

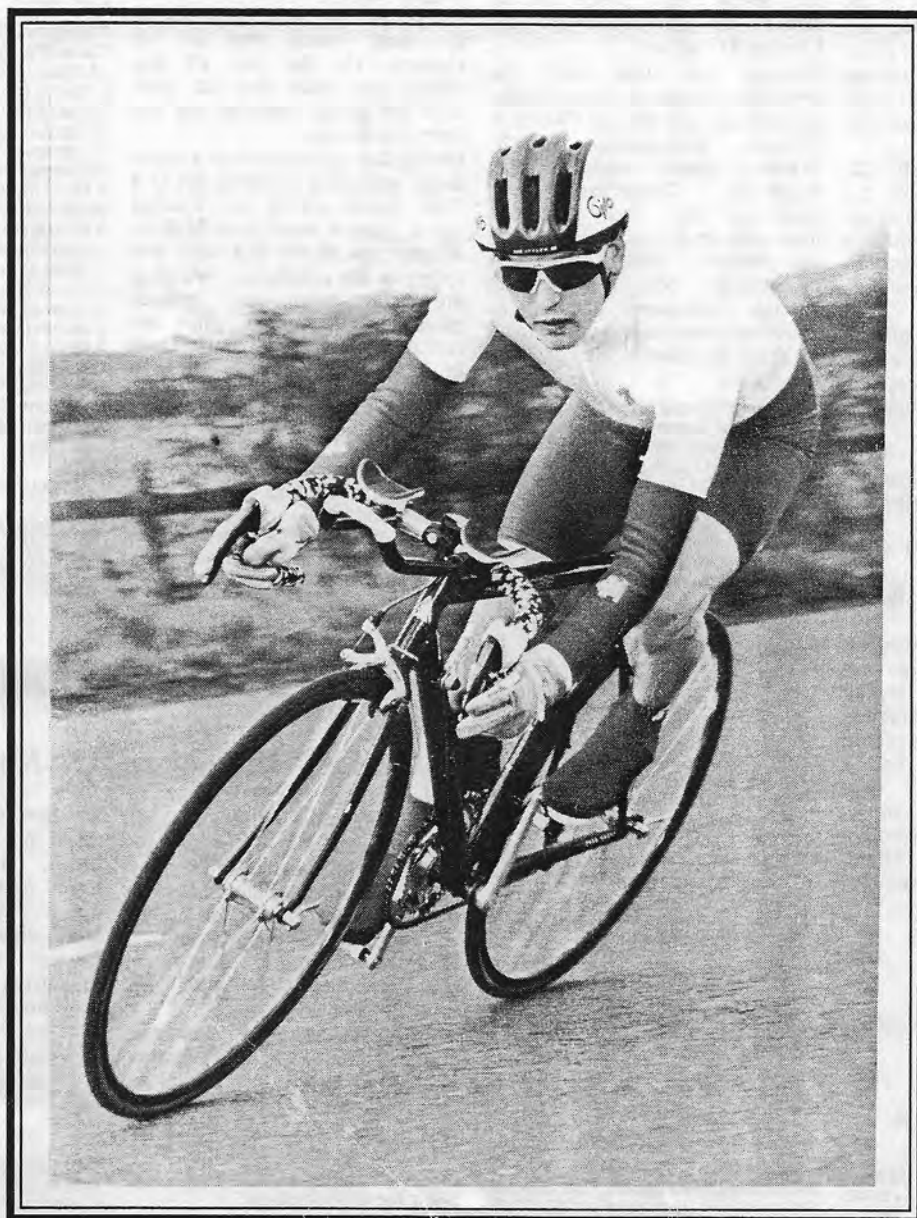

# ROADMAN ON TOP IN WATERY BOURNEMOUTH ARROW CC 10 mile TT WELWYN WHEELERS' HILLY 50 Km. Good Friday 9th April. P31

TOP roadman Andy Lyons overcame continuous rain and slippery roads in Good Friday's Welwyn Hilly 50 km TT, equalling his Olympia Sport clubmate Matt Illingworth's two-year-old event record of 1.11.09. But for going off-course he would certainly have taken this, too, but at the finish he was reticent to estimate his time loss, saying simply "It wasn't a lot really. I had a scare, seeing my minute man coming the other way! I knew part of the course from the Welwyn Hatfield Grand Prix Star Trophy course-but not that bit."

