

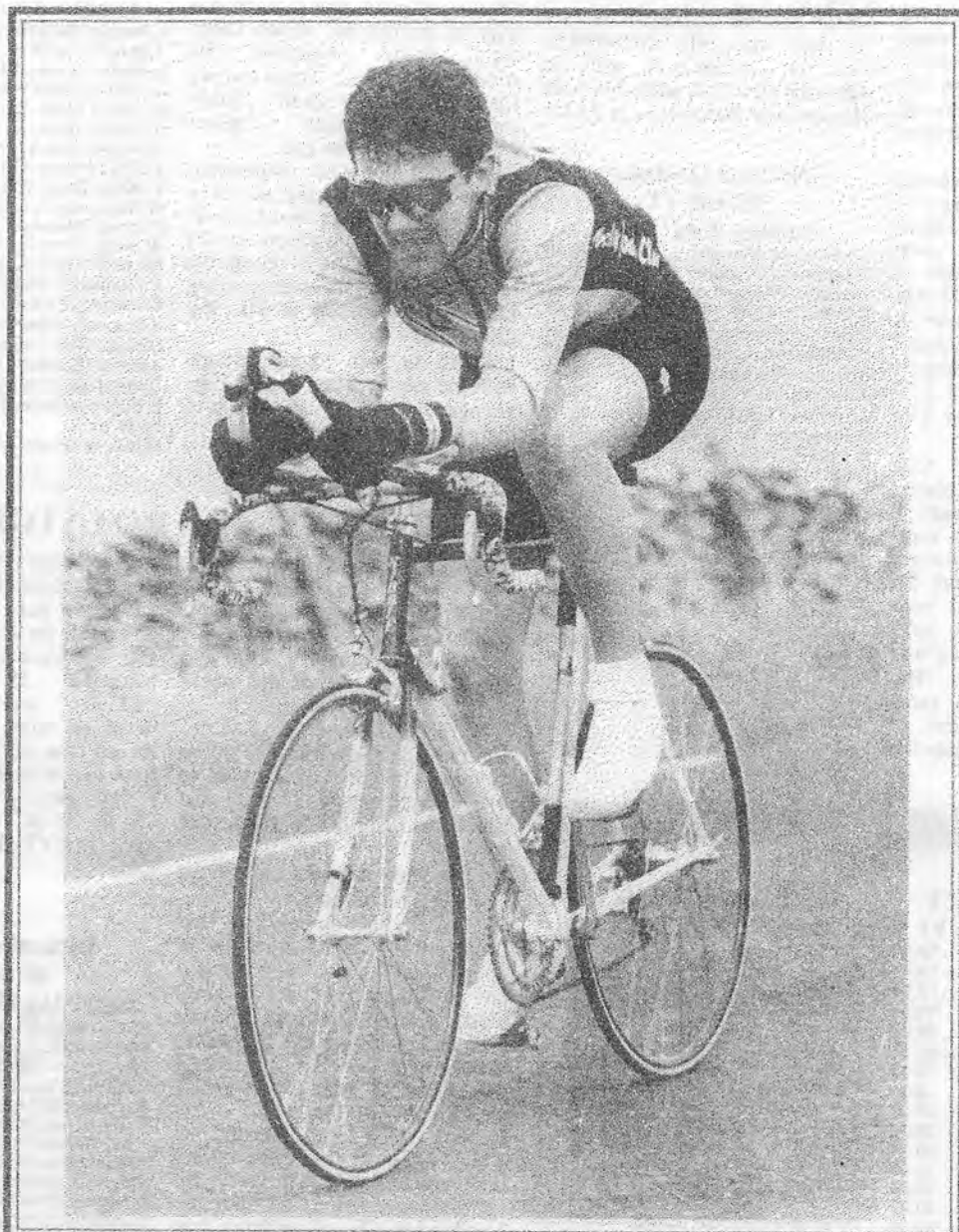

Silver's gold in Norlond Combine'10'

VC Slough's promising young allrounder Phil Silver got back in the winning groove in Sunday's Norlond Combine '10', turning the tables on clubmate Dave Creese who had beaten him by two seconds in the previous day's Barnet CC event, with the only 20-minute ride of the morning. The margin was 49sec. some of which was explained by the fact that the country's fastest veteran, who had himself improved seven seconds in the Barnet event when both he and Silver beat the 30 mph barrier, was baulked by a lorry at the turn, and a sharp application of brakes resulted in him cancelling the time on his computer, which was showing just over nine minutes at just over 5 miles!

