Isle of Wight Cycling Festival.

Former BBAR Glenn Longland (Antelope RT-Radford Accountants) regained his Isle of Wight cycling crown he lost to Rob Pears (Bath CC) last year when he won two of the three time trials which make up Moreys May Day holiday weekend, and clubmate, Alan Dawson, completed a clean sweep in the veterans class to help the Southampton based club win the team prize again, but only after Steve Elms (East Grinstead CC) took the honours on the opening day.

The Sussex all-rounder set the record for the new 9.3 mile course in the middle of the island - a replacement for the less popular hill climb out of Shanklin used in previous years - when he swept round the undulating circuit on a sultry evening in 22.06. to beat Longland by four seconds.

That was not the only surprise either. Longland's club was found to be second best when the island's new short distance star, Chris Salter of the promoting Vectis Roads CC beat Pears by three seconds to finish third and lead his club for the team prize, but Sunday's results were more predictable, with Longland gaining over a minute on Pears to take the overall lead, decided on placings, by one point after Elms dropped to third.

Salter and Simon Foster (North Notts Olympic) were the only other two to complete the hilly 24 mile course inside the hour, but Dawson finished only three seconds outside this standard. The fresh north-westerly wind which kept the sky clear of cloud through-out the day moderated in time for the third sunny day, but any doubt that either Elms or Pears might topple Longland from the top of the leader board were soon dispelled in the final event, the 52 mile Tour of the Island.

Though the route of this course now avoids the very hilly south-east coast line of the island there were plenty of leg aching climbs on little used roads elsewhere, and the comparatively unknown Princelett Shute near Sandown, followed by a roller-coaster run into the wind towards Carisbrooke in the first ten miles, were sufficient for Longland to extinguish any threat posed by his rivals.

Last but not one to start in a field of 84, he was over two minutes faster than anyone else when he passed the halfway point near the western extremity of the course at Freshwater Bay, and he continued to gain with the wind on his back along Military Road to Chale before sweeping past no fewer than five lesser mortals on the long twisting climb overlooking Blackgang Chine.

The top of that breath-taking hill brought him within ten miles of the finish at Godshill which he reached over 5.1/2 minutes faster than Yorkshire visitor, Phil Barlow (Kiveton Park CC) another regular festival competitor whose knowledge of the scenic course helped him to improve to a second placing at the expense of Ray Hughes (Clarence Wheelers).

The latter, making his first racing visit to the island after attending the Vectis Roads CC dinner as principal guest in January, made up for his disappointment on Sunday when a puncture wrecked his hopes of a high overall placing. Women's "End to End" record holder Pauline Strong (Crabwood CC) was one of several other puncture victims on roads which lack the smooth surfaces of mainland courses, but though that obviously delayed her once she was well beaten by fellow international, Clare Greenwood (Cardiff Byways RCC) another island "regular" who was a clear winner of the lady's prize on all three days.

Although Pears climbed into the Bath mini-bus afterwards without the overall victory he won last year, his club did provide the junior winner in Chester Hill; like Dawson and Greenwood, he completed a hat-trick of wins in his age group.

Although Antelope RT won the lion's share of the prizes some of Vectis Roads CC's 36 competitors kept several awards on the island and after the race director, Paul Lee, conducted the final prize presentation Morey's managing director, Peter Gould, one of nearly 1,000 riders who took part in Sunday's randonnee round the island, promised his company will be supporting the festival again next year.

Eric Marsh sets standard in Hillingdon Vets 25.

There was disappointment when the prospect of a John Pritchard-Eddie Adkins return match on the new H25/2 Handy Cross 'skislope' came to nothing after car problems ruled out the Bio RT rider from Sunday's Hillingdon CC Vets'25'. But this was compensated for by a great battle for victory on age standard.

After Eddie, now in VC Bad colours, had powered around in 52.21, just 16-sec short of Pritchard's time in the Marlboro event a week earlier, to beat second-placed Paul Bennett (Verulam CC) by over 4 minutes on fastest time, attention switched to the more senior representatives of the time trialing art to see who could achieve the best plus.