Second was Martin Badell, CC Luton, whose home is on the course. Badell a former member of the promoting club before a couple of years' road racing in France came within 19 seconds of lifting the main prize.

Jez King shrugged off a minute late start penalty, but it wouldn't have made any difference, the Haverhill Wheeler's eventual 1-13-11, taking third place, just ahead of new VC Bad recruit (from St Ives CC) Gary Stevens. Prizes didn't come easy, as Paddington's top junior Alan Gibb and women's winner Ruth Freestone King (Verulam CC) found to their cost, both falling on the treacherous roads.

Another roadman, Kevin Morgan, gave CC Luton fifth place with 1-14-45, and after Chris Badell added to the family celebrations with an outstanding eighth-placed 1-15-35, the Beds club had a clear victory over near neighbours Verulam CC, whose former competition record holder at 25 miles Paul Bennett, winner in 1988, suffered the novelty of being caught.

Inflicting this indignity was another ex-promoting club member, Brian Goff, now in Letchworth Velo colours, and seventh in 1-15-28. Despite the heavy rain, the majority seemed pleased with their times including vet's winner John Steed, Welwyn Wheelers, who at 58 went round in 1-20-45, his fastest on the course. He then decided to run the seven miles home to St. Albans in preparation for the London Marathon!

Coping less well with the conditions, however, were regular prizewinner Ian Brazier (Verulam CC) and outstanding South-Western talent Andy Lyons, Plymouth Corinthian CC, outpaced by his roadman namesake on this occasion. Many complained that it was deceptively cold a frequent enough comment about this excellent promotion, experiencing its third successive year of rainy conditions.

"Terry's back" was the word at the finish of the Bournemouth Arrow CC Good Friday ten miles time trial at Ringwood.

Terry Icke (Poole Wheelers) at 49 has been steadily moving up over the last few weeks, after a season away, and he cleaned up with second place, first veteran and leading the team race.

Admittedly international Paul Rogers finished in front of him, but Paul who keeps super fit all the year round was in his element. On the sort of day where you fetch the cat litter from the garage, because you are sorry for the cat.

During the winter he won a cyclo cross, spreading the field out in a freak storm which left flooded roads. Terry's team mate Melissa Kitcher one of the few who was happy in the conditions. Winning the ladies prize, and looking pleased at the finish, when the rest of the field had disappeared in their cars, with heaters blasting.

Organiser Brian Garrard was despondent, putting up the results in a damp tea tent. "We have only had one good day in eight years, this is the worst weather since I have been organising the event. It has been three bad years in a row."

The figurers of 36 non starters out of a field of 103 spoke for themselves, with only one rider able to show an improvement on the day.

Race favourites Gary Dighton (Leo RC) and Lee Paxton (Salisbury RC) were put off by the icy rain, Dighton loosing time at the tricky turn at Sopley, and not prepared to take any risks at this time of year.

## Alton CC Hilly 31 Easter Monday.

The Easter holiday ended with 61 entrants enjoying dry roads for the thirteenth annual hilly time trial organised by Alton CC on a triangular course based on Privett in eastern Hampshire, and it provided Derek Cottington (Charlottesville CC) with his fourth win in the event.

A puncture victim in his own club's Easter 50 held on similar roads the previous day, he gained over a minute on his nearest rivals to complete the 31 miles in 1.15.17, unaware of just how close the battle ahead of him had been for second place.

Chris Weekly (Tooting BC) set the standard in 1.16.45. and looked visibly relieved when the promoting club's Ian Cargill took another two seconds to complete the course five minutes later, but he lost top spot nearly twenty minutes later when Robert Stimpson (Olympia Sport) Sunday's winner of the Antelope RT hilly 25, pipped him by just three seconds.

By then, Cottington was bearing down on the timekeeper at the finish, removing Stimpson's hopes of a second success in as many days almost before he knew what his own time was.

It was a good day for the organising club who won the team honours, but not so good for last year's winner, Paul Bennett (Verulam CC) he went back three minutes and slipped from first to fifth.

## Charlotteville C.C. Easter 50 win for Malcolm Whitehead in 1hr 56 min's

New names for both the individual and team honours came out on top in Charlotteville C.C.'s Easter 50 at Privett in Hampshire, and behind the winner of the VC Jenner Memorial Trophy the next four also started on the "ten" marks to show that the 90 year old Guildford based club knows exactly how to arrange the starting order for one of the R.T.T.C.'s most prestigious events on the calendar.

