**Wilkinson's Fourth successive Anfield 100. and a 10 minute win margin.**

Andy Wilkinson of Port Sunlight Wheelers wrote another page in the history of British cycle racing when he became the first man over 100 years to win the classic Anfield 100 four times in succession. His time of 3.59.04 was done in the face of strong and blustery winds round the course based mostly on Shropshire. Conditions were mainly responsible for 25 none starters from the full field of 120 and more than a dozen DNF.

Most notable absentee, with no excuses received by organiser Ben Griffiths other than a sad apology from one of his Antelope clubmates, was Glenn Longland, who might the natural challenger to Andy Wilkinson.

As it turned out, it was Dave Cuming, the Macclesfield bike shop owner, who came second in a P.B. 4.09.13. Alf Hinton, Leigh Premier RC, was third in 4.12.25. At 25 miles it was Wilko in the lead with 56.37 to Cuming's 57.54. By the 50 miles point the Port Sunlight man still led in 1.55.47, with a new challenger in Rob Eperjesi of Elizabethan CC next on 1.57.51 and Dave Cuming 1.58.40.

At the 75 miles point the only one inside three hours was Wilko with 2.58.19. Eperjesi was still second in 3.03.58 and Cuming third on 3.04.42. Eperjesi dropped right down to sixth in the final ratings as Wilkinson pressed on to finish as the only one inside 4 hours. Dave Cuming deserved to pick up the first handicap award for his second place PB ride. The brave effort by PJ Dentith of Stockport Clarion in his first 100 gave him the novice award for 12th place.

Mid Shropshire Wheelers took the team prize, despite the retirement of their star man Phil Guy. Messers Silvester, Millington and Cornish provided the trio to beat Barlow, Bland and Ivell of Kiveton Park CC.

Christine Roberts was best lady for Crewe Clarion, her 4.25.53 compared well with many of the males. She said "I am happy with that ride in these conditions. I felt as strong as a horse today." Fastest veteran was Richard Johnson of North Shropshire Wheelers in 4.17.43. and best vet on standard was national BAR Don Hacking, Birkenhead NECC, whose actual 4.29.41 gave him a big plus of 74min 10s.

Andy Wilkinson rode his new Dave Lloyd Rotator 26" wheeled mount and apart from breaking a spoke head with 20 miles to go (he had only twelve spokes in the front wheel and finished on eleven!) he gave an enthusiastic report on the machine which was really with next week-end's National 25 in mind. Andy said

"I like the bike better each time I ride it and we have one or two small adjustments to make yet, but in the main its super."

Full marks to the Anfield Bicycle club, formed March 1879. Their event lost some interest not long ago, but it has regained the prestige through the super rides of recent winners and to attract a full field of 120 entrants must mean they are doing it right. Ben Griffiths and his willing team did a great job.

**DIDN'T THEY DO WELL?**  
What fantastic rides were produced by Chris Boardman and Graeme Obree at the week-end!

These two amazing champions have increased speculation as to their confrontation in the opening event of the 1993 Isle of Man International Cycling Week from June 20 to June 27.

Chris Boardman, the Olympic pursuit champion, shattered his own National 25 miles competition record of 47.19. (1992) by doing an unbelievable 45mins. 57 secs. in the Oxford University CC. event on the fast course near Oxford.

He rode a gear of 108" fixed! Graeme Obree rose to the occasion at the revival of the famous Herne Hill track in London by smashing his own British one hour track record, adding another three kilometres with a distance of 49.383kms. to get within striking distance of the WORLD record!

These two will meet in the International Mountain Time Trial on SUNDAY, JUNE 20 in a full field packed with home and

international stars but it is felt the battle will be a head to head between the Merseyside Marvel and the Scottish Superstar who won last year in the absence of Boardman. Add to this the latest news of the Isle of Man's own MARIE PURVIS who has just won international Tour of Majorca

It was mixed emotions for Lee Paxton (Salisbury RC) after winning the Crabwood Saturday afternoon 10 mile TT at Thruxton.

Delighted because he had beaten his personal best by 20 seconds, but feeling he could have gone faster, if he had not been held back by damp conditions.

