting when I was seven, going right through to 14, and I got to national standard in the Olympic six pieces.

When I started at the hotel two

months ago the lady at the sports centre said there's a place here if you want to come back. So it's fingers crossed. I had a work-out on the pommel horse, floor, vault and rings recently and it's surprising how much of the skill is still there.

I should have taken my coaching exam just before cycling's World Championships, since I opted for the cycling, the gymnastics exam (grade 4) is still to do. I'm going to focus hard on getting that now. I've a road race weekend coming up next, the two day Rockingham Forest event.

The Sunday after that I'm in a 25-mile time trial on the P201 at Boumemouth. I've done the course six times all in all, getting times of 52 and 53 minutes. Last year, the Antelope winner logged a short 50.

This year's bike (so far) is exactly the same as last year.

I got it ready for the start of 1992. I bought the frame, a Dave Lloyd Concept 90 with Reynolds 653 tubing, and built it up myself. Well, I did the easy bits while Dad, Tony, tackled the serious mechanics. He's a kitchen designer by trade (any takers?).

The top tube slopes back 1" to the seat tube and it's the most rigid road bike I've ever ridden.

That said, it will be giving way soon to a Cougar. To three Cougars in fact. We were at the BCF dinner in December and Ritchie (who works for Cougar) came over for a matter. He asked if there was any way Cougar could help.

So there it was, a personal deal. I get a low profile track frame for pursuing, an upright track frame, and a Cougar frame exactly like my Concept 90.

I'm not parting with the well-proven Dave Lloyd bike-after all it got me the club record. It's having a respray and stays firmly in the fold.

When the three Cougar frames arrive they'll go to Pip Brown at Stonehenge Cycles. He's a good friend and he's the one who will be fitting them up.

Have a Sunday by the sea: come on down to Boumemouth and give us a shout.

FEELING BAD AND GOING GOOD.

6.30am. and I begin to wonder what on earth I was doing up so early, the reason soon became apparent. A beautiful sunny morning, albeit frosty and a 30 mile hilly time trial to look forward to.

By 10.21am., the slight breeze of early morning had got up as I was pushed off by the timekeeper. I'm underway and not quite sure of my bearings despite Sue Wrights' early morning tuition. I get into a rhythm but problems soon arise as the gears begin to change automatically. (is this the latest design?)

I'm into the cross wind section and wish that I had used a normal 28 spoke wheel instead of my 4 spoke. I seem to be fighting the front of the bike, my pulse meter which tells me if I'm riding well decides to play up and is reading 89 beats per minute and then 49. Surely not, I'm giving it my all.

I've been catching a few riders including number 20 who shouts 'Come on Beryl.' Has he got my name wrong then the penny drops-I wish I had a sweet to pass up to him.

I feel I'm riding in slow motion at times and hope it's hard for everyone else. Time is flying by and I'm now into the final section, a long uphill drag into a head wind. I'm riding in a 52x18 and toy with the idea of dropping onto the small ring. I decide to push harder on the pedals-not far to go-push, push and then I see the finish line. It's all over. I'm thinking 'that was hard, I really suffered, Have I done well, how far will I be behind the winner?'

The result board shows all, I've won and by 11/2 minutes. I look around and think 'How come I won when I felt so bad?'

Paul Manning talks to Time Trial Weekly

Cannock Cycle Racing Club has been my home since I started cycling in 1989 and introduced me to a diet of local time trials and road races in the ensuing years.

One club member in particular has been the engineer of my success so far, David Fear, an enthusiastic veteran who has dragged me out in all weathers. My main priority for 1993 is getting to Birmingham University, after which anything else will be viewed as a bonus. It is for this reason that I aim to stop racing in mid April after four or five events so I can concentrate on my 'A' levels.

I plan to continue my training with a pulsemeter for up to five hours of level 2 per week, throughout May and June. Riding off my pulse is natural now permitting me to log exactly how my training is progressing.

However, frustration has set in at not being able to use it in anger and check the alterations to my bike, due to the cancellation of my first time trial. My bike has been with me for three years now and with it at 22 1/2" and me at 6'3" I have had to fit a mountain bike seat pin and lower the tri-bars to achieve a better position.