Blustery showers and a southerly wind which blew against riders over the last 14.5 miles ensured that Dave Lloyd's eleven year old race record of 1.50.34 was going to stand for at least another season, and nobody came within ten minutes of it until Malcolm Whitehead (VC Deal) at No.70 reached the finish in exactly 1h.56m.

By then a puncture had put paid to the hopes of the promoting club's leading contender, Derek Cottingham, twice a former winner in the 70s, and only another two

of the remaining twenty-one on the programme managed to beat two hours in the difficult conditions.

Les Pick (Icknield RC) took two minutes more than Whitehead to complete the course, leaving Nick Archibald (Gemini BC) the only realistic alternative for victory. He trailed Pick by thirty seconds when he finished fourth a year ago, but though he turned that deficit into a gain of 52 seconds this time that was not enough to deprive Whitehead of a hard ridden success.

## Brighton Mitre CC Hilly 25 mile TT Easter Monday. 12th April

Brighton University lecturer, Mark Jones (GS Stella) made it two out of two when he took just two seconds longer than his winning ride in the inaugural race held on the northern slopes of the South Downs by Devil's Dyke a year ago, but any feeling of satisfaction regarding his consistency was quickly forgotten when he compared his time-1.03.21.-with Ben Goggin (CC Woking Ellersley Builders) who started twenty minutes before him.

Both took full advantage of an excellent morning to plunge down the steep escarpment from the well known Sussex beauty spot as though the devil was after them-Jones was timed unofficially at 50 mph., in this opening mile-but Goggin began to make faster progress and was 38 seconds quicker at three-quarter distance. The next four miles took riders along a part of the long lost Catford "24" course between Henfield and Poynings before the awesome spectre of Devil's Dyke loomed on the horizon.

A south-easterly breeze had softened up all the riders as they approached this "one-in-seven" climb for which Brighton Mitre's energetic organiser, Robin Johnson, recommended a gear of 42 x 21 for mere mortals, but Goggin was almost reduced to a walking role as the gradient took its toll.

By contrast, the Sussex B.A.R. Jones, still retained a little in reserve for this final obstacle and

this enabled him to turn his deficit into victory by the narrowest of margins, just two days after he displayed his all-round racing ability which brought him a popular win in the One Mile Handicap at Portsmouth's Easter Track Meeting.

Though naturally disappointed to have lost by such a close margin, Goggin spoke enthusiastically about the course and promised to be back next year. Jones also plans to return in a bid to make it three out of three.

Although the battle between these two was the major talking point of the race, the winning efforts of junior, Steve Woodbridge (Brighton Excelsior) and veteran, Fred Shepherd (Bognor Regis CC) in their age related categories were worthy of mention, and so also was the well balanced Lewes Wanderers trio whose combined times beat the other four clubs in contention for the team honours.

## Crawley Wheelers Hilly 44.75 mile TT Good Friday.

Most of the 95 riders entered for the two hilly time trials organised by Crawley Wheelers on Good Friday finished before the rain swept across southern England, and they had road works at Handcross to thank for that.

In past years these events have taken the form of a race to Shoreham-on-Sea and back again, but the restrictions on the Brighton Road ruled that course out of contention so the organisers simply pointed riders in the opposite direction and sent them on a 44.75 mile route into Surrey instead.

This alternative, which included parts of several other time trial courses already approved by the London South DC. was just over two miles longer than the original course, but this was readily accepted by the majority, and none more so than Steve Dennis (East Grinstead CC). No stranger to successes in both road races and time trials, he revelled on the rolling course to complete the new distance in 1.47.50. a time which gave him over three minutes on the runner-up, Paul Watkins (34 Nomads CC)

Six minutes after the last man, Dennis, was sent on his winning way, Ken Retallick (Worthing Excelsior) was given starter's order for the veterans race which followed, and, like the first event, this ended with the favourite recording the fastest time. That was Shay Giles (Leo RC Shorter

Rochford Cycles) who proved to be second best overall, in 1.49.27. a time which also gave him second place on standard.

There was no surprise to the winner of that category either. John Woodburn (Antelope RT Radford Accountants) claimed another "best on standard" award, this one by sixty-one seconds, but another noted performer from the past "robbed" by a puncture of this prize was Ken Craven (Crescent CC)-he lost an estimated five minutes changing his defective tyre a few minutes after rain began to fall.