Second placed Pete Whitbread (Vectis Roads CC) had no doubts, bubbling over after finishing in front of olympian Gary Dighton.

He had won the Beaulieu Heath road race the previous Thursday evening by going away on his own at three laps to go. Not so sure that he will get away with it next week, he says 'he will try it at two laps this time.'

Gary Dighton (Leo RC) having an easy year for him, was a delighted with fiancée Zena Harris's win as if he had won him self.

The other two Crabwood girls Pauline Strong, and Dawn Courage at 24.07 and 24.40 were thinking what might have been if they had done 23s as well, and taken competition record. They mean business this year.

Organiser Dave Blenkinsop had problems accommodating entries of 178 and all the competitors for the Wessex Veteran's championship, with the result that there were some vets who did not get a ride.

He promised to solve the problem next year.

Glenn Longland takes some beating in a bike race, but Lee Paxton (Salisbury RC) appeared to be "on song" to win the Crabwood CC Golden Anniversary 50 mile time trial at Ringwood. Just 15 seconds, in front of a super streamlined Glenn.

"Not fully on form, just yet" explained Lee, he wants to have a bit in hand for later in the year.

He had done a personal best the day before for 10 miles, and as hoping to repeat that if the wind dropped the next day for the Poole Wheelers 10.

Glenn had been hoping for a better ride, as a warm up for the Anfield 100 the next day. Not yet sure about making another attack on the 24 hour record this year, a little bit of irritation with a second place might be just the spur he needs.

Third place Terry Icke (Poole Wheelers) with two sixth places in the BAR under his belt, thought that his 1-59 under the windy conditions should be rated as a personal best. Certainly the three were a long way out in front of the rest of the field.

Terry not too sure if he had done too much training during the week getting in 300 miles.

One man who might have given a challenge Julian Jenkinson (Southampton Tri Club) was missing, away on international duty in a duathlon. A better runner than a bike rider.

The runners were still represented

with iron man triathlete Eamon Deane coming at fifth place, just to show how it is done, but not too sure whether his ride was good enough on the day.

Winner Lee Paxton felt he is getting his act together in his third season. The first year he built up his speed, last year he was "a bit lazy" and relied on his strength. This year he is using his strength and speed.

With only 58 entries, organiser Rob Catling delayed the start by half an hour to 6.00am and was wondering why he had not attracted the interest on what is normally a speedy course.

A heavy wind explained why there were 15 non-starters, and six non finishers.

The Poole Wheelers open 10 mile time trial on Bank Holiday Monday was Lee Paxton's third win in three days, beating Pete Pickers (Antelope RT) by two seconds.

"That's enough to pay for my new hat" he said afterwards. "It is nice to get a bit of speed going." The 50 the day before had not bothered him, he felt if it been off a 100 he would have been able to keep going to the finish.

This is his fourth win already this year, after only three last year. "I am off for a relaxing afternoon" he said.

The entry of 81 was disappointing for the first open event, on Poole Wheelers' superfast ski slope ten course, and those that knew about it and entered, found they were up against a strong West wind, that cost them irrecoverable time on the way out.

Pete Pickers was happy enough with his second place. "Just right for the championship next week" he said. Not that he was being ambitious, he had heard about Boardman's time over the weekend.

He had been in trouble on the way back, stuck in the 14 sprocket, and not being able to use the 12. One of the few that had not raced the day before, but had done 60 miles training as hard as a race.

Third placed Andrew Mummery (VC St Raphael) fresh from his success at the Herne Hill meeting over the weekend, did not hang around afterwards, while Gary Dighton (Leo RC) took a relaxed attitude to his fourth place, in what is a fun year for him, happy enough with fiancée Zena Harris winning the ladies prize. "She has not been beaten this year" he said.

## Bejaoss Premier & Supersonic 25 mile TT Monday 31st May N7/25

With 145 riders spread over three events this was the largest field ever assembled on the N7. The first event was the tandems and four crews went under the hour in dry, sunny but very windy conditions. Favourites Les Pick and Jerry Cross had problems with the chain and spent time with the rear wheel out which dropped them to third. The event was won by M.Jerham and M.Redwood from Long Eaton Paragon in 56.55, with S.Plester and M.Epton, from Mapperley CC second in 57.40, on such a tough day only Jason Peppiatt and Ian Marshall could join them under the hour with 59.22.