With 80-years-young Jim Sibun, like the majority of the field of 93 unable to find their best form in cold, windy conditions,, recording 1.12.15 for a 16 min 39 sec plus, it was clear that top honours would, unusually, elude the Willesden CC man.

In all, three riders in their 60s beat Jim this time, with Eric Marsh, Hainault RC, at 63, first in 59.15, which yielded a plus of 19.05. This was 10 seconds too good for Norwood Paragon's past VITA BAR Harry Featherstone's 57.42 at 60, and relegated that great name from the '50s and '60s, Ken Craven, Crescent CC, to third place after a typically stylish 59.46. at 61 gave him a plus of 17.46.

Jim Sibun's time earned him fourth position just ahead of the two former competition record holders, Paul Bennett (plus 16.10) and Adkins himself (15.39).

Handicapper Ron May, had to give way to insistence from organiser Bill Gladwin and his team (who ran the usual impeccable Hillingdon promotion) in giving himself an

allowance, the resulting 1.04.28. off 17.30 min, tying for first place with Jim Mephram, Verulam CC's 1.00.38 (off 13.40) for a net 46.58.

In the women's race, Gary Dighton's fiancée, Zena Harris (Crabwood CC) gave further indication of outstanding early season form with a fine 1.00.38 to win the Cis Webster memorial trophy.

Roberts wins from French visitor Legris

Peter Roberts, Plymouth Corinthians CC., took his first victory, but surely not his last, in an open time trial in winning this Mid-Devon CC promotion on a bright but blustery day.

Roberts has been gradually creeping closer to the top spot in successive weeks and well deserved this victory.

The North West wind blew across the A38 and made it difficult almost all the way to the turn and not too easy in some sections on the way back.

Robert's chief challenge came from an unexpected quarter for the runner up was Benoit Legris. He was one of a septet of French riders over for a social and racing weekend with the promoting club-in fact the twentieth anniversary of this regular twinning between the Mid-Devon and the Velo Club du Bocage.

Legris made no concession to British time trialling fads-no tri-bars, disc wheel, funny frame etc. He rode a conventional road bike with a great deal of raw aggression.

The junior award went to Alex McGrath by seven seconds from Dave Bentley, Wellington Wheelers. McGrath's prize ended a rough spell when he lost two previous prizes. One due to a disqualification and then a late start. For a change the vet's on standard ride went west of the Tamar. Mike Venner was one of only two vets to beat 24 minutes. The other being 'Young Man' Alan Brimcombe who was tenth overall.

Marie Purvis Manx Viking Whs 10 & 25 Mile Champion talks to Time Trial Weekly

Manx Mountain Time Trial. After seven consecutive weekend trips to England, I am at home this week-end and looking forward to riding in the Mountain Time Trial. This, of all the time trials I take part in, is my favourite.

But first I have the Wednesday night 10 to compete in, the league has started this week and everybody is keen to push themselves to the limit.

By Manx standards it is quite a fast course, my record stands at 23.10, set in 1991, and I hope to go under 23 this year. Unfortunately tonight is not the night, a tail wind out, but it is very heavy on the way back. I am trying a new pair of 3 spokes out made by TVT, and they feel very fast, I think I am in for a fairly good time, but as the finish line gets nearer I realise I was wrong and record 23.54 for fastest lady and sixth place overall. I am disappointed with my time. The winner has recorded 22.59 so perhaps it isn't too bad after all.

Straight after the 10 I get changed and ride for 1/2 hour behind the scooter at a steady pace, its OK on the flat, but when we hit the drags my muscles are screaming for mercy -why do we push ourselves through so much pain-as the old saying goes, "no pain, no gain".

Thursday sees me riding for 2 hours at level 2, my legs are still hurting from last night, and I am looking forward to tomorrow which is a rest day.

Saturday I go out for 2 1/2 hours including a Cafe stop, its a social ride, and I really enjoy the easy

pace and general 'chit chat' amongst fellow cyclists.

Sunday morning has arrived, its pretty cold outside and whilst warming up I decide to ride in my longer length shorts, arm warmers, overshoes and gloves, at the end of the event I know I had made the right choice; the mountain is cold at the best of times.