## Antelope RT Hilly 25 mile TT Easter Sunday 11th April. P845

Fastest 25 mile times on entry forms proved deceiving in Antelope RT's hilly time trial on a circuit in the South Downs between Chichester and Petersfield, which ended with the promoting club's Matthew Parton, fastest of the seeded riders in a field of 45, beaten by three lesser men.

His minute man, Robert Stimpson (Olympia Sport Condor Cycles) caught and passed him on the hardest part of the course at half distance on his way to victory, his first of the season, in 1.02.55. The only rider on a disc wheel, Stimpson bases his training on a diet of 200 miles riding to work in London every week. Like the runner-up, David Price (Leicester University CC) he was competing in this race for the first time and liked what he saw, saying "It's a great course," and promising to be back next year.

Price, starting twenty minutes after Stimpson, also had the satisfaction of passing his minute man (John Withey-Addiscombe CC) and attributed his success to a 25 mile training ride hanging on to the wheel of his near neighbour, Chris Ball, three days earlier.

## Laurie Holmes Wins Mirfield CC "10"

The fickle British climate showed just how quickly conditions can change. Saturday had been a warm, sunny, fast day. Sunday dawned with a moderate to fresh, cold Easterly blowing in from the North Sea which brought in low cloud, mist and eventually rain.

So riders faced a cold and overcast start on the A19 between York and Selby. The outward leg was not too bad with some help being provided by the breeze, especially as the course swings West towards Selby but it was a bit of a slog in places coming back.

It was soon evident from the times of the early riders that it was indeed no "flyer". Many competitors were more than 3 minutes slower than their "personals".

Gareth Metcalfe (Otley CC) with 22.32, which made him 4th fastest in the Event, was the only man to beat 23 minutes in the first half of the field. In fact he led the Result Board until No.100, Robble Krygsmann (Goole Vermuyden CC) crossed the line in 22.06 which was second fastest on the day, only beaten by Laurie Holmes (Leeds St Christophers CC) who cracked the 22 minute barrier to record 21.45 and so continue his winning form.

Vince Macklam, off at No.120, assured the Leeds St Christophers of Team victory by taking the 3rd fastest spot with 22.14, father, Jack Macklam already having produced a 24.52.

Fastest Vet was Derek Roe (Morley CC) who, with a time of 23.32, was one of only 8 riders to better 25 mph in the Event - as was Fastest Junior, R.Newman (Askern CC), who returned a 23.23.

Lyn Hanson (Seacroft Wheelers) took the Ladies Prize with a 26.58 ride and Fastest Juvenile was J.Clayton (City Road Club Hull) in 26.49.

## Tour of Breckland. 26.8.mile TTT

Sunday 11th April. BS/2

The combination of overcast skies and intermittent rain showers obviously suited the winning pair, in this, the 25th edition of "The Tour of Breckland", held traditionally on Easter Sunday.

This years' version of the Tour was the same as that used for the first time last year when Zach Carr and James Trenchard (VC Norwich) set a winning time of 1.04.03 but the Leo RC. pair of Taylor and Stapleton gave that a decisive beating to set up a new course record over 2 minutes faster.

Only other team within striking distance of the Leo lads was the composite duo of Geoff Frost, Loughborough Students and Richard Boundy, CC Breckland who in turned in a super ride of 1.02.22. considering that Boundy arrived at the start having just come off shift work in nearby Thetford.

### Belper RC. Mark Storer Memorial Trophy 25 mile TT Sunday 11th April. A25/9

Kevin Dawson (GS Strada) continued his build up for his 1993 campaign with a win in the Belper RC '25' on Sunday. No doubt this ride constituted a good speed session, and forms a link in a much larger chain.

Coming in second was a delighted Chris Myhill (Chesterfield Coureurs) who just held off Birmingham visitor Barry Charley (Stourbridge CC), a mere five seconds separating them.

The event was held in the memory of popular local star Mark Storer, who was tragically killed on his motorbike last year, and it ran along a scenic route following the river Derwent from Belper to Matlock before taking a snapping leg up to Ripley.

With a full field assembled it was local boy Gareth Williams (Belper RC) who made the first impression. Off at number 20 he nimbly peddled to a 1.03.37. to eventually scoop the junior award for the promoting club.