The second event for juniors, juveniles and ladies was won by junior A.Lucas, Rockingham Forest, eight minutes outside his best time with 1.07.58.

A.Scarsbrook made a long but worthwhile journey from Evesham to be fastest lady in 1.11.26. The juvenile prize was taken by D.Thorley from the local club Kettering Amateur after Andy Evans punctured, its worth noting that his 1.15.21 was a 3m.57s. improvement, the only one from all 145 riders. In the scratch event most seeded riders were eight to eleven minutes off their PB's and although the event had 50 under the hour rides only two managed this on the day.

The early leaders were Paul Carpenter and Graham Fisher with short 2's and they stayed there for an hour until Ian Butcher arrived in 1.01.01. He was challenged all the way by comeback man P.Jones only 37 secs. adrift after 25 miles. Dominic Sweeney it was hoped would be challenged by Phil Silver and Les Pick but these hopes faded out when Phil failed to start, and Les had his speed blunted by the tandem event at the start of the morning.

Dominic was 43 seconds up at the 10.5 mile mark and increased this to 1m.50s. by the finish, these were the only under the hour rides with Dominic dominating in 56.15 and 'Leggs' lagging in with 58.05. Aled Williams just missed going under in 1.00.16 but shared some of the £125 in prize money and £230 in Bejaoss sweatshirts.

The team award went to Icknield RC. 'Leggs' Pick backed up by Paul Tomlinson and Steve Racher.(1.07.20)

Then came Hemel Hempstead CC's fast improving Jon Hunt, with 56.18 to take the junior prize. Of the 13 women entrants, Rockingham Forest's Maria Lawrence was fastest, her excellent 59.47 beating many of the men who had much faster qualifying rides.

After producing a '49' in the Oxford University event the previous evening he got up just 13 hours later on Sunday morning and produced a stirring 53.49 in appalling wind conditions on the H25/2 course. Second place went to Keith Reed (Clarence Wheelers) in 55.09. Such is the strength of Adkins that he took most of his winning margin of 1.11 on the hard outward leg into the teeth of the wind as he reached the 13 mile check point in 30.44 against Reed's 31.37. Third spot went to Barry Charlie of the Stourbridge CC in a time of 55.43 which was only 43 seconds from his personal best, a performance which suggests the potential for a much faster ride on a better day and a faster course. Adkins was in no doubt helped in his task by the £50 pounds first prize from the total prize list of £340 which was made possible through the sponsorship of the event by local legal firm Winter-Taylor Solicitors of High Wycombe.

# BAR TALK

## Hannah Bean.

This Sunday I competed in the National Triathlon at Swindon. It was held over the Olympic distance which comprises 1500m open swim, 40k bike ride and 10k run, South of Swindon. I went round the cycling course couple of days before and had to walk up Snap Hill, but managed to ride up it on the day.

On the swim large orange buoys were situated every 100m, so that no one got lost, or took a short cut. The bike course was over one lap to alleviate the drafting problem which has occurred at a number of triathlons. The decents were fast and technical with speeds in excess of 50 mph by the elite males. Luckily the course was dry otherwise more accidents would have occurred. The organisers recommended a 21 sprocket, but a number of people still found themselves over geared and had to walk up Snap Hill, which as a 17% gradient. The bike course could easily have been classified as a mountain time trial if it had been run by the RTTC.

The run was three two mile laps of the lake. My wave included all the junior girls and age group women, 100 in all. After the swim I was three minutes behind the leader and only went into the lead half way into the bike course. Then a police motor bike escorted me back to the transition area.

On the run I was putting time into the second junior girl until five miles into the run, when I came to a gradual halt, now not remembering anything. Unknown to me I hadn't been taking enough liquid and so became dehydrated. I eventually went on to finish in 2hrs.50mins. over 20 minutes slower than my estimated time, if I had continued at the same pace.