Phil Silver was more pleased with his ride than he had been by a personal best 19-minute return the previous day. "So far, when I've managed to get inside a target, I've been able to establish the new level as a sort of base. It was like it when I didn't think I could beat a 23; but once done, I seemed to be able to hold it. I just hope it's the same now I've done a 19" he said.

J.Wedge (Whitewebbs CC) impresses with a third placed 22.16 denying VC Slough a 1,2,3. by just edging out third team counter Richard Cosford, whose short 20 the previous day had resulted in an exact 1 hour team aggregate, beating a 1979 club best, which, in its time was competition record. The consolation was that the same trio's winning Norlond time of 1.04.26, was still 4 sec. inside the

old club record, and maintained their 'win a week' 1993 record. Former 25-mile record holder Paul Bennett (Verulam CC) would know his way blindfold over this course which, in various forms, he has been competing on for some 35 years. His speed is little blunted, however, as an outstanding 22.34 for fifth place showed.

Many entrants were doubling the Norlond and Barnet events, among them John Cornillie, Unity CC's sponsor and National Junior 25-mile Champion exactly 25 years ago, who followed a short 21 on Saturday with an eight-placed 23.02, while his wife Margrit, was fastest lady in 25.49

Paxton's East Dorset '50' by 2min plus, Icke 7min's clear of third man

A rising headwind on the return leg and a warm morning sorted out the men from the boys, in the East Dorset CA 50 mile time trial at Ringwood.

Lee Paxton (Salisbury RC) and Terry Icke (Poole Wheelers), late starters were in a different race to the rest of the field. A sign of star quality in time trials, is to be able to keep going at near to normal speed whatever the weather conditions.

Riders with the experience of Paxton and Icke appear to have a built in metronome which keeps them going whatever the conditions. Which often works against them under super conditions, when lesser performers close the gap. Paxton has done his preparation this year, and has the air of a man who is due to move up on last year's sixth position in the BAR. That is if he is given the opportunities which were missing for him last season at his best distances.

Icke at 49 was happy enough with the gap between him and the younger man. "If I can keep it to that, I am doing alright" he said.

Behind the first two, Steve Brown (Bournemouth Jubilee Wheelers) and Mike Ashurst (New Forest CC) were having their own private duel. Both as keen as mustard, and it is going to continue through the season.

The advantage likely to go to the younger man, Steve Brown who is just beginning to fine his feet in open events after having made his mark within the club.

Andy Wilkinson, the amazing Port Sunlight Wheeler from Wirral, is delighted with his latest acquisition-the Dave Lloyd Rotator revolutionary bike-and put it to good use at the week-end.

A personal best of 1.52.24. to win the Ellesmere Port CC 50 on Sunday at Broxton was added to Wilko's victory in the Birkenhead North End 10 the day before.

So just what is special about the new Lloyd concept?

First of all, nobody can deny that Dave Lloyd knows what he is doing when it comes to going fast on a bike. He is currently working seven days a week at his bike building business in Neston, Wirral and reckons his latest production is more than a bit special.

He has called it the ROTATOR which refers to the shape of the body and admits it will take a bit of getting used to-as did the Lotus when Chris.Boardman first tried it out. But Andy Wilkinson says he gets more used to it each time out and the future looks bright for the popular National 24 hour champion and End to End record holder.

He surprised a lot of people-but not those who appreciate his talent-when he said he would be concentrating on the National 25 this season!

The Dave Lloyd bike was built with that target in mid. Imagine Dave's shock when he heard that

following his satisfaction with the new machine in events so far "Wilko" has now decided he will ride the Anfield 100 on it and the week after he rides the National 25. Mind you, "Lloyd" can't criticise since when he won the Anfield in a record time of 3.47.10 in 1982, a time that still stands, he went on 6 days later to win the National 25 in 53.34. As Wilko might say..."ANYTHING YOU CAN DO..."

Rob Hayles sets standard on new course

Rother Valley CC 25 mile TT
Ten years after the building of the M.25 brought 25 mile time trials to a close on the A.3 in Surrey, Rother Valley CC raised the curtain for racing on the Portsmouth Road again, on a brand new course made possible by the opening of the Petersfield By-Pass in Hampshire, and to mark the occasion this young but enterprising club put up a first prize of £100 with no strings attached.