Comeback man Gary Wharton (no45) was the first to dip under the hour. His 59.22. bearing testimony to the fact that it was to be a hard morning.

Despite appearing flat up to Matlock and back, the course is far from it. A number of steady drags and false flats necessitating many wise gear changes, and the valley walls causing head winds both ways, further adding to the effort.

Talented roadman Barry Charley (no65) stamped round in fine style to record a super time of 57.22, despite not knowing the course at all "I just took it as I went along and got stuck in," was his simple assessment, "mind you, I found it a bit chilly. But it was a good workout as I was stuck for events to do this weekend."

Charley's mark withstood the test of time for a good 50 minutes until local man Chris Myhill shaved off five seconds to go top of the leader board.

Myhill was literally riding on his own doorstep (the course went within 100 yards of his house) and he was well pleased with his mornings work. "I think I've beaten Vic Gregory by two minutes," (he was one minute behind Myhill), "so I know I've done a good ride."

He continued "This course is very technical and it's worth knowing when to give it that extra bit of effort. It's great to race this close to home, and it makes up for the nightmare experience I had on Friday in the Buxton Mountain TT."

Myhill didn't expect to win, however, he thought last man off Kevin Dawson to be about a minute up. So it proved when the reigning BBAR stormed over the line to record a fine 55.57; thus christening this new course with a fine record.

However Dawson didn't find it all easy. "It was just so cold, I just couldn't get warm at all," he said sipping a warming cup of tea at the finish.

A man of few words, this win I'm sure will contribute to what will be another fine winning record for the coming season.

### Buxton CC Mountain 32 miles TT Good Friday 9th April J8/3

For the second year running, the Good Friday Buxton Mountain time trial was run off in atrocious, conditions. Heavy rain had covered the roads in puddles and grit, and like last year, visibility on Axe Edge was down to 10 yards.

Despite half of the full field, including last years winner Pete Wheddon (ABC Centreville), deciding that the day was best spent indoors the race still produced a worthy winner and fierce competition; no doubt due to many of the 'names' turning up.

On an otherwise cold day it was John Waddilove (Crewe Clarion) who provided most of the heat to record a superb 1.27.36.-barely a minute off the course record-putting the rest of the field into the shade.

Best of the others was Steve Gibson (Chesterfield Coureurs), three minutes down with 1.30.33. and with the rest of the top ten breathing down his neck.

A scant three minutes covered these riders-a small time gap for this hard mans course where a 20 mph average is an achievement.

Early starter P.Moore (North Wirral Velo) soon settled the matter of the fastest junior with a fine ride of 1.35.24. to give him twelfth place overall. Indeed his time was to hold top spot for 30 minutes until Southern visitor Mike Potter (Weston Wheelers) concluded a well judged ride with a time of 1.33.17; coming after a first lap of 46.27.

However five minutes behind Potter was local boy Waddilove, he had already hammered out a first lap of 43.34 and barely lost any time the second time around to finish with 1.27.36.-well and truly throwing down the gauntlet to all comers.

Fresh from two wins the previous weekend, talented roadman Alan Cooke, moved into second place with 1.31.32. This time was to give him a creditable 5th place.

Having only been half a minute down on the first lap, Steve Gibson was expected to challenge Waddilove. But he slowed significantly to lose a further 2.50 minutes to finish with 1.30.33. After a disastrous 1992 season Gibson is expecting a much better season, last year an infection caught whilst training in Portugal persisted for the whole season, but a return to form over the past few weeks signals the beginning of a new chapter for this Sheffield hard man.

An expected "double whammy" from Chesterfield Coureurs failed to materialise, when one of the race favourites Chris Myhill limped in with 1.33.10. A two hour training ride the previous day took more out of him than he thought; and the weather quite

literally further dampened his spirits. "You wouldn't normally see me dead riding in these conditions," he said "but the £50 first prize tempted me. Never have I suffered so much, for so long for so little!"

Myhill was to finish, for him, a disappointing 8th place-but vowing to return next year.

Waddiloves' time was looking better and better as each seeded rider failed by a long way to oust him. Richard Haigh (Seamon CC) off no 100 had to settle for 3rd with 1.30.58 and Steve Vaughan found the going too tough. His 1.35.28. left him in 13th place and out of the prizes.