This means I still have to qualify for the European Championships in four weeks time at Market Bosworth. My sponsors Terrapins of Leicester immediately gave me Bike Stream, 'Hands Free Drinking' so I hope dehydration does not happen again.

While concentrating on triathlons this year I am still doing the odd time trial. My next is on the R10/17 down in Abergavenny, and the week after is the National '25'

# RTTC

For as long as I have been involved in RTTC administration at District and National level the debate concerning use of u-turns on time trial courses has raged on. Regular delegates to the National Council meetings over the last six years are now accustomed to the annual passionate exchange between Districts. At one stage it appeared inevitable that the anti u-turn lobby would eventually win the day, however in recent years the vote has steadily slipped the other way. The principle reason I believe for this change in heart is the diminishing number of suitable dual carriageway roads available for time trialling on. Delegates are frightened that they may legislate themselves into a corner.

For those who are not aware as to the reasons for this debate, allow me to explain. In 1976 a junior competing in a club event was injured when in collision with a motor vehicle. Action was brought against both the club and event secretary alleging "Negligence in allowing the event, which included a u-turn". Two years later a steersman on a tandem was killed in similar circumstances resulting in a similar case being brought against the promoting club, and in another case the pillion rider on a motor cycle was killed, also at a u-turn accident.

In all three of the above cases our solicitors and lawyers made a successful defence but, for the individuals named in the proceedings, at club, district and national level, the stress was immense and detrimental to their health. Cycling clubs and the Road Time Trials Council are not incorporated bodies therefore any claims or actions taken have to be against named individuals.

There appears to be two main points that need clarifying. Firstly, what is the RTTC position concerning u-turns?

National Council passed a resolution that no course should be used containing a u-turn where there is a reasonable alternative available. No new courses may be designed that contain a u-turn. Secondly, if there are no suitable roundabouts available what are the alternatives?

In a word, Circuits! Unfortunately there seems to be a wide spread misunderstanding of Regulation 35. This regulation states that "No length of road may be used more than twice". No where in the regulation does it say in which direction the riders have to be travelling, therefore the use of a two lap circuit is permitted without recourse to the National Committee for a special dispensation.

In my own District we have used circuit courses for a number of seasons without incident. We have experienced very few problems with riders "pacing" each other-only two reportings in the last four seasons, and no complaints at all from timekeepers at the finish.

At the end of last year I was asked by the National Committee to do a detailed survey in order to establish how many courses with u-turns were actually in use. In many ways the findings were quite encouraging with just under half the Districts successfully eliminating all u-turns. The results of the survey were published at the 1992 National Council Meeting, but without names attached.

The copies held by the National Committee however did contain the names of "offending districts" and a National Committee man was some what perturbed to find his District lying second in the league of "sinners". He got together with his District Chairman to see what could be achieved to improve the situation. Today this District has tipped the scales the other way joining the ten districts in the country without any u-turns at all. Imagination, flexibility and ingenuity are the key factors. Do not be swayed by the fact that a particular course with a u-turn is safe, simply because it's fast. Circuit courses can be fast also, as Gethin Butler demonstrated in the two and half laps of the Altricham Ravens medium gear 25 when he recorded a 56! This course was an emergency measure due to road works and would never have been considered in normal circumstances. It just goes to demonstrate what is really available when the chips are down.

Riders dislike change and cling to the courses they have grown up with, but left with the possibility of no ride at all, they soon revert to coping with what's available. The removal of a fast course in a district will certainly see a drop in the number of rides in the short term but trend is short lived as riders get used to new courses.

A number of Districts have removed all u-turns in open events, but still persist in using them in club events. Two of the three previously mentioned accidents occurred in club events. I can see no real reason why clubs cannot be encouraged to run non-standard distance events. Shorter distance events attract new members which is surely a good thing. A number of years ago my club had to shorten its evening ten course by nearly a mile due to road works. That season saw bigger fields each

week than in any other season since. All the riders knew that the course was short, but had little difficulty in forgetting the fact when recording a short 22 minute ride!

U-turns are an unnatural manoeuvre and other road users can not be expected to anticipate riders making such a turn. The problem will not be solved over night but it is clearly time to move away from tradition and convenience if we are to survive into the 21st Century.