For the first time ever I have a schedule on my stem, and with 20 seconds to go I push the stop watch button on my pulse meter- nothing happens- and I remember the memory bank is full, which stops the clock from running. I have no time to think as I am pushed off, and race down Bray Hill. Its such fast start no time can be wasted.

As I get settled down I'm cursing about not, having any idea of what time has elapsed. I always have my stop watch running and feel very lost without it.

I'm into the first tough hill and selected the right gear ride up at a good pace, 9 miles have past and the next 14 miles are mainly flat, they take you into Ramsey and if you get there in, in less than 60 minutes you are in for a decent time, that is what I had scheduled for, and as I round the corner my husband shouts '61.1/2 mins'

I had started with the intention of going for a record standing at 1.41.36. which I set in 1991, but as I near the time I realise it is now out of reach, but I am very determined and realising as I start to climb the mountain, that it's a tail wind, I do not give up hope.

From sea level at Ramsey to where the road flattens out on the

top of the mountain, its seven miles, this is my favourite part. Selecting the right gear and riding smoothly as the road climbs higher and higher. Once at the top its onto the 52 ring and pushing a big gear, its a cross wind over the top and then tail down the long descent. Its such an exhilarating feeling and with my 52x12 my legs are spinning like mad, a short sharp climb and then downhill again before swinging into the last mile, which is flat. As I finish I wonder what time I have recorded, and by the time I've turned and arrived back at the finish line, I realise from the result board I've done 1.41.27.- nine seconds off my ladies record.

I also finish third overall just under two minutes down on the winner, and 25 secs. down on second place- it was a good time especially as it wasn't record breaking conditions.

Afterwards somebody gives me some split times and at the start of the climb I was in 4th place, over 1.1/2 minutes down on the two men in 2nd and 3rd place- by the top I had moved into third spot, and pulled over one minute back on the two male riders, so I was very pleased with my climbing and also my descending as being quite light, I sometime lose out coming down the mountain.

Afterwards I got changed and with John (my husband) and a few lads, ride 10 miles out to a cafe for tea and toast, and potter back. I've got 60 miles in my legs and enjoyed everyone of them

My new bike was ready on Friday 2nd April and I was racing the following day in the St Ives CC '10'. I went out on it for a ride Friday evening and made some adjustments to it.

I was a little bit worried that I had not spent enough time on the bike before my first race. However I need not have worried because I came away from the event with a personnel best. That gave me a lot of confidence for the rest of the month, ending with a personnel best for 25 miles in the Icknield event on the F1 on the 24th.

I am off to Belgium this weekend to do two road races on the 1st/2nd May, I am looking forward to it but I am a little bit nervous as it will be my first time outside England as well. It happened very quickly last week, I was away on an out of bounds course with my work and there had been a phone call at home asking if I would like to go. When I got back the following weekend I phoned them back for the details.

The next few days were very hectic because I had to get my BCF Licence endorsed for racing abroad, that meant I had to get one of those little passport photos to put on my licence. (Funny how you always look like a villain in those photos). Then I had to get a passport sorted out, that also needed another little photo. Then I found out I could not lock of my gears over there as I do over here for junior races. So it was panic stations trying to get a 15 straight through cassette to fit my wheel. I could not get one, but my local cycle shop have leant me a wheel for the weekend. I think everything is now sorted out. I am hoping it will give me some useful road racing experience going over there.

May is quite busy for me again, I have seven time trials and four road races, apart from the two races in Belgium. The one I am looking forward to is the Oxford University '25' on the H25/13B at the end of the month, I am hoping I can lower my 25 time in this event.

That was some weekend. It was the Eastern Counties Festival, which involved me taking part in road races on both Saturday and Sunday.

On Saturday, I was the fourth lady to cross the line. There were 50 entries for this a 30 mile race that was open to both women and vets. Sunday saw us in the saddle for 50 miles, the competition coming from third cats and juniors and here I came home in the bunch.

I'm feeling fit. Shaftesbury CC has had two mid-week club time trials so far this season and I've been third overall in each of them, my times being 25.48. and 25.47, the second time being achieved on a rather windy night.