Another possible contender, Rowen Smart (Bikesport RT) called it a day after just one lap. The combined effect of spectators and fog proving too dangerous for him. So with Pete Wheddon not starting, John Waddilove safely bagged the £50 first prize and the Springfield Cup. "I thought that I'd have a chance of winning," he confessed "but I didn't expect to win by three minutes. "I am very pleased, everything went right, last year I punctured so this makes up for it."

The circuit is on Waddilove's doorstep, so it was "just like a hard training ride."

Once again the event was excellently organised, with generous sponsorship from Buxton Natural Mineral Water, providing a healthy prize list. It was just a pity that the weather decided not to put on a good show. As many riders agreed, the course is hard enough as it is, bad weather is not needed to make it a hard event.

## B.A.R.TALK

### Stuart Dangerfield talks to Time Trial weekly

Last weekend I rode the St Ives CC 10 on the F1/B, it was my 6th race of the year so far and my 5th win, I recorded a time of 20.16 beating Ian Cammish by 39 seconds, the weather was atrocious, block headwind to the turn and heavy rain. I turned a gear of 53 x 14 and 13 into the wind, and a 53 x 12 on the return, clocking 45 mph in places, rather dodgy on the greasy A1!

I should have ridden a road race next day but I gave it a miss, as since the Porthole GP I have not been recovering from my racing and training and I have a feeling that I have overtrained slightly. My opinion is that everyone is going quicker, earlier in the season, than ever before, so people have trained harder during the winter to get a good start.

Speaking for myself, I think I am going too quick too early, mainly due to the hill climb being so late (Nov 8th) and starting early this year I haven't really lost any form during the winter. I did 1700 miles Nov-Feb plus a 20.55 '10' on Boxing Day, but its nice to know that I haven't got to kill myself to get fit, as its easier to maintain the majority of your form from the previous season, and I believe this makes for more consistent form throughout the following year.

This week I shall only do one hard 2 hour level 2/3 sessions and the rest of the week I shall be low level 2 rides as I'm racing on Good Friday in the Wyre Forest "mountain" 26, lots of climbing! On Monday I ride the Mid Shropshire Wheelers 25 on another course, last year I won in a time of 53.13.

All these early season races are being used as a building block for the championship in June, July and August, firstly the 25, then the 50, where I hope to repeat my bronze medal of last year, or go a couple better!

We have the BCF & RTTC 100 km TTT's in July, when we, the Leo CC hope to win, as we have Graeme O'Bree and Gary Dighton this year to strengthen our team.

The 4000 metre pursuit is also my big aim, as I feel I can win a medal, last year I qualified 4th fastest in 4.53, as I definitely have the speed and a good deal of knowledge, last year I did six 19 minute '10's and four 49minute '25's' plus a 1.42.54. 50 which only Gethin Butler bettered (1.42.05) in the same event. Hugh Porter will be advising me on the pursuit. Also I am eyeing the 10 and 25 competition records.

For 1993 I was put onto the national squad but Doug Dailey doesn't know what events to target me for, TTT or team pursuit/individual pursuit, which is all rather frustrating as at the moment I feel I'm good enough for either but I lack direction, and the worlds are in August, I suppose all I can do is keep doing the rides and getting results.

On the equipment side of things I could write all day as I'm what's known as a "fanatic", this year I will again be using 'Argos' of Bristol riding four bikes, built using Reynolds 753 tubing (the best by far). My 93' hill climb championship bike is still being designed at the moment, it will again be 753 with all titanium fittings, the world awaits!

The Lincoln Wheelers regret the cancellation of the 10 mile time trial on Wednesday May 19th 1993 C10/17 course.

The course has been banned on the instruction of the RTTC National Committee on a complaint by one person who is aggrieved with several members of the Lincoln Wheelers and has conducted a personal and biased campaign against this course and the National Committee have taken his views into account, against the unanimous wishes of the Lincolnshire District Committee.

The object of the C10/17 course was to be the alternative 10 course at Lincoln to take us away from the C10/18 in the summer months, which we consider carries too much traffic round the traffic island turn and has proved to be more dangerous, in the last five years, two riders having had quite serious accidents through being knocked from their machines through no fault of their own. In 20 years of use the C10/17 course has not had ANY ACCIDENTS. It has been used regularly for Club Events and at least on Open Event has taken place every year. We deplore the RTTC National Committees undemocratic illegal banning of this course, without prior consultation and knowledge of the course and we believe that not one member has visited the course. Is this going to be the National Committees Policy to get rid of 'U turn' courses in the future by accepting a biased complaint and then banning the course, because they are losing support for their views on 'U turns' at National Council Meetings.