## East Bradford CC

Our club is one of a number who have been invited by the RTTC to take part in an experiment to assess the feasibility of permitting reserves in time trials. At present very few people will be aware of this proposal, and we hope that this letter will stimulate the wider debate which this Club feels the subject warrants. First and foremost we wish to emphasise that we are in full support of the principal of having reserves in time trials and the RTTC is to be applauded for taking up this long overdue initiative.

However, despite the above, and after a lengthy discussion at our recent monthly club meeting we reluctantly decided not to take part in the experiment, on the grounds that the RTTC's suggested method of implementation of a reserve system is far too complicated and would place far too much pressure on the event organiser and his helpers, particularly on the day of the event.

To describe the RTTC's proposed procedure in this letter is difficult, bearing in mind limited space. However, the system involves the organiser, in the event of a full field, nominating

ten riders as reserves. Each reserve would be allocated a ten minute slot during which time he would be allowed to start in the event of a DNS. If a reserve does not get a start within his ten minute slot he then moves onto the second allocation, but if there are no non starters in that allocation then that reserve would not get a ride. A number steward would have the responsibility of giving the number of a rider who has not collected that number at least fifteen minutes prior to his start time to the nominated reserve. For this purpose the number steward would need a watch with timekeepers time. A rider collecting his number less than fifteen minutes prior to his start time would be deemed to be a late starter and would have to take his chance of a ride along with the reserves. It is not clear as to which number such a rider would use or as to whether he would take precedence over a reserve.

Regarding a reserves entry fee we understand that any such reserve not getting a ride would receive his entry back less the levy which covers the insurance aspect. Our Club sees no objection to this last point, but considers the complexity of the above procedure both unworkable and unnecessary.

Our own suggestion is we feel far simpler and more logical. Ten, twenty or even thirty reserves could easily be nominated, provided that they are given their own individual numbers. These could be either R1 R2 etc. or 121 122 etc., and could be picked up from the appropriate point at any time. In the event of a DNS the start officials could simply call up the next available reserve, just as they might call up a late starter under the existing regulations. If a reserve who would otherwise have had his entry returned is prepared to wait in the vicinity of the start for any length of time, why should he be denied a ride in the event of a DNS? What could be easier? The only extra burden placed on an organiser is the task of listing the reserves on the start sheet and result board and returning any entry fees with their result sheets.

By contrast the RTTC's complicated suggestion almost makes our Club believe that they wish to prove that a reserve system is unworkable.

We trust that you will find space in your columns for this letter in order that clubs throughout the Country may have the opportunity to think carefully about the best but simplest possible system prior to their District Council AGMs at the end of the season.