We ride the E83 course, which isn't particularly fast and the winner clocked 25.39 so if I could only add another nine seconds I'd collect a first place. That's definitely a target for

the season, though there's a bunch of young lads of a similar age to myself who are also aiming to burst onto the scene, so it won't be easy.

Last summer I did all 20 of Shaftesbury's evening 10 mile time trials my best figurers being 26.30 so I'm already going faster. This year it's all or nothing!

I'm starting to draw up a plan for the summer. I've got entries in for the ladies national 25 mile championship in Andover and for the ladies national 10 mile championship.

I'm 16 years old, so I'm also looking for events that should give me fast times in the women's junior BAR. To defend my title I need two good 25 mile results, and two good 10's.

As you'll gather from this, the priority in June and July will be time trialling.

However, track racing also fits into the plan.

First, there's the Womens Cycle Racing Association (WCRA)

championship on the Welwyn track. I've never been there, so I've got some practice sessions at Welwyn written into my training schedule.

Second I'll be lining up at the national championship at Leicester at the end of July.

My coach, Jackie Harris of Team Haverhill, says things are going well. I've just had my training plan from her for the coming month, it runs up to the national 25 mile championship in June, and there's no shocks.

As in the April plan, May sees a lot of Level 2 work, but now the number of time trials are on the increase- the club 10's on Wednesday nights offer a bout of Level 3/4.

A typical week would be ease up on Monday, hard training Tuesday, the club 10 on Wednesday, hard at it again Thursday, ease up on Friday, and racing over the weekend.

These road races I've been in have certainly taught me a thing or two about riding in the bunch- my verdict

to date is that women are worse than men!

Since you last heard from me, I've taken part in the WRCA 4-day event, where teams were racing from countries such as Holland, Russia and Norway. It was held in Suffolk. I certainly learnt about riding again the day after: I felt awful on the second day, while the third and fourth days got better.

Serious training doesn't bar me from savouring Dad's specialities (he's a chef), you'll be pleased to know- they're great to come home to after a hard bout of cycling. No, you can't have his address!

IN DAYS OF YORE.

I was out at an event recently and was casting my eyes over the younger cyclists present, both spectators and riders.

I could not help but admire their machines and equipment; their clothing, dark glasses and helmets. A veritable kaleidoscope of colour. I did wonder if some of them really knew the origins of the logos on their jerseys. Particularly because I remember an incident some time ago when a young enthusiast, wearing a jersey with an exotic name blazoned all over it, was asked if he knew what it represented. His face fell when, having proudly announced that it was a famous French cycle manufacturer, he was gently advised that it was the name of a company making coffee percolators.

My mind wandered back to my early cycling days in the 1930's and the sort of things you would see at an event then. Clothing for the racing men was tights and alpacas you had to be completely clothed from head to foot in black. The thought of tights helped me once when, at school, I had to tell the difference between stalagmites and stalactites. It was easy-----tights always hung downwards.

Perhaps the place to really see the state of the time trial game in its embryo stage was at the start of a Novices 25. Remember, I am talking about pre RTTC days,

when the rules and regulations of the old Road Racing Council were presented in a much slimmer version of today's RTTC handbook. One feature was that unattached riders could ride in Novice events. One event that always sticks in my mind was that of the Withington Whs'. It started in a lane near Monks Heath, went out via Chelford and Laundry Lane, turned in the road on the A.50 and returned. As an aside Laundry Lane was eventually officially designated Goughs Lane. Can anyone reveal how and by whom it was called Laundry Lane? Seven Sisters at Toft was easy because there were seven beech trees there, and Brickhouses fork between Sandbach and Arclid was easy because there were two brick houses there. But where was the laundry?

However, back to the start and the young hopefuls. What a motley crew they were. An attempt at conspicuous clothing was usually a dark woollen jersey and dark trousers held up with trouser clips. The bicycle could be a hybrid roadster with dropped handlebars, a free wheel and a gear of undetermined ratios. Heavy wired on tyres and a bell.

Many of them had no idea what they had taken on. They had ridden out from home and were already tired, and some were stiff with cold having slept under a hedge wrapped up in a cape.