The Lincoln Wheelers, along with other Lincolnshire Clubs, have promoted efficiently and safely, numerous National Championships in the past but this undemocratic illegal action by the National Committee has destroyed any goodwill between us in the immediate future.

We sincerely apologise to all the riders who support and enjoy their ride on this quiet Lincolnshire road.

**50th Anniversary of the VTТА (1943-1993)**

Ron Blythe (Sheffield Phoenix) promoted in March, an 18km time trial to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Veterans Time Trial Association.(VTТА)

I expect this is the first of a number of veteran time trials designated as 50th anniversary events during the 1993 season.

There can be little doubt, witness the test of time, that Ernie Strevens and his friends of wartime Britain, got it absolutely right with their 'standard' system, that means that veteran riders of 40, have got to be very fast indeed to beat the 60 and 70 plus riders in competitions on 'standard'. As a brief resume', the standard at 25 miles for a 40 year-old is; 1.06.00, and for a 60 year-old it is; 1.16.37. For a 100 mile TT the standards are; 4.54.02 and 5.41.20.

And so, when two 60 year-olds got inside 4 hours for the 100 (Harry Featherstone and Don Hacking), it is obvious that in regards to the VTТА BAR competition, the young lads of 40 haven't really got a chance!

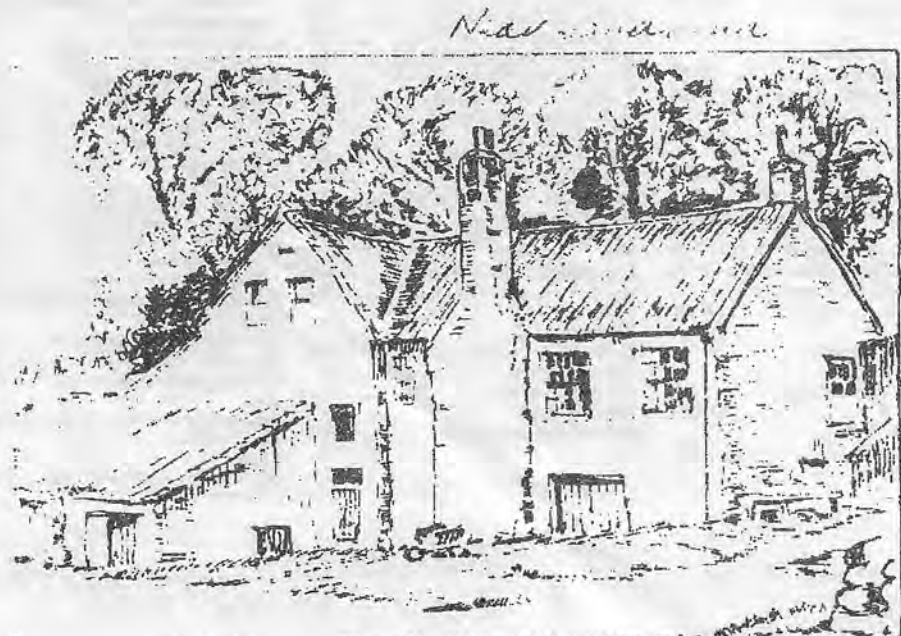
However, members of the VITA seem basically satisfied with the system, even though with a current membership of 4,195 the Secretary reports another drop in membership (4,668 in 1992). Is the VITA losing the younger vets due to them not being able to win the major awards? It is always difficult to satisfy everyone in a sport such as ours, and of course VITA organisers and officials do an excellent job, and as an organiser myself I am well aware how difficult it is sometimes to find the required help for a promotion.

If I have one criticism of VTТА promotions though, it has to be the very poor awards for some of the major competitions! Witness the BAR over '25', '50', '100', and 12 hours. The awards are medals for the 1st, 2nd 3rd overall classification! Once again VTТА members seem satisfied with the awards, even if you need to be 50+ and very rapid indeed to be in with a chance. So, if people are happy with the BAR as it is at present, there is nothing to stop a sponsor introducing an ADDITIONAL championship using the same standards and classification, but bringing in the age related categories now established by the road racing veteran organisation the LVRC (League of Veteran Racing Cyclists). This would mean that categories would be: A40-44, B45-49, C50-54, D55-59, E 60-64, F65-69, and G70+ not forgetting the ladies 8 categories in all.