"We wanted to attract some of the leading riders from the London area," explained one club official, but though this financial carrot attracted a full field-some thing it never achieved when organising the same event on other courses in previous years-the money did not leave the county.

Rob Hayles (Team Haverhill Taylors Foundry) was the man responsible for holding the purse in Hampshire. Sixtieth to start, he raced to his fourth success of the season against the watch with a time of 53.31s. to establish the first record for the dual carriageway course which should appeal to other 25 milers looking to improve their times.

"It was hard going out (a light breeze from the east accounted for that) but I went well coming back," said accounted at the finish.

"It seems all right to me," observed Harry Featherstone (Norwood Paragon) the best veteran on standard, by exactly one minute from John Woodburn (Antelope RT). Lesser men felt the gradual climbs were some 200 yards too long for comfort, and others made similar observations in keeping with their states of fitness, but no one complained about the presence of other vehicles on the road. Traffic remained light for the duration of the race and though district council committee members were noticeably absent they should be reassured to know that the crews of two police cars on patrol were quite happy at the way competitors conducted themselves.

Apart from Hayles, all but one of the other top ten placings were filled by riders from outside the area. Though needing over a minute more than the winner to complete the distance, Steve Elms (East Grinstead CC) was just a little too quick for Clarence Wheelers two 55 minute men, Keith Reed and Ray Hughes, but the latter might have made second spot if he had chosen variable gears instead of an 84 inch fixed. Since well before their club's best known member, Tony Doyle, amazed the time trial world with a 56-30 in a medium gear 25 fifteen years ago,

Clarence Wheelers have been noted for their fast revving riders, and Hughes did admit afterwards that he had contemplated fitting a 72 inch gear on this occasion.

All twelve seeded entrants plus another seven, including the fastest junior, Steve Woodbridge (Brighton Excelsior) beat the hour and another six pairs on tandems also "went under." National record holders, Glenn Longland and Neville Stroud (Antelope RT. Radford Accountants) won this supporting event, gaining, like accounted in the solo race, over a minute on their nearest rivals, Andy Smith and Richard Holkham (Brighton Excelsior)

The other twelve in this category, including two blind "stokers, all completed the course, but on a morning better than most in recent weeks there was a surprising number-20- who did not make it to the finish.

Chris Myhill's Big margin in Oldham Mountain Trial

Chris Myhill (Chesterfield Couriers-Alexa) was in a class of his own as he trounced the opposition by virtually three minutes in the Oldham Century mountain time trial.

The cross pennine journey was well worth while for Myhill, as this victory was his first open win of the 1993 season.

The course takes in the long climbs of Saddleworth Moor and Wessenden-for all but one mile of the course the competitor is either ascending or descending, and as such is perfectly suited to Myhill's climbing ability.

"I've never known a course like it" Myhill enthused at the finish, "It really is a mountain time trial". However, he did profess to being relieved at the finish. Just before the start it was muted by local club folk that Myhill's bottom gear of 42x19 would see him struggling up Wessenden Head, but it turned out to be no problem.

"I was a bit concerned when I heard that Stu Green was on 42 x21, he said "But the 19 was spot on, in fact I spent sometime in the 18. Mind you, had the wind been any stronger I would have been in trouble, I'll bring lower gears next year just in case!"

Myhill's time was still two minutes short of Nigel Bishops record of 52.42, but as he was riding the course 'blind' Myhill will no doubt go quicker if he comes back.

Best of the rest was evergreen John Watchman (ABC Centreville) who won the veterans prize by a mile and claimed the scalp of local hope

Stu Green (Oldham Century RC) into the bargain. Green is a self professed "complete non-time triallist" who enjoys having a go whenever the course goes up. As top ten finisher in the National Hillclimb championships, he enjoyed the climbs, but he lost significant time on Myhill going over the rolling plateaus.

ABC Centreville packed three riders into the top seven to convincingly win the team prize from the promoting club. But the Oldham club must not be disappointed as the event was a credit to them and a model promotion. Marshalls at all junctions and danger points, on what is a difficult course, ensured the safety of all riders. "I'd love to come back", was Myhill's passing shot, "I have to pick the trophy up at their club dinner, my social season is shaping up already!"