A lot of them started like bats out of hell and usually foundered in a few miles. There was a nasty little rise near Marthill and some would get off and walk it. Those who had mechanical trouble, and there were plenty of them, would have to walk back for there were no sag wagons or support cars. Those who got to the turn had immediate problems for some of them could not turn a bicycle round in the road; they got off and walked round. Some could only do it on a left hand turn and would frighten the life out of the checker when he realised too late that the rider was coming from an unexpected direction.

Quite a lot did get back to the timekeeper. The times were varied to say the least, but one or two would get near or just inside evens. They were usually the ones who had some experience of club cycling.

It seems amusing now, all these years later, but it must be remembered that it was all deadly serious, and there was nothing else. If you wanted to get somewhere you went on a bicycle. None the less, out of some of these novices came some very good riders in future years.

When the event was all over, the crowds and riders would drift to Mrs.Hibberts. She and her husband (always referred to by her as Hibbert) had a semi detached house on the Chelford road. She supplied cups of tea. I forget what she charged but it

was only pennies, but collectively it brought in a satisfactory little income. The garden, the front room, the kitchen (where the lucky ones could get a wash if they could find the room) and the path leading down from the road was a heaving mass of cyclists whose bicycles were propped up anywhere and everywhere. Eventually they would all go home except for those who were strong enough (or who thought they were) who would go, on the club run. Mrs.Hibbert would be left to clear up, after which she would be left in peace for another week.

And so my mind comes back to the present day and with it the almost unbelievable contrast of the times. I doubt if you could convince the modern generation of how it all was. Whatever the reaction today I can assure you they were hard but happy times.

Finally, the story of one competitor riding round on an errand boys carrier bicycle still persists today, and whilst every one will give you a knowing look when the point is raised, no one will admit outright that the story is completely without foundation.

CC Breckland.

Although mainly cast in the category of a time trial orientated club Cycling Club Breckland have, over the last few years, become more and more involved in both promoting and taking part in Audax events.

Colin Williams, a keen Audax rider, persuaded the club to promote its first venture in this sphere in 1991 which attracted, much to the delight of both Colin and the club, an entry of about 100 riders from all over the country.

In the same year Terry Jennings, at that time an entomologist working in Thetford Forest, worked out two routes, both mainly off road, of 50 and 25 miles in and around the Forest called the Thetford Forest Extravaganza. Again both Terry and the club were well pleased with the entry of around 120 on a dull, typically misty November day.

Sadly Terry, although still working for the Forestry Commission, has moved into another post in the Midlands. Before his move however Terry, in co-operation with Forest Enterprise, set up another similar event in October 1992. For this the event was advertised in the leaflets available from tourist outlets in the area, riders had the use of the new Forest Centre at Santon Downham, near Brandon, and included in the entry fee was a refreshment pack for riders on their return provided by the caterers employed by the Forestry Commission. David Baker, rapidly being bitten by the Audax bug, stepped into Terry's shoes to make sure the routes and check points were sign posted and marshalled as well as dealing with all the paperwork resulting from an entry of 233 riders keen to sample the 10,25 and 50 mile routes.

Colin, meantime had not been resting on his laurels, and for his second Audax event in April 1992 had worked out routes in North Norfolk of 200, 150 and 100 Km on road and 25 and 70 Km off road using parts of the Peddars Way. This attracted 250 riders of all ages and abilities.

This April Colin, in the club's third North Norfolk and Roman Roads Audax, offered riders a choice of 200Km Randonee or 100 Km Populaire on road and using Peddars Way and the Icknield Way, 50 and 100 Km off road route. Obviously a winning formula because in spite of heavy rain before and for some time after the start at 8am. over 330 riders set off to enjoy the Norfolk countryside.

David Baker is branching even further out this year, in addition to promoting the joint Forest Enterprise-CC Breckland Audax again in October, he had worked out routes starting from

Taverham on the outskirts of Norwich-the on road Norfolk Mills 150Km and Tudor Tour 100Km and, to cater for the growing call for off road riding, two off road routes of 75Km and 40Km using parts of Marriots Way, a disused railway line, on Saturday 26th June.