I would visualise awards (trophies) for the first 10 in each category, and either a national championship jersey or skin suit for the category winners. In fact, to counter the dropping membership in the VTТА, they could well emulate the Continentals and bring in veterans at age 35.

It is also my view, that with changing conditions, that seem to be pushing us off many of our old established courses, the day of the fixed distance 'flat' course may well be on the way out, and radical decisions could well be the order of the day if the sport-generally-is to continue and prosper.

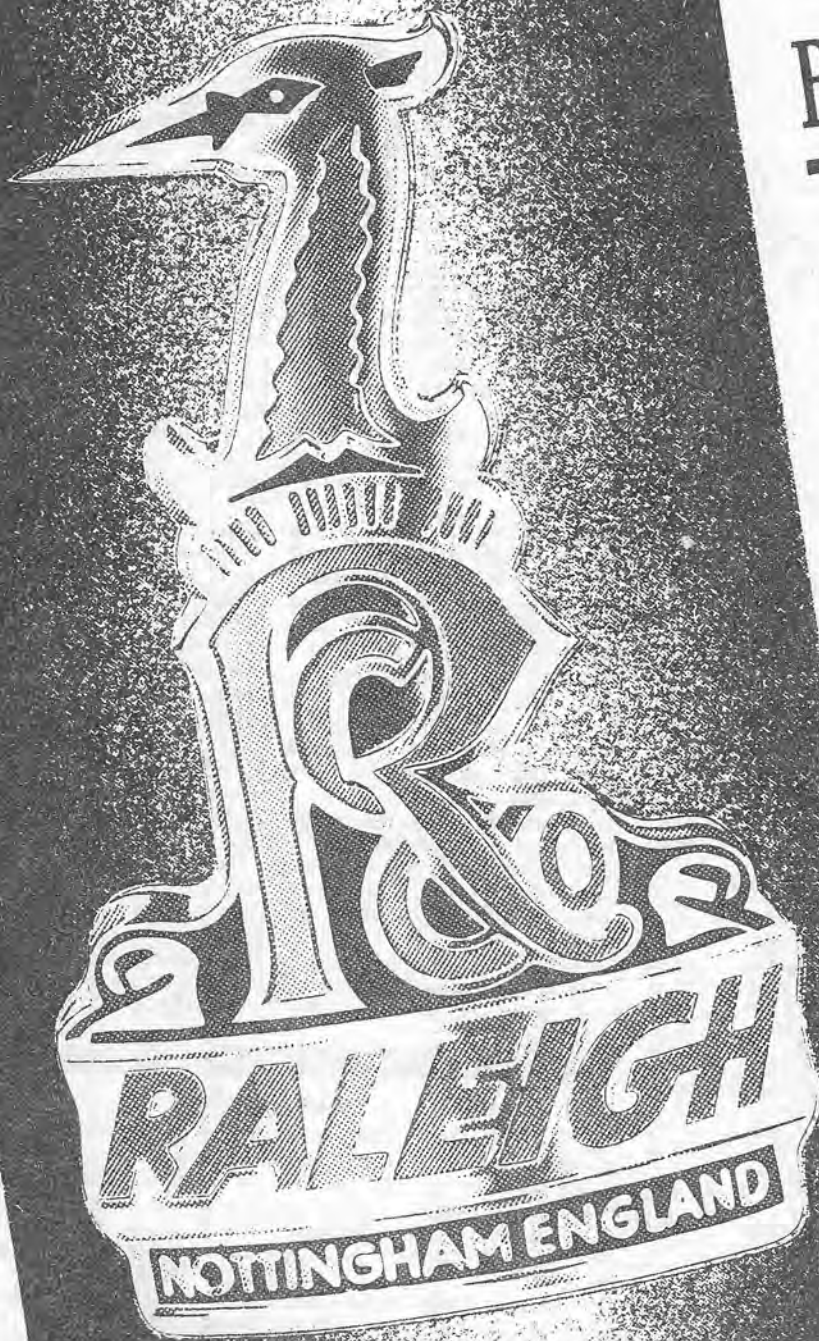