One of the qualities that make Glenn Longland (Antelope RT) such a great rider, is that he knows how to suffer, and he had the look of a man who was doing that in the Poole Wheelers three up evening team time trial.

Team mate triple junior champion Chris Ball never appeared to be off the front, the changing was between Neville Stroud and Glenn behind him.

"We let Chris go to the front, when we saw the camera" they said afterwards. Chris insisting that Neville had been helping him a lot to keep up the speed, and he needed the help because he was suffering from a cold.

Captain Glenn (never mind the pain) Longland, put them both in place. "We could have got under 50 minutes, if Neville had not had his chain off, and Chris had not taken a wrong turning on a traffic island."

Second placed Poole Wheelers were two minutes behind them. Putting their top riders Terry Icke and Paul Hanwell into different teams they missed a rare opportunity to challenge the mighty Antelope.

While most teams were showing a bit of daylight between wheels, the three that really stuck together were the ladies, Monique Gibson, Melissa Kitcher and Joanne McRae.

Pyne's good win in Windy Breckland 50

A strong chill easterly wind slowed the times in the CC Breckland 50 mile time trial on the revised B50/11, the 25 miles to the turn into a rapidly rising wind was rewarded with a super fast return to the finish at Swaffham.

As expected Martin Pyne, Polytechnic CC., produced the fastest ride of the day a 1.53.25 but not too far behind was Richard Boundy, CC Breckland, who did a fine 1.55.37. Richard is currently riding a road bike while his new time trial bike is being constructed, look out East Anglia when this £2000 piece of machinery hits the roads.

Allied Williams, Cambridge University, had a close battle with veteran Shay Giles, Leo RC., the former taking third place with 1.56.30 to Shay's 1.56.32.

In a hotly contested handicap section Brian Boxall, VC Baracchi, won with 1.35.50. after improving by 6m.37s. to 2.10.12. Becky Durant, East Anglian CC., took the ladies award with 2.22.38 while Shay Giles added another best on standard to his tally with a plus of 28.56.

The expected team battle failed to materialise after two members of the RT East broke down on the journey into deepest Norfolk leaving Kings Lynn ynn CC., to conquer over CC Breckland with a team time 6.13.01.

BAR TALK

Georgina Pechard, women's (junior)BAR and women's (juvenile) 10 champion.

The ladies national 25 mile championship on June 13 is not too far down the line: once it was a long way off, but now it has crept closer. A good portion of my training is now focussed on it and I've two open 25 mile time trial events to compete in beforehand to further my preparation in the run-up period.

I'm not looking to achieve a particular time in the national championship. I'd settle for a place in the top 15 that would be most pleasing. The winner? My money is on Marie Purvis.

For me, preparation involves a lot of level 2 training over 90 minute periods. The two events designed to help put me on the right lines by June 13 are both on the E72/25 course, the dates being May 30 and June 7th.

I'm getting to know quite a few of the top girls in road racing, like Julie Reynolds of Easterly, with having entered so many races this year.

My coach has given me tips, saying at the start that road racing would add new skills. It has, the three main ones change of pace, bike handling and cornering.

With time trials you're flat out all the time, whereas in road races there are these extra hard spells. I'm not comfortable doing them, that's for sure, but they are now somewhat less daunting. Notice the word 'somewhat'!

Riding close up in a group does wonders for your bike handling. When there are people riding very close to you, and others squeezing through the narrowest of gaps, you've not got to waver. I used to stop pedalling when I got to corners, but in a bunch you've got to go with the flow.

I've done 10 road races this season. In 1992, as a juvenile, they were shorter events, 25 miles maximum. Now I'm having to find my way in senior events

and they go on for 50 miles, twice as long.

One basic difference is food/drink. I used to carry nothing for the shorter events, whereas now there's a bottle of Maxim on the bike. I mix it at the normal rates and start drinking half-an-hour after the start, it's just a case of finding a quite moment.

This coming weekend sees me in Leicester for a BCF track training day. It's for both male and female riders, all cats. There's a mix of coaching and lectures, with Tony York in charge. You have to pay.

Jackie Harris my coach, is coming too. She will also be at Heme Hill when I go training there. Coaching must really eat into her time? It varies. Basically we discuss things over the phone twice a week, and then there's these special events-sometimes they come in a rush, other times are less demanding.