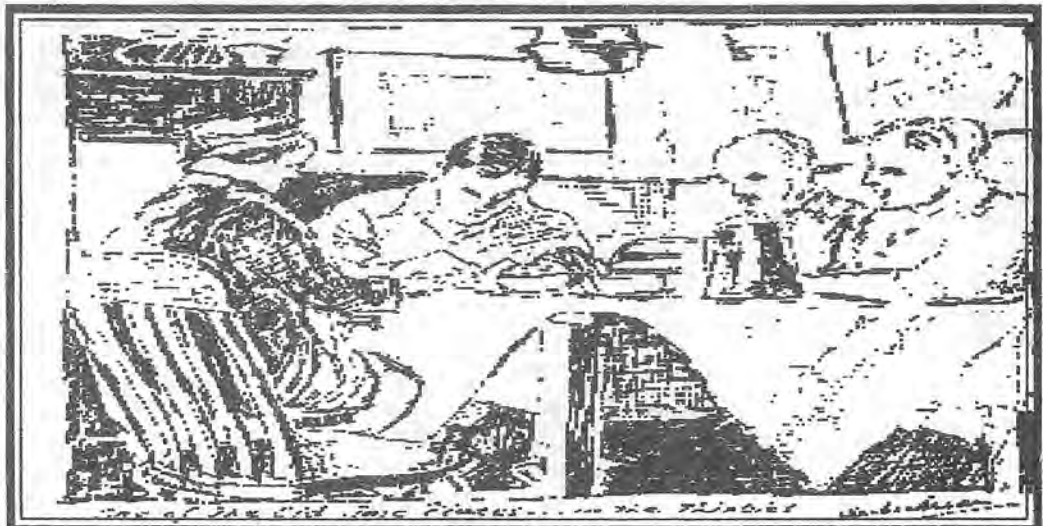

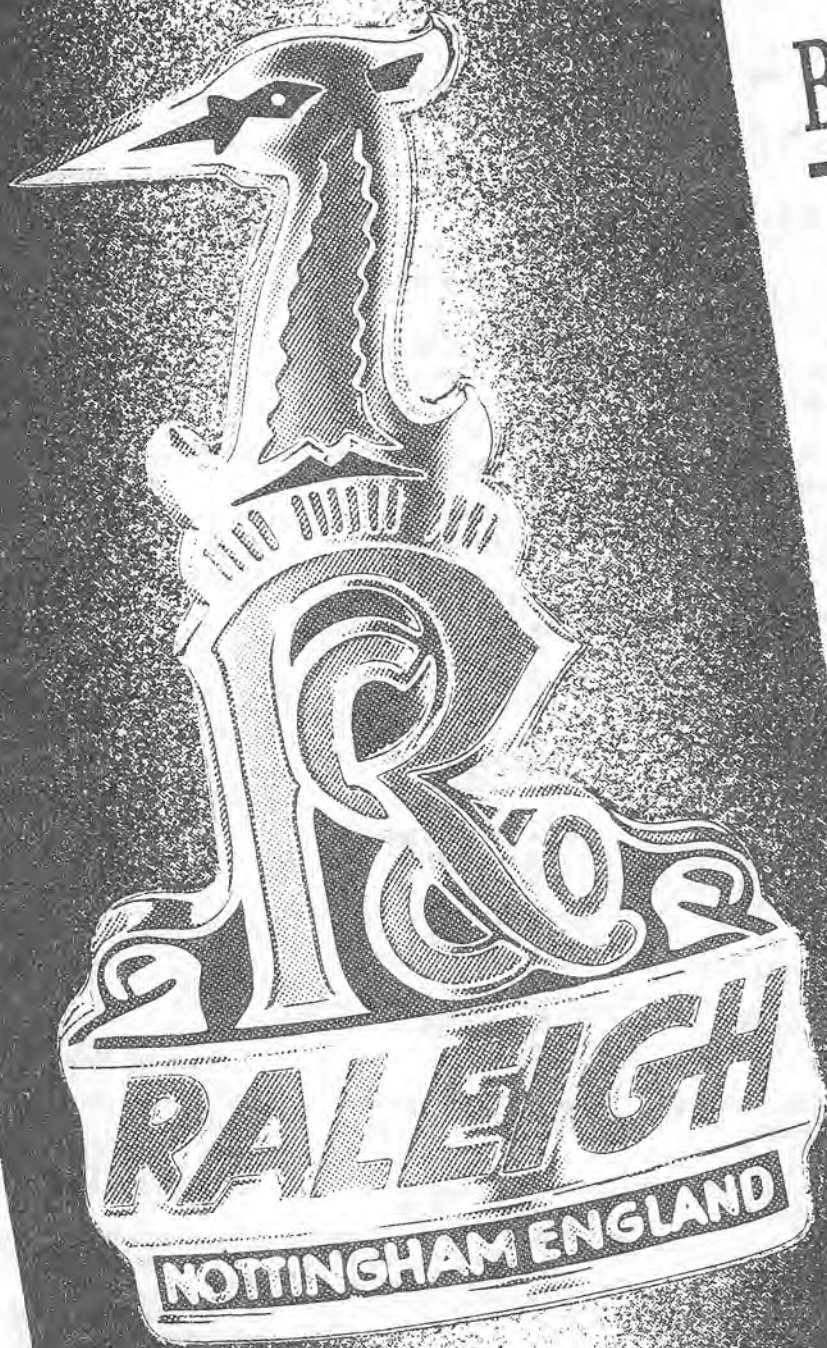