The best part of last weekend was not the cycling but a barbecue in the back garden. It was a family do for the four of us, that's Mum, Dad, Lara and myself.

You're heard about my Dad (the chef) and plenty about me, but not the others. So here goes. Lara and I are twins. She's not into cycling at all, but does badminton. Mum works in the city (London) for some solicitors-she has a 45 minutes train journey from Billericay station every morning.

We had chicken, if you must know, and it was beautiful. Not burnt at all. Then Mum tidied round the house, Dad cut the lawn and I tried to do some German homework-coursework for my 'A' levels. We don't watch cricket (or football) on the tele here, so it was hard to find an excuse to break off. Hey, when's the Tour de France?

tandem, now on order. Its first showing should be at York Rally on 19th June. Mick has to sell a bike first to go towards the cost, but Arthur Caygill at Richmond has done us a good deal. Mick has always gone on and on about getting a tandem since we borrowed my Dad's last year when we did a 20 minute '10' at our first 'open'.

Due to increased work load my training has been a bit intermittent and I've just been ticking over, but I was pleased to win our club event last Wednesday with Rob Taylor. We ran a 2-up '10' where entrants' names are drawn out of a hat in pairs-so no-one knew who they would be riding with. It was the best night we had on Brompton all season, but everyone enjoyed doing something a bit different and fun. Rob and I did 23.14, narrowly beating our club's Stephen Holmes, a new local rider, with Goole Vermuyden's Karl Williamson with 23.19. Mick paced another novice around, Chris Patrick to 24.23 for third. There were a few slower riders going home with beams on their faces from ear-to-ear as they had never before gone as fast.

Yesterday we rode the Selby CC '10' on the A19 near York. It was a nice warm, sunny day with a headwind start. The turn times provided made interesting reading, but in our case only served to depress us as we had lost so much on others coming back with a tail wind to finish! I did 24.11 to win first fastest lady, which was OK I suppose, considering I hadn't managed any training for the two days before. I did make sure I had a good warm-up though.

It seems strange not to have entered the National Championship '25'. It is just too far to travel and I am not going well enough yet.

Next week's Bank Holiday doesn't offer a lot in racing for us really, so I'm going over to Mum and Dad's on the Wirral and riding a '10' on the L101 Garstang (Brock). It should bring back memories as this was a course I often rode when I first started racing.

Stuart Dangerfield

This weekend I rode the Barnet CC '10' on the F1, again with a view on doing another 'Superfast' ride! I recorded a time of 19.12, my fourth '19' this season, course and event record and only four seconds off my PB of 19.08, it gave me an average speed of 31 mph, and it was the 8th fastest ever '10' on record.

It was a good afternoon, warm with a slight cross breeze, but the course wasn't quite good enough for the comp-record, although I was pleased to be so near to an

'18'. Martin Pyne had the course record previously with 19.41. when he got the competition record in 1981

I used my top gear 53 x 12 all the way round right from the start and truthfully I'd have been better off using fixed wheel. Before the start I was getting a bit nervous because stacks of riders were coming in with PB's doing short 20's and I realised that I beat most of these riders normally by 1.30-2 minutes, so I knew what I had to do, which is a horrible feeling, because I know how much it hurts to do a short '19', and it did hurt, terribly!

MUSEUM

Having just returned from a holiday in Cornwall I would like to inform readers of The Museum of Historic Cycling, located at the old station at Camelford which is Britain's largest private collection of historic cycles, and is owned by John and Sue Middleton who moved from Lincoln when ten years of collecting had filled their garden sheds with bikes dating back to 1818 and cycling memorabilia.

The display is dominated by around 150 cycles and every possible cycling relic through the ages, from brass pumps, lamps, a collection of over 800 club badges and medals, advertising posters and postcards on a cycling theme. There is not a Lotus Superbike but there is a feature on it (proving that not everything here is old) and there are all types of machines including uni-cycles, tricycles, and quadracycles. There is a bicycle with a bamboo frame, another with full size lorry tyres, folding paratroopers bikes from the second world war, and an example of America's back to front penny farthing, with the small wheel at the front (seems like Moser did not invent the low profile after all).

Some machines are the only examples of their kind in the world, a few are so rare that they cannot be valued the ladies toilet at the Victorian Station, which was built in 1893, has been turned into a lifelike replica of a Victorian bicycle workshop. Unfortunately the museum only attracted 3000 visitors last year (at per head) which is nowhere near enough to pay the running costs. I spent a very enjoyable two hours browsing round and even a non cycling wife found it interesting. I'm sure that many readers would also find it very interesting whether racing man or tourist, and with many cyclists visiting the area shortly for the National 25 Championship it would be an ideal time to pay the museum a visit.

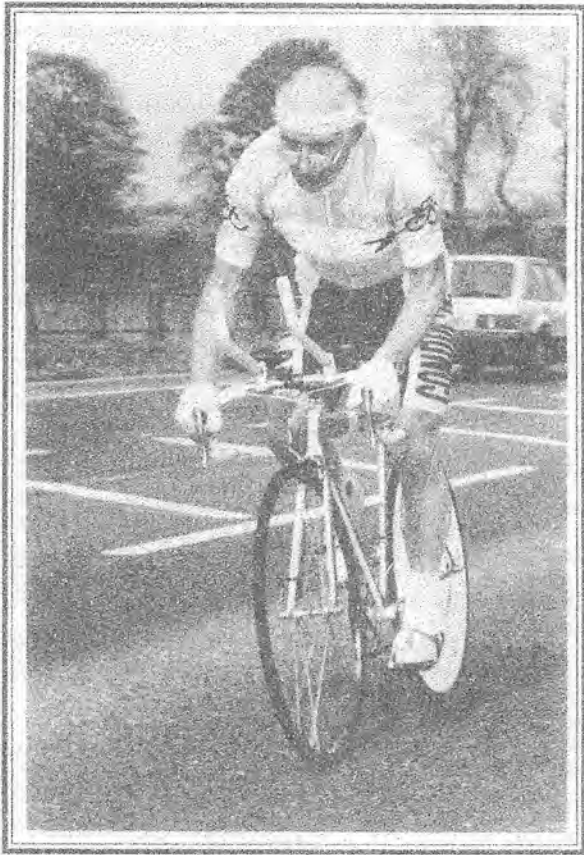

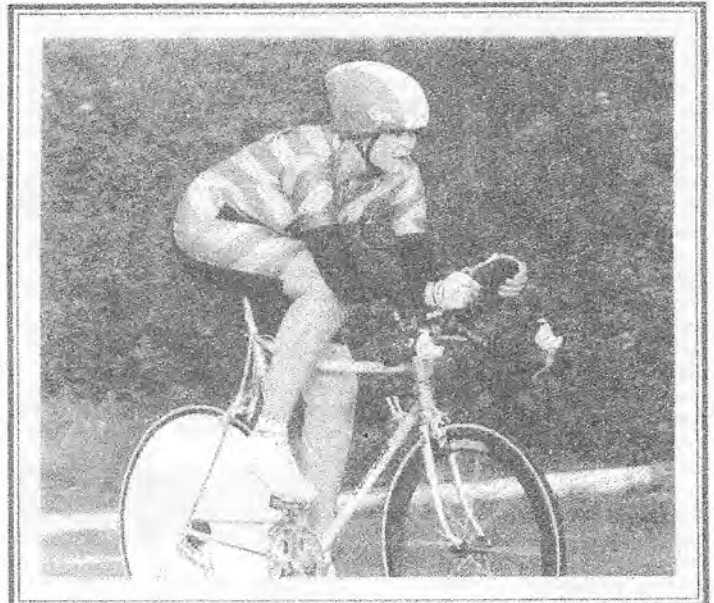

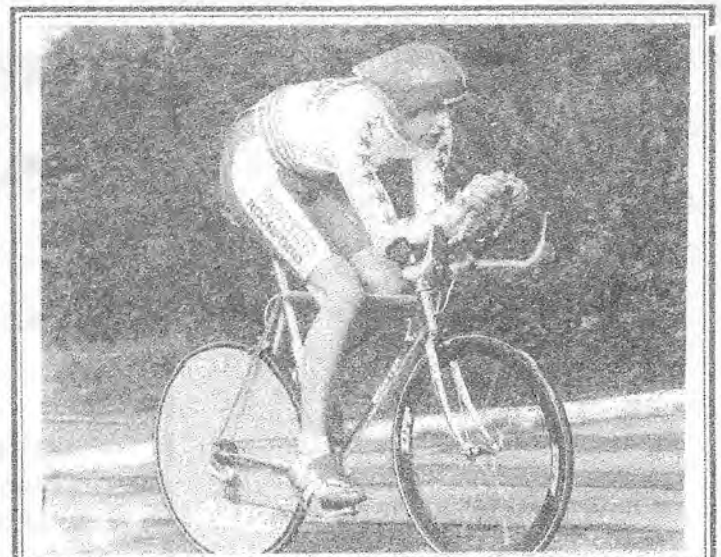

A Cycling Double First!!

On June 6th 1993 Choughs Racing Club-The Inn for All Seasons will be running the first cycling National Championship ever organised in Cornwall. Of the 13 pairs for the tandem event G.Bateman & P.Harvey (CC Breckland) are fastest and should like the course as will R.Runham & C.Marshall (Norwood Paragon) of the mixed pairs Carol Gandy & G.Hodgeson (San Fairy Ann CC) should prove fastest. In the solo race Graham Crabb (Victoria CC) is the fastest entry but will have his work cut out to stay in front of the competition which includes M.Williams (Whitewebbs CC), V.Stark (Southend & County Whs), T.Bright (VC Braintree) and fast improving R.Prior (Southgate CC)

The VTTA Championship on E82/50 has also attracted a fine entry only one notable seems to be missing....Harry Featherstone! R.Shipton (Worthing Exc CC) is on scratch and will be pressed by V.Stark (Southend & County Whs), J.Morley (Cambridge CC) P.Bennett (Verulam CC). The age standard contenders include Vic Stark and John Morley plus J.Bailey (Nelson Whs) P.Hargreaves (North Lincs Clarion) and R.Back (West Suffolk Whs)

Week three on Dronfield saw mixed fortunes with three riders suffering punctures and speedy junior Nick Wales a non starter with a cold, in his absence Richard Bower on 24.27 took the honours from Nigel Wilson only six seconds in arrears. Third place went to Richard Hardy, after about 2 miles he saw his minute man, visitor Andy Payne about 200 yards in front but saw the gap increase to an eventual two second deficit. Father and son Phil and Brian Clayton set new figures for a tandem on this course with 24.37.

The visitors again provided the fastest time with Craig Hudson on 24.23 and another two broke the 25 minute barrier from 13 visitors to these popular events. After 7 events, Nick Wales and Richard Bower lead the way in the time trial league and Nick is also prominent in the handicap series but with eighteen more events to be ridden there is a long way to go.

It has been encouraging to see a good number of young ladies starting to compete, perhaps this signals an increase in interest from school aged riders.

Next week, ie; 1st June the Phoenix 10 moves for one week to the Tuxford, Notts course with a 7.30 start, all are welcome to ride.

The BCF have a different approach to time trials. They have not worked out a system of plusses for juniors, but instead they just show how far you are both behind the winner. An idea that might jolt riders that are fixed on superfast dual carriageway courses.

Because the 4.7 mile (approximately) time trial near Ringwood, Hampshire was in the middle of a junior stage race, the result sheet in finishing order was out within half an hour of the last rider.

Juniors are on restricted gears and had their bikes checked just before they started. Being a stage race they started in reverse order of finishing the 55 mile race in the morning.

Without an individual start sheet names were shouted out about two minutes before the start time. It is of course laid down in tablets of stone that riders cannot sign on before a bike check. But it is difficult to see the point in pulling a youngster off their bikes with 20 seconds to go to sign on in an event of national stature.

It could be part of the training to get used to being messed around racing against those foreigners abroad. Any worked up 17 year old that can cope with that sort of trauma and do a good ride must be made of th right stuff.

On the other hand he might just have joined the 220 mountain bikers racing just a mile away in Matchams Park at the same time and enjoyed riding his bike. The junior race with about the same number of mostly local riders as this national event.

Comments on a post card please as how we will deal with the influx of interest from the Tour de France bringing the South of England to complete stop next year.

The overall winner of the two day three stage event was Alastair Masson who finished 13 in the time trial. He started a break on the last 61 mile hilly stage with fifteen miles to go, finishing third to win the race by 30 seconds. Isn't there a top Belgian rider called Masson?
